DELIVERY NOTE: If you have items that have later delivery dates, i.e., Hobbies, Wood Carving, Art, Textiles, etc., you may bring those items with your quilt entries.

 <u>All exhibitors are required to read and abide</u> by the Georgia National Fair General Rules <u>And Regulations.</u> PLEASE NOTE...IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THE RULES. There are many different Divisions in the Quilts Department. Divisions are based on skill level, allowing a broad spectrum of participation while providing a fair system for judging purposes.

The **Novice Division** is intended for those new to the art and at the <u>very basic beginner level</u>.

The **Intermediate Division** is the average skill level <u>where most exhibitors will enter</u>.

The **Open Division** is offered for the more advanced exhibitor whose projects demonstrate more complexity of design. <u>The amateur exhibitor</u> whose work is competitive at a higher than average level of his/her art and professionals will enter in this category.

3. The honor system is used with regard to the proper Division placement for exhibitors. In other words, it will be left to the exhibitor to determine under which Division he/she should exhibit. Once an exhibitor places consistently in the top awards he/she is encouraged to move up to the next skill level. An exhibitor who accumulates 12 blue ribbons or two Best of Show or Best in Category Awards within a department will be required to move up to the next skill level. Judges may move

items up in skill level if quality of the work merits. Management reserves the right to move work to a higher skill level if merited.

4. <u>All items in this Department must be entered at the same Skill Level</u>.

5. All quilts must have been handmade and completed <u>by the exhibitor</u> within the last five years.

6. Exhibitors may enter maximum of 3 exhibits in each class as long as each is a different pattern.

7. The name of any pattern used should be listed on the entry form or in the notes section of online entry.

8. Quilts must be in excellent condition. Incomplete, torn, or soiled quilts will not be accepted or displayed.

9. To qualify and be judged as a Quilt, each entry must consist of three layers, (top, batting and backing), and be hand or machine quilted or hand tied. Yo-Yo, Cathedral Window, and Shaggy Raggy coverlets and "Other Quilted Items" should be entered in the Sewing Department.

DELIVERY NOTE: If you are hand delivering to the Fairgrounds and have items that have later delivery dates, e.g., hobbies, wood carving, art, textiles, etc., you may bring those items with your entries on the earlier delivery date.

11.Premiums will be paid from judges' record sheets and not from ribbons attached to the exhibits. Premium checks totaling \$15 or more will be mailed within six weeks after the Fair is over.

The **NOVICE DIVISION** is for the beginner. The **INTERMEDIATE DIVISION** is for the more experienced exhibitor whose projects demonstrate more complexity of design. The **OPEN DIVISION** is offered for the professional exhibitor and for the amateur exhibitor whose work is competitive at the highest level of his/her art. The **YOUTH DIVISION** is for ages 12-18.

The Adult Divisions for medium and large quilts use the classes listed below. Notes: To be entered in a class based on technique, (ex: pieced), the majority of the quilt must contain that technique.

## Class

- 1 100% Cotton Quilts (eligible for Cotton Women awards) All elements of the quilt must be cotton all fabric, thread, batting, etc.
- 2 Art or Collage Quilts
- 3 Embellished (Thread painting, beadwork, etc.) or Embroidered
- 4 Mixed Techniques (any quilt consisting of more than one technique must be entered mixed techniques)
- 5 Pieced
- 6 Other Techniques (Appliqué, Wholecloth, Panel, Trapunto, etc.)

7 First Time Quilt **FOR NOVICE ENTRIES ONLY** (First quilt completed by entrant regardless of technique – may only enter once in this class)

If your quilt is part of a guild challenge, please add this in the description. If we have enough quilts from your challenge, we will try to display them together.

3 Medium Quilts (Less than 280" in perimeter and over 144" perimeter.), Any Technique


- 4 Large Quilts (perimeter greater than 280"), Any Technique

of technique - may only enter once in this class)

## **Quilting Awards**

• Sewing Machine and Plaque awarded to Quilt Show Sweepstakes. \*In the instance that the winner of the most blue ribbons in quilting has won a sewing machine within the past 10 years, he/she will be awarded the Sweepstakes plaque and \$25 (in lieu of sewing machine), and the winner of the most blue ribbons that has not won a sewing machine within the past 10 years will be awarded the sewing machine.

- An Award of Excellence Ribbon and \$50, may be chosen from the blue ribbon winners in each Division.
- \$100 and rosette awarded to quilt chosen as overall Best of Show.
- Each judge may award a "Judge's Choice" ribbon to their favorite quilt.

To participate in this program:

- <u>Quilters must pre-register their items before dropping them off</u> at the shop (drop off dates are between August 28 & September 2). Online registration must be completed by the time you drop off your quilt, as you will need to print the confirmation.
- Each quilt must be placed in a cloth bag/pillowcase which is marked with the quilter's name, name of the quilt, and the name of the shop. Do not place your entries in trash bags that might be mistaken for actual trash. If you place more than one small quilt in a pillowcase, please clearly label on the outside.
- Place a copy of your online confirmation receipt in your pillowcase with your quilt.

Your quilt will be handled with the utmost care and will be held and displayed in a protected environment; however, neither the Georgia National Fair nor the Quilt Shops will assume any liability from damage or loss that may result from events beyond our control.

Items will be picked up from shops by Fair staff on Tuesday or Wednesday, September 5 or 6, and will be returned to the shops after the fair on Thursday or Friday, October 19 or 20.



## Georgians Make a Difference! Quilt Block Donation

Wow!!! When we asked for donations of quilt blocks for the fair last year, we were holding our breath in hopes that we would receive enough blocks to make a single quilt. The response was overwhelming! As a result of the generosity of Georgia (and a few South Carolina) quilters, we collected over 500 quilt blocks, bits and pieces (from 2 inch four patches to 12 inch squares, and even a few pieced borders), that we displayed at the 2022 Fair. We had so many that we had to continue the quilt block display in another section of the building. Members of the Crossroads Quilt Guild in Perry have been working on turning some of those blocks into actual quilts that will be displayed in the Miller-Murphy-Howard Building during the 2023 Georgia National Fair and then donated afterwards.
