- 2. Collections must be pre-registered by September
- 18. Unless more than 15 entries are submitted, all entries pre-registered by September 18, 2023, will be guaranteed a spot in the competition. If more than 15 entries are received by Sept. 18, fifteen finalists will be selected from the entries. For those not pre-registered by the 18th, GNFA reserves the right to accept additional pre-registered entries on a first received basis until the limit of 15 is reached. WALK IN ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- 3. Accepted exhibits must be brought to the Miller-Murphy-Howard Building and placed in cases on Saturday, September 30.
- 4. Only one collection may be entered per family per <u>Division</u>. For example, there may be one adult collection and one youth collection submitted from members of the same family.
- 5. Collections must fit in display space provided. Inside measurements of the display box are 12 inches from front to back, 10 1/2 inches top to bottom and 36 inches side to side. Exhibitor may provide props for display (stands, risers, drapes, etc.).
- 6. Describe your hobby by printing (legibly) information on a 5" x 8" card to be displayed in the case with your collection. How was your collection formed? Did you collect it over a considerable time period? Was it gathered from many sources? Did you collect it personally? How many items are in your full collection? This information will be helpful to the judges and will be of interest to the people who view your display. Points will be deducted if card is not present.
- 7. Articles in a Collection Hobby (Class 1) must NOT have been made by the exhibitor. **No coin, currency, or**

stamp collections, please.

- 8. Handmade Collections (Class 2) should reflect the evidence of the hobbyist's time, effort and ingenuity. Distinctiveness is also an important factor. All items in this collection must have been made by the exhibitor.
- 9. All entries in this department will be displayed at the discretion of the management.

PREMIUMS

9. All premium money will be paid from the judges' record sheets and not from ribbons that may be attached to exhibits. Premium checks totaling \$20 or more will be mailed within six weeks after the Fair is over.
