- 4 Exhibitor may show only one entry in each lot unless otherwise stated.
- Exhibitor must furnish own clear glass container for horticulture speci-5. mens. No specimen can be smaller than 3 inches or taller than 30 inches. Size of container must be adequet to support specimen and hold it erect. Canning jars are NOT acceptable.
- 6. Material should be in good condition and insect free. For best showing, put in deep water and keep in a cool place for 2 hours. Foliage is judged as well as blossoms.
- 7. Hybrid tea roses and dahlias must be disbudded.
- Name horticulture specimens if possible. Preference will be given to named 8. variety when judged.
- 9 Horticulture entry cards will be made out or checked and placed by entry committee, not by exhibitor. (address labels are acceptable)
- 10 Any nonconforming horticulture specimen may be entered for display only and will not be judged.
- The Floral Building will be closed from 12-4:30 pm Wednesday, July 25 11. for judging.

- Non-acid and low acid foods such as meats, fish, poultry and all vegetables except tomatoes, must be processed in a pressure canner.
- Classes 1,4,5,6,8,9,14,15, and 16 must be processed in boiling water bath. 3
- Each jar MUST BE LABELED. THE LABEL IS TO BE PLACED ON THE UNDERNEATH SIDE OF THE JAR, give name of the product, hot or cold pack for a boiling water bath, weighted or dial gauge for a pressure canner, date canned, time of processing and altitude (feet). LABELS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE FAIR OFFICE.
- All entries must have been processed since August 1, 2015.
- ALL PRODUCTS MUST BE IN CLEAR STANDARD GLASS JARS 6. INCLUDING CLASSES 7, 10, 11, 12, 13 (KERR, MASON, BALL, ETC. ARE CONSIDERED STANDARD), ALL OTHERS WILL BE REFUSED.
- ALL JELLY SHOULD BE IN TAPERED JARS SO THEY CAN BE EAS-ILY UNMOLDED. Jams, preserves, and butters must be in standard canning glass jars. NO PARAFFIN ON ANY ENTRIES.
- ALL JARS MUST BE CLEAN AND HAVE SELF-SEALING LIDS AND 8 RINGS TO BE ACCEPTED. RINGS MUST BE RUST FREE AND EASY TO OPEN.
- 9. Artificial flavorings, coloring or preservatives will automatically disqualify entries except in spiced apples, maraschino cherries, or minted pears.

- 3. All prints must be a minimum of 80 square inches in surface area 8x10, etc., up to 11x14. Prints smaller than 8x10 will not be accepted for judging. All prints must be mounted on material rigid enough to stay in place when supported only at top of mount. Mount not to exceed 3/16 of an inch in thickness, or larger than 11x14. Mounts may be flush or border style. Exception: Beginners and children only may be 5x7 and no larger than 11x14.
- DO NOT attach any hanging device to the back of any print. Any such device will be removed if it interferes with hanging with no guarantee of return to the owner.
- 5. No framed prints will be accepted for exhibit.
- Identification of prints must be on the back of the mount and include division letter, class and lot numbers as follows: A-2-3, MS-I-9, etc. and the exhibitor's name and address.
- 7. Exhibitors may enter only one (1) print per lot in any class.
- 8. Two entries from among the prints will be eligible for submission to the State Fair County Division.
- 9. Photographs with the exhibitor's name on the front, when on display, will be posted on "For Exhibit Only" board.
