Separate shows will be held for each breed with a minimum of 10 head per breed or 3 exhibitors.

**PARKING:** Exhibitors participating in the Open and Youth Cattle Shows will be given parking passes for Exhibitor Lot parking. Parking Lot #2 is reserved for 11-day exhibitors, admission control, Fair Board Members, staff, security, Jacksonville Sheriff Officers, and for Fire and Rescue trucks that may be needed for any emergency that may arise during the Fair. Parking passes will be monitored in this lot to assure that it is not used by anyone except those previously listed and who have a Lot #2 parking pass hanging from their rearview mirror with the correct name. This will be strictly enforced.

**PASSES:** Gate passes will be issued on the following basis. 1-6 animals, six (6) daily admission tickets and three one day Exhibitor Lot parking passes, 7-12 animals, nine (9) daily admission tickets and six one day Exhibitor Lot parking passes, 13 and over animals, twelve (12) daily admission tickets and six one day Exhibitor Lot parking passes.

Please note: All passes will be single daily admission tickets. All parking passes for Open and Youth Shows will be for Exhibitor Lot parking. (11-day exhibitors get one Lot 2 pass and one Exhibitor Lot pass.) No additional parking or admission passes will be given if showing in the Youth Show as well.

**Notice:** In the case of papers pending, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to provide the Jacksonville Fair with a letter from the breed association stating that the papers on their animal have been applied for but have not yet been processed. Papers pending will not be accepted without this letter from the association.

**OPEN SHOW  
AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION®  
SHOW CLASSIFICATION FOR ANGUS**

Any classes listed in this classification, which exceeds 15 head per class, should be broken into smaller classes. This should be accomplished by dividing the class as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date.

Furthermore, the recommended number of head per class varies per show based on number of head checked in. See recommendations below:

- Shows with less than 100 head: 8 head or less per class
- Shows with 100 – 200 head: 12 head or less per class
- Shows with more than 200 head: 15 head or less per class.

***Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff in attendance. If there are more than 30 head in a division, the division should be split into Division 1, 2, etc.***

**THIS CLASSIFICATION IS EFFECTIVE FOR SHOWS  
FROM JULY 16, 2023 TO DECEMBER 31, 2023**

Only registered Angus cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown – Champion and Reserve Champion placings are not counted in number of head shown.

**Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow/calf classes. However, the calf at the side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class.**

1. Cow/Calf Class – cows three (3) years of age and younger, cows must be born January 1, 2020 through August 31, 2021. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.

2. Cow/Calf Class – cows four (4) years of age and older, cows must be born December 31, 2019 or earlier. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.

**Grand Champion Cow/Calf Pair (1, 2)

**Grand and reserve grand champion cow/calf pairs do not show for grand champion female and are ineligible to compete in the get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire and breeder's six-head classes.**

25. Get-of-Sire: Four animals by one sire shown in the above classes both sexes represented.

26. Breeder Six Head - The exhibitor of the breeders' six head must be breeder and first owner, identified by the same member code for the animals exhibited. Cattle owned by other exhibitors may be included provided the exhibitor of the breeders' six head is the breeder and first owner of the included animals(s). Animals must be exhibited in individual classes. Cattle bred and owned by a junior member(s) may be included if the exhibitor of the breeders six head is an individual or married couple and is the parent or legal guardian of the junior member(s).

**Release Rule:**

Exhibitors will be released by zones. The zone map and release schedule for staggered release will be posted on the Livestock Office Bulletin Board. Consideration will first be given to exhibitors living farthest away within and outside of the State of Florida. No exhibitor will be released without first having their barn and tack areas cleaned, checked, and cleared by the Barn Superintendent who shall issue an all-clear notice. Exhibitor must then give this notice to the Livestock Secretary before beginning to load out.
