### Special Show Notes (please read):

- Parking passes and entry tickets will be made available in the show office once you arrive. All early arrivals must be pre-arranged with the show manager and may not be before noon on Sunday, October 9<sup>th</sup>. If you plan to show in the draft horse show at the fair and will already be there, please indicate that on your entry form.
- The show will use GVHS rules to govern all classes, judges' decisions are final. Unsportsmanlike behavior will not be tolerated for any reason. *Barn calls are a courtesy from show management*, exhibitors should be on time for their classes. Any tack changes should be requested ahead of time to the show manager or paddock master. Entries will be taken up through show day and any adds must be made by the end of the previous session to compete. No entries will be accepted at the gate. A late fee of \$5/class will apply for all late entries postmarked after Monday, September 26<sup>th</sup>.
- The show office will be open one hour before each show day begins and 30 minutes after the show is complete each day. Check or PayPal is accepted for payment of fees with a 4% courtesy charge. Payment does not need to be sent with pre-entries if you plan to add classes at the show. An open check or CC number must be added to your file before receiving back numbers.
- Please provide a copy of your horse's registration papers with your entries and know that your horses show age is as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, NOT the horse's actual birthdate.

### AOTE (Amateur-Owned-Trained-Exhibited)

- These classes were put into place for people who take care of, condition, turn out, groom, and train their own horses. The horse exhibited by the AOTE must be trained, conditioned, groomed and shown ONLY by the AOTE or a non-professional family member in all divisions entered. Non-professional family members are defined as: spouse, mother, father, brother, sister, niece, nephew, son, daughter, grandchild, grandparent, legal ward, in-laws, step-children, step-parents, step-siblings. No one with a professional trainer in the household or on premises may compete in the AOTE division. The owner or lessee of record must be so recorded on the registration certificate of each year in which the AOTE horse is to be shown and the exhibitor must also hold an amateur status card with the appropriate registry.

### Placings & Points

This event is double-judged/single placing where all classes will be presented with one set of overall 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> place rosettes/prizes. Individual judges' placings will be submitted to the appropriate registries for end of year points along with posted online at [horseshowing.com](http://horseshowing.com). The call judge (1.5x points) will rotate every other class and the following points scheme will be used to determine final placings for one 'Congress Champion' at the show (all ties will be broken by the call judge).

**Facility:** Horses will be stabled in horse barn #2 which is adjacent to the climate-controlled Perdue Show Arena where the show will take place. Covered walkways are present from the barn to the show arena. The facility boasts 10x10' box stalls with concrete floors. Two bags of shavings will accompany each stall. Additional bags may be purchased from the facility shavings office for \$7/each when you arrive. Indoor wash racks are available with restrooms nearby that have showers and hot water. Preference in stall assignments will be first given to show sponsors, then followed by the order that entries were received.

**Camping:** To secure an RV spot, you must make your reservation online at <https://www.gnfa.com/p/rvreservations> as soon as possible as spots are limited. Fees and payment are collected through the GA National Fair. Additional camping opportunities, hotels and Airbnb's are available outside the showgrounds in the local area by completing a simple google search in Perry, GA.
