Rules & Premium Information:

1. Entries will not be accepted after July 6th. All substitutions must be made by that date.
2. To enter, please go to:

You will be required to make an account and apply via FairEntry.
3. Pens will be assigned by the Superintendent and are on a first-come first-served basis, only shavings will be provided.
4. All animals must be health checked by the vet prior to unloading. Barn Superintendent has the right to refuse entry of any animal not in proper health for showing.
5. 4-H and FFA exhibitors in county and out, may enter registered goats in the open show and must pay the appropriate entry fees. All 4-H and FFA boer goats being shown in open class will be stalled in the 4-H & FFA barn.
6. All animals must be shown in individual classes to be included in group classes.
7. Horned animals are to have horn covers on at all times.
8. Exhibitors are responsible for the care and appearance of their animals and display.
9. All animals on exhibit must be shown in the appropriate class, no display animals.
10. All vehicles must be off the fairgrounds by 9:30AM.
11. All stalls must be cleaned by 10:00AM.
12. All ribbons and awards must be displayed.



13. All goats must have official USDA national scrapie eradication assigned flock identification (your herd tattoo registered with the scrapie program is acceptable)
14. Refer to the official rules and general regulations for more on health requirements and general information.

Premium Awards:

All Open Class Goats are for exhibit only and will not be judged. A fixed premium of \$10 will be paid for Open Class Goats, with a maximum of four (4) animals per exhibitor being awarded premiums.
