Note: Receiving will take place at the Miller-Murphy-Howard Building.

DELIVERY NOTE: If you have items that have later delivery dates, i.e., Hobbies, Wood Carving, Art, Textiles, etc., you may bring those items with your quilt entries.

1. **All exhibitors are required to read and abide by the Georgia National Fair General Rules And Regulations. PLEASE NOTE...IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RULES. If you have questions, you may certainly e-mail us at contests@gnfa.com. Please help us prevent entry disqualifications.**

2. There are many different Divisions in the Quilts Department. Divisions are based on skill level, allowing a broad spectrum of participation while providing a fair system for judging purposes.

The **Novice Division** is intended for those new to the art and at the very basic beginner level.

The **Intermediate Division** is the average skill level where most exhibitors will enter.

The **Open Division** is offered for the more advanced exhibitor whose projects demonstrate more complexity of design. The amateur exhibitor whose work is competitive at a higher than average level of his/her art and professionals will enter in this category.

3. The honor system is used with regard to the proper Division placement for exhibitors. In other words, it will be left to the exhibitor to determine under which Division he/she should exhibit. Once an exhibitor places consistently in the top awards he/she is encouraged to move up to the next skill level. An exhibitor who accumulates 12 blue ribbons or two Best of Show or Best in Category Awards within a department will be required to move up to the next skill level. Judges may move

items up in skill level if quality of the work merits. Management reserves the right to move work to a higher skill level if merited.

4. All items in this Department must be entered at the same Skill Level.

5. All quilts must have been handmade and completed by the exhibitor within the last five years.

6. Exhibitors *may enter maximum of 3 exhibits in each class as long as each is a different pattern.*

7. The name of any pattern used should be listed on the entry form or in the notes section of online entry.

8. Quilts must be in excellent condition. Incomplete, torn, or soiled quilts will not be accepted or displayed.

9. To qualify and be judged as a Quilt, each entry must consist of three layers, (top, batting and backing), and be hand or machine quilted or hand tied. Yo-Yo, Cathedral Window, and Shaggy Raggy coverlets and "Other Quilted Items" should be entered in the Sewing Department.

DELIVERY NOTE: If you are hand delivering to the Fairgrounds and have items that have later delivery dates, e.g., hobbies, wood carving, art, textiles, etc., you may bring those items with your entries on the earlier delivery date.

11. Premiums will be paid from judges' record sheets and not from ribbons attached to the exhibits. Premium checks totaling \$20 or more will be mailed within six weeks after the Fair is over.

- 1 Miniature - Must be miniature reproductions of established quilt patterns; all aspects of the quilts are reproduced in scale. Miniature quilts must be no larger than 24"x24" or 96" in perimeter.
- 2 Wall Hangings
- 3 Other Small Quilt Not Listed (baby quilts, small lap quilts)

***When registering quilts quilted by another online, please use the "Other Quilter (Name)" field to list the second quilter's name.**

MEDIUM QUILTS (less than 280" in perimeter and over 144" perimeter. Includes baby quilts, lap quilts and wall hangings)

The Divisions in the MEDIUM and LARGE quilt divisions all use the following classes:
Note - no pre-printed panels allowed, except in class 3 Embellished. To be entered in a class based on technique (ex.: pieced), the majority of the quilt must contain that technique.


Class

- 1 100% Cotton Quilts (*eligible for Cotton Women awards*) All elements of the quilt must be cotton - all fabric, thread, batting, etc.
- 2 Appliquéd
- 3 Embellished (Thread painting, beadwork, etc.)
- 4 Embroidered
- 5 First Time Quilt (first quilt completed by entrant regardless of technique – may only enter once in this class)
- 6 Hand Quilted
- 7 Mixed Techniques (any quilt consisting of more than one technique must be entered mixed techniques)
- 8 Pieced
- 9 Whole Cloth (composed of a solid piece of fabric on which the quilting creates the design.) No "cheater cloth" or pre-printed panels.

Quilting Awards

- Sewing Machine and Plaque awarded to Quilt Show Sweepstakes. **In the instance that the winner of the most blue ribbons in quilting has won a sewing machine within the past 10 years, he/she will be awarded the Sweepstakes plaque and \$25 (in lieu of sewing machine), and the winner of the most blue ribbons that has not won a sewing machine within the past 10 years will be awarded the sewing machine.*
- An Award of Excellence Ribbon and \$50, may be chosen from the blue ribbon winners in each Division.
- \$100 and rosette awarded to quilt chosen as overall Best of Show.
- Each judge may award a "Judge's Choice" ribbon to their favorite quilt.

Couture Sewing Center of Warner Robins will be demonstrating Brother's newest machines and sergers Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, October 6-9.

Quilt Sweepstakes - the exhibitor with the most blue ribbons in Quilt Divisions will receive a sewing machine awarded by the Brother Company and Couture Sewing Center of Warner Robins. *Past sewing machine winners not eligible.

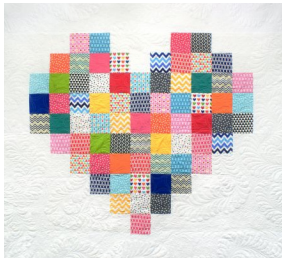

To participate in this program:

- Quilters must pre-register their items before dropping them off at the shop (drop off dates are between August 29 & September 3). Online registration must be completed by the time you drop off your quilt, as you will need to print the confirmation.
- Each quilt must be placed in a cloth bag/pillowcase which is marked with the quilter's name, name of the quilt, and the name of the shop. Do not place your entries in trash bags that might be mistaken for actual trash. If you place more than one small quilt in a pillowcase, please clearly label on the outside.
- Place a copy of your online confirmation receipt in your pillowcase with your quilt.

Your quilt will be handled with the utmost care and will be held and displayed in a protected environment; however, neither the Georgia National Fair nor the Quilt Shops will assume any liability from damage or loss that may result from events beyond our control.

Items will be picked up from shops by Fair staff on Tuesday or Wednesday, September 6 or 7, and will be returned to the shops after the fair on Thursday or Friday, October 20 or 21.

Do you have orphan blocks lying around that you don't know what to do with? Do you make test blocks before completing a quilt that sometimes just don't work for you? Did you take a class or workshop to learn a technique and end up with blocks you didn't use? Would you like to help those in need, but just can't make a whole quilt? We can help you with that!!

We will be collecting quilt blocks at the 2022 Georgia National Fair to be made into quilts for Georgians in need.

You may bring your blocks when you turn in your entries on any receiving day prior to the fair, or you may mail them to:

Blocks can be any size and any colors, but should be made from quality fabrics (they should not be so thin that you can see through them and the fabric should not fray so much that it would not hold a seam). These blocks can be planned or random, color coordinated or scrappy, pieced, appliqued, embroidered - whatever you like. Squares or rectangles are preferred, but we can work with other shapes.

Please attach your name and city or town to the back of each block. If you are a member of a participating guild or sewing group, include the group name as well.

Blocks will be displayed at the 2022 Georgia National Fair. We hope to collect enough to make an impressive display of the generosity of our Georgia quilters and to be able to make several quilts to be donated.
