Meet an Old Wrangler Who is the New Kid on the Board

I am Rish Burkholder and want to thank you for this opportunity to serve as your Communications Board Member. I have been a Wrangler for 25 years. The timing just wasn't right, I guess, but I am very excited about serving in this capacity during the 100th Greeley Stampede.
