


What a Judge might look for in Rabbits:

- A properly balanced rabbit that is also uniform in weight.
- Straight front and hind legs
- Good overall physical condition (ex. cleanliness, health).
- Good fur texture and exceptional fur quality.
- All markings that are correctly positioned on each breed.
- Eyes and toenails that are the proper color, depending on each breed.
- A meaty loin on commercial breeds

What a Judge might look for in the show ring:

- Showmanship includes general appearance, especially cleanliness of the animal and the exhibitor's ability to control and pose the animal during judging.
- Each exhibitor brings his/her rabbit to the show table, where the judge examines each animal.
- Rabbits are grouped into classes for judging purposes.
- A good showman is polite and courteous to other exhibitors and pay attention to both animals and to the judge at all times.

Did you know...

- A female rabbit is called a <u>Doe</u>. A male rabbit is called a <u>Buck</u>. A baby rabbit is called a <u>Kit</u>, and they
 are born with their eyes closed and without fur.
- Most rabbits can actually turn their ears 180 degrees. This rotation can pinpoint the exact location of a sound.
- A rabbit's life span is about 8 years, though sterilized rabbits (those who are spayed/neutered) can live as long as 10-12 years.
- Rabbits can have multiple litters each year consisting of 4–10 kits per litter.
- Rabbits and Hares are two different species and cannot reproduce with each other.
- The Flemish giant rabbit is the largest type of rabbit in the world. They're usually anywhere from 2.5 to 4 feet long and weigh 15 to 22 pounds, but the heaviest recorded Flemish giant rabbit weighed 50 pounds!
- The Columbia Basin Pygmy is the smallest and also one of the rarest rabbit breeds on Earth, its weight only reaches up to a pound.
- There are 51 rabbit breeds currently recognized by the American Rabbits Breeders Association (ARBA).
