This year's celebration will be different than the prior ninety-eight community events as it will be modified due to the timing of the event and the current COVID situation. We are running through different scenarios that will financially allow us to produce a safe event that you will be proud to be a part of while making sure our centennial celebration in 2022 will be one for the record books.

Sponsors are vital to the success of the Greeley Stampede. In 2019, 116 companies invested more than \$1.8 million to support the community event through the sponsorship program. We will need the continued support from our partners now more than ever to provide a celebration for our community.

We will continue to create custom sponsorship packages starting at a \$7,500 investment level to help reach your goals. Sponsors may receive on-site exposure, inclusion in appropriate marketing materials and a modified hospitality package.

We greatly appreciate your patience and flexibility as we continue to plan for this year's modified Stampede. We will continue to closely monitor the situation with our local health professionals with hopes to add events, attractions & programs as the allowed and deemed safe. 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Event History

The Greeley Stampede is a non-profit 501c4 organization that is rich in tradition and heritage dating back to the late 1800's. It began as a community celebration to honor local potato farmers and has since grown into an internationally acclaimed festival attracting over 220,000 people annually from all parts of the United States and many foreign countries. Today, the event is Colorado's premier summer western celebration that strives to celebrate our western heritage & independence while making a positive impact on our community.

















Giving Back to the Community

The Stampede has been and will always be about the community. Over the past 5 years, the event has:

- donated more than \$375k to community organizations that volunteer during the event
- raised more than \$315k for the Stampede Foundation to support education in Northern Colorado
- invested more than \$1.5 million for Island Grove Park improvements

Safety Procedures

The Greeley Stampede has been working closely with the City of Greeley, Weld County and the State of Colorado to develop a plan to host a safe event for our community to enjoy. We will continue to monitor the situation to adapt as the conditions improve with hope to increase capacities, add attractions and reduce restrictions.

Currently, as of April 16, here are some of the safety procedures to be implemented this year:

- reduced capacity to allow for social distancing
- promote guest use of face coverings while in high traffic areas & lines
- directional and social distancing markers will be placed to maintain traffic flow
- wait to confirm use of the Buckle Club and Sponsor Patio hospitality areas due to capacity limitations
- frequent scheduled cleaning & disinfecting of high touch surfaces


Access to the North Forty & Spur Club hospitality areas

Building for the Future

The Greeley Stampede has been a community celebration for 99 years and will be around for many more years despite the recent COVID related setbacks & restrictions. The Stampede is working on two major capital improvement projects that will benefit the event & community.

JBS Arena Stage- scheduled to be completed in 2021

This new stage will be almost two-times larger than our existing stage that will allow for bigger concert production, reduced concert venue setup, increased arena concert capacity, enhanced entertainer amenities, and will provide new entertainment opportunities for the greater Weld County community. The project is financially supported by JBS, City of Greeley and Weld County.

Legacy Project- scheduled to be completed in 2022 with funding support In 2022, the Greeley Stampede will be celebrating the 100th annual community celebration. It will be a major milestone for the event, community and the entire State of Colorado. A top priority is to preserve and showcase the Stampede's history for future generations to experience. The Greeley Stampede is exploring to expand the current office in Island Grove Park to fulfill this priority called the Legacy Project. The project is expected to cost \$400-600k.

The Legacy Project is a 2,300 sq ft expansion with space to:

- display event memorabilia including saddles, buckles, and event photos
- store and preserve event archives
- recognize distinguished individuals like former Grand Marshals & Hall of Fame inductees
- showcase the Stampede's permanent western art collection
- host volunteer meetings & special events
- renovate existing offices to accommodate for the new project and to create more efficient office space
- feature a commissioned art mural dedicated to the history of agriculture in Greeley for their role in our community's success
- share the history of the sport of rodeo


