## Rules and Regulations

**ALL EXHIBITS ARE SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING RULES:**

---

### *General Rules*

---

1. The Executive Board of Directors shall have charge and control of the Fair Grounds during the Fair and shall be the supreme authority on the conduct of the Fair and reserves the right to amend and add to these rules as they in their option may deem advisable. The chairs of the various departments will be in full control of the departments over which they are appointed and commissioned. They will be responsible for the special rules of their respective departments. Any person who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums.
2. Every animal and article on the grounds shall be under the general control of the organization during the Fair and while every precaution will be taken for safe-keeping, neither the Association, nor its officers or chairs, shall be responsible in case of loss, damage or accident that may occur. Due diligence will also be used by the officers of the Association to safeguard and prevent injuries to persons, but the Association will not be responsible in case accidents do occur.
3. Competition is open to all in Open Class, regardless of residence.
4. No entries will be accepted for competition unless a class is shown in this catalog. Entries may be accepted for display only, if space is available, but no premiums will be offered.
5. Exhibitors should advise the Chair of the department of their intentions to exhibit livestock so the space may be provided. **Stall requests and entries are due July 24th.** Forms for this purpose are available online at [www.jocokansasfair.com](http://www.jocokansasfair.com) Stalls or pens must be cleaned by the owners of the livestock.
6. Entries must be the property of the exhibitor and entered in his or her name. Exhibits must be entered at the designated time to be eligible for ribbons or premium money. Exhibits in 4-H, FFA and Open Class, (except livestock and open class flowers) will be accepted Monday from 6:30 – 9:00 p.m. and Tuesday

from 8:00 – 10:00 a.m. See specific departments for check in times of livestock and flowers.

7. All agricultural exhibits must be the products of the current year.
8. Judging in all classes will be by competent, impartial and experienced judges. No person will be permitted to approach the judges while the judging is in progress and an entry system will be used whereby the identity of the exhibitor will not be known until after judging has taken place.
9. Judging of exhibits will proceed as outlined in the Schedule or posted on the Fair grounds.
10. A judge, at his/her discretion, may withhold any or all premiums if an article, or animal, in his/her judgment, is not worthy of award.
11. In classes where there is no competition, the first prize and ribbon will be awarded, if worthy. Only two prize monies may be awarded to an exhibitor in any one class. See rules in each department.
12. Ribbons will be left with the exhibits while they are on display.
13. Trophies and Special Awards will be dependent on securing sponsors.
14. **OPEN PREMIUM PAYOUTSWILL ONLY BE PAID TO THE 1<sup>ST</sup>,2<sup>nd</sup>, & 3<sup>rd</sup> PLACES REGARDLESS OF HOW MANY RIBBONS ARE AWARDED. BLUE \$3.00, RED \$2.00, WHITE \$1.00.** Livestock premiums listed under individual departments.
15. Open Class premiums will be paid Sunday between approximately 9:00 AM (after church service) and 1:00 PM.
16. Requested corrections to premium checks must be submitted by 1:00 PM on Sunday.
17. Release time will be Sunday as follows: Livestock/Horses are released and may be removed after 6:00 AM, clean up of stall areas and their immediate area is the responsibility of the exhibitor; all other entries will release after church service. Please respect the church service by limiting the noise and activity. Exhibits remain the property of the exhibitor throughout the fair and must be reclaimed at the above time or arrangements made by the exhibitor to have them picked up. The Fair Association will assume no responsibility for exhibits. **ANY EXHIBIT REMOVED BEFORE RELEASE TIME WILL BAR EXHIBITOR FROM EXHIBITING THE NEXT YEAR.**
18. Buildings on the grounds will be open to the public at 10:00 a.m. except Tuesday when they open at 7:30 a.m. (closed during judging). Saturday they do not open until after the parade. Exhibit buildings will be closed at 10:00 p.m. Gates will be locked one half hour after the carnival closes for the night. South Service gate will be open from 6 a.m. till 12:00 p.m.
19. All fair book changes or corrections shall be given to the fair book committee in writing.

---

## ***Open Rules***

---

1. Exhibitors will abide by the General Rules as set forth for the Johnson County Fair, except where special regulations are set forth governing this department.
2. Entry must be made in all classes. Entry can be made on the web page ([www.jocokansasfair.com](http://www.jocokansasfair.com))
3. **If you do not have access to the internet, you may enter your exhibits in the open class building during check-in times. Exhibits may be checked in, in the Open Class Building Monday, July 30<sup>th</sup> from 6:30 PM to 9:00 PM or**



**Tuesday, July 31<sup>st</sup> from 8:00 AM to 10:00 AM.**

4. Exhibits must be the handiwork of the exhibitor where mechanical work is required; the grower in agricultural exhibits; owner and feeder in livestock exhibits. They must be the result of the current year's work.
5. Premium money will be paid on the grounds and must be collected between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., Sunday of the Fair.
6. Junior leaders may assist at time of entry but at time of judging only those asked to assist will be allowed in the buildings.
7. No exhibitor may make more than one entry in each class, except livestock in which two entries per class may be made (including poultry, pigeons and rabbits – 2 per class per breed).
8. Livestock exhibitors must provide a suitable means of caring for their animals at all times during the fair. For judging, all livestock exhibitors must be on hand to exhibit their entries, failure of which may bar him or her from participating in any awards. -
9. 4-H/FFA livestock, after paying the entry fee, will be permitted to show in the open classes where there is open competition.
10. Overnight stays on the fairgrounds will be permitted for authorized persons. Livestock exhibitors stalling animals on the grounds for the duration of the fair are eligible for a camping spot. NOTE: One parent is required to stay with exhibitors if exhibitor is under the age 18.
11. Quiet will be observed from 12:00 a.m. (1/2 hour after the carnival closes for the night) to 5:00 a.m. No member will arrive or leave the fairgrounds during this time. Those who, in any way, do not maintain a high standard of conduct and respect for others and their property may have the privilege of staying on the grounds rescinded.

---

## ***Livestock Rules***

---

1. Stalls and alley ways shall be kept neat and clean at all times.
2. Bedding must be furnished by exhibitor, **NO HAY OR STRAW. IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT CATTLE BE BEDDED ON MULCH NOT SHAVINGS OR CHIPS.**
3. Permanent incisor teeth cannot have erupted and all baby teeth must be present in order to show. This guideline is in keeping with state.
4. No exhibitor may alter their animal's natural conformation and structure. Altering the color or structure of the hair or wool coat in any way (except for trimming or blocking) is not allowed. Any animal which when rubbed with a white cloth shows residual evidence of artificial coloring will be dismissed from the show.
5. During the fair any administration or injection of any compound that may cause quantitative or qualitative change in the characteristic of the animal on foot or in carcass is cause for disqualification from the show.
6. Any medication given to any animal on the fairgrounds must be administered by a licensed veterinarian, with the approval of the superintendent.
7. No exhibitor of cattle, swine, goats and sheep can show more than 2 market animals (i.e. 2 hogs, 2 sheep, 2 market beef, 2 goats).
8. Dress Codes will be used for livestock shows.
9. No livestock will be unloaded in the camping area.
10. All trucks, trailers, not used for camping, must be parked in assigned areas. Two

parking passes will be given per family for those stalling livestock for the duration of the fair. Parking will be enforced starting noon Wednesday. Passes will be distributed during livestock weigh in on Wednesday morning. Passes will be available in the Fair office starting Wednesday afternoon.

11. Mistreatment of animals will not be tolerated and will be a cause for disqualification as determined by the Livestock Superintendent, Department Head Chair and Fair Board President.
12. All cattle in the barn, all cattle, will be bedded on shavings that will be provided. No straw will be allowed. A night tie-out area will be provided. Straw or chips may be used in that area. Cattle may be moved to tie-out area at 8:00 p.m.
13. It is the intent of the Johnson County Fair Board to conduct blood, DNA and/or urine analysis on any animal entered in the Johnson County competition at its discretion. The exhibitor of an animal producing an analysis of diuretic or any unapproved medication will be required to forfeit all prizes and premiums and may be barred from future competition at the fair.
14. Once an animal has reached the scales the animal will be weighed. No re-weighs will be allowed.
15. Two chutes are provided for grooming beef. Other chutes will be permitted only in designated area.
16. **NO ELECTRICAL DEVICES WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE SWINE PENS**  
Only cordless clippers are allowed.
17. **USE OF ANIMALS IN JUDGING CONTEST: Any livestock entered in the show may be used in the Livestock Judging Contest**

---

## ***Livestock Health Requirements***

---

**Livestock with Kansas Origin:** A local veterinarian will be present to inspect all animals to see that there is no evidence of a contagious or infectious disease. The animals will be inspected before unloading.

**Poultry:** All Poultry, except waterfowl, must show proof that they are pullorum-typhoid clean at time of entry. The cost the test is the responsibility of the exhibitor. To comply with State Law, testing will be done every year.

Exhibitors must know the answers to the following questions at the time of entry:

Location address of flock

Name and address of the hatchery or dealer where purchased

Breed, Variety, Strain or Trade Name of exhibit

Number of males and females in the flock

Total number of birds in the flock

Age of Birds

Livestock with out of state origin must meet all health requirements as in-state animals. In addition, any livestock showing at local fairs which originate in other states must meet Kansas import requirements. Trucks hauling these animals must stop at a Kansas Port of Entry. These exhibitors should have two (2) copies of their health certificate, leaving one copy at the Kansas Port of Entry and bringing one copy to the fair.

1. Please enter your exhibits online at [www.jocokansasfair.com](http://www.jocokansasfair.com). Be sure to print your entry tag to tape to the back of your exhibit.
2. The goal of this department is to encourage the development and showcase the creative talents of our visual artists.
3. Entries are limited to one per class per exhibitor.
4. Please be sure to enter artwork under proper medium.
5. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
6. Paint by number, craft kits, pre-printed coloring pages, etc., will not be accepted.
7. Any piece that has previously been awarded a ribbon in open class art at the fair may not be re-entered.
8. Any work improperly prepared for hanging will not be accepted. Artwork must be prepared as followed:

Elementary school (Grades K-4) pieces may be **mounted on**

construction paper or poster board but must be ready to hang with string attached to the back.

**DO NOT** mat or frame canvas but **DO** wire it on the back for hanging.

**ALL** other pieces must be **matted, framed, and wired** ready to hang.

9. Pre-School entries will be accepted for the purpose of exhibit only – no judging.
10. Department is not responsible for damage.
11. Qualified judges will determine the merits of each entry and their decisions will be final.

1. Please enter your exhibits online at [www.jocokansasfair.com](http://www.jocokansasfair.com). Be sure to print your entry tag to attach to the back of your exhibit.
2. One entry per class per person.
3. New this year! For Canned Foods the following information needs to be on a 3 X 5" card stating: Name of Product, Date Preserved, Type of Pack (Hot or Cold), Processing Method and Time, Pounds of Pressure (Low Acid Food). Include recipe on card.
4. For dried foods: The following information needs to be on a 3 X 5" card stating: Name of Dried Food, Date Dried, Type of Pretreatment, Drying Method and Drying Time. Include recipe on card.
5. Using the guidelines from the National Center for Home Preservation, visual inspection will be used for the most part for judging. Jars may need to be opened when: differences among entries are too small for visual judging only or when spoilage is suspected. Any item opened will have a small black mark on top to denote it has been opened.
6. All entries must be in compliance with current USDA guidelines (available at the extension office) for safe food preservation. For more information log on to [www.uga.edu](http://www.uga.edu) . All preservation rules must be followed or item will not be judged
7. Exhibits shall be in clean, standard containers.
8. Recommended method of processing must be used.
9. Open kettle processed fruits and vegetables will not be accepted.



10. Pickles and sweet spreads that contain fruit pulp or pulp must be finished by water bath process.
11. Jars must be sealed when entered, paraffin not acceptable.
12. Screw band and flat must be same brand as jar.
13. Judges may or may not open jars to taste entry for quality.
14. Make sure jars are
  - a. Tightly sealed and sanitary
  - b. Properly labeled (include method and name of item)
  - c. Canned during the current season
  - d. Complete unit – add screw band loosely (to protect foods when flat has been loosened and for better display)
15. All classes displayed in clear standard glass canning jars.
16. Fruits and tomatoes must be processed in either a water bath or pressure canner.
17. Vegetables and Meats must be processed in a pressure canner.
18. Pickles and relishes must be processed in a water bath.
19. Sweet spreads and jelly must be processed in a water bath.

1. Please enter your exhibits online at [www.jocokansasfair.com](http://www.jocokansasfair.com). Be sure to print your entry tag to attach to your exhibit.

2. Late entries may be exhibited but not judged. If you have multiple entries please arrive at least one hour before entry closing deadline.
3. Entries are open to all amateur gardeners.
4. The exhibitor must grow all entries or plants and they must be in their possession for at least 60 days.
5. **Pre-entry in this department is not necessary, but if you don't print at home, stop at the Fair Office to enter and print tags before coming to the Grange Building. Allow ample time.**
6. All flower exhibitors must furnish their own containers. Container plant pots should be clean and entry should not exceed 25 pounds. Uncolored, clear bottles or vases must be used for specimens and displays and should be in proportion with the entry size.
7. Exhibitors may make more than one entry per class if different varieties are clearly identified and properly named. Otherwise, only one entry per class per exhibitor.
8. Specimens are a single flower on one stem; a spray consists of a single shoot bearing multiple flowers and foliage on short branching; a stalk is a long, leafless stem; a spike is a long flower cluster in which the blossoms grow directly on, or very close to a central stem. A stem, spray, stalk or spike must not exceed 25 inches in total length.
9. Displays must consist of five or more flowers of the same cultivar variety – no foreign foliage.
10. No foliage under water for specimens and displays.
11. Rose buds must be two-thirds open.
12. All flowers should be arranged in containers and ready for display when brought. All exhibitors should have the correct names of flowers entered and class number.
13. Wedging with clear cellophane is allowed, but should not be noticeable above the top of the container.
14. No prizes will be awarded unless the judge considers the entry worthy.
15. All "General Rules and Regulations for Exhibitors" apply to all entrants.

  - b. Quality-25%

5. Fresh herbs should be displayed in tied bundles of 5 stems in a manner to keep stems fresh; such as floral water tube or clear vase.

6. Organic Gardens are those in which no synthetic or artificial herbicides, pesticides, insecticides or fertilizers have been used.
7. Garden Displays
  - a. Only one variety of each fruit or vegetable is allowed.
  - b. Same fruit or vegetable quantity as in individual open classes.
  - c. Display container is the exhibitor's choice.
  - d. Points will be awarded as follows: 1) Quality of fruits and vegetables 75% 2) Appearance and creativity of overall display 25%
  - e. Consists of 5 different fresh fruits or vegetable, in any combination of small (e.g.: green or yellow green beans, lima beans, peas), medium (e.g.: cucumbers, tomatoes, carrots, beets, onions, peppers, potatoes, okra, sweet corn, herbs) or large (e.g.: watermelon, squash, pumpkin, eggplant, cabbage, cantaloupe)
  - f. Community Garden Display is for produce from a communal section planted for giving away.

3. Exhibitor must produce all honey, except in class 6815, honey & products can be from other sources.
4. All jars must be glass plain and free of labels. No inner seals in lids.
5. Judging criteria will follow state fair guidelines.
6. Extracted Honey: Also known as strained honey is honey that has been separated from the comb by centrifugal force, gravity, straining or other means. Shall consist of 3 one-pound Queen line or Classic glass jars.
7. Chunk Honey: Shall consist of 1 strip of cut comb (full length of jar) in three 1 lb. round glass jars.
8. Comb Honey: Three “rounds” “cassettes” (clear lids both sides, no pressure sensitive label), or “basswood sections” (cardboard carton with window, no producer’s name or address.
9. Cut Comb Honey: Three comb honeys cut and placed in commercial plastic comb honey boxes (4X4).
10. Crystallized /Creamed Honey: Shall consist of three glass jars between 8 oz. and 16 oz. all jars must be the same.
11. Gift Package: Items must be clearly labeled, as they would be offered for sale – except any marks identifying the entrant must be obscured or removed, or fictitious. Gift basket if wrapped, must be able to be unwrapped for judging.
12. Beeswax: 3 lb. block, geometric shape, not decorative, smooth surface top and bottom.
13. Beeswax Candles: four molded or dipped candles. No non-beeswax enhancement allowed, except wick.
14. Art Design in Beeswax: Entries must be 2 pounds minimum weight, 100% beeswax: may be more than one piece but must be firmly joined together: may be cast in mold or carved. No non-beeswax enhancement allowed.

15. Frame of Honey: Shallow or medium depth. Frame must be in a display case, both sides visible. Display case available upon request.
16. Youth entries ages 18 and under.
17. Class 6814 is for 1<sup>st</sup> year beekeepers only.
18. All photos must be matted with the mat size of 11 x 14 that has an 8 x 10 opening that fits over and frames the photo Do not mount the photo onto a board. The mat should fit over the photo and the photo should be taped securely to the back of the mat. These mats can be used year after year and are available at craft stores. There should be no lettering or words (signatures) put on the exhibit by the photographer either on the mat or on the photo. Photos with lettering on the mat or photo will be disqualified.

3. There is NO DEADLINE for entering exhibits online in any of the Open Class Departments. Please enter only the items you are exhibiting.
4. All exhibits must be received in the Departments they are entered in on Monday evening or BEFORE 10am on Tuesday morning to be judged.
5. Limit one photo per class, per exhibitor. All photos must be taken by the exhibitor.

6. Due to space issues and the growing number of entries, all photos must be 8x10 size ONLY. Smaller photos are too difficult to judge. Larger photos will not fit on our display. See #9 for mat specifications.
7. All photos must be matted with the mat size of 11x14 that has an 8x10 opening that fits over and frames the photo. Do not mount the photo onto a board. The mat should fit over the photo and the photo should be taped securely to the back of the mat. These mats can be used year after year and are available at craft stores.
8. NO FRAMES please. Framed photos will not be accepted as we do not have the ability to display them.
9. There should be no lettering or words (signatures) put on the exhibit by the photographer either on the mat or on the photo. Photos with lettering on the mat or photo will be disqualified.

## ***Horses – Equestrians with Disabilities***

---

2. In order to participate, an exhibitor must have a medically diagnosed condition that causes a permanent impairment, which can be measured objectively. Exhibitors shall also have affiliation with a recognized Therapeutic Riding organization. Examples of conditions, diseases or disorders that may lead to permanent impairment are but not limited to: paresis, amputation (partial t full joint), ankylosis, upper motor neuron lesions, vision impairment, and intellectual disability. Eligible conditions include: amputation, arthrogryposis, Asperger syndrome, autism spectrum disorder, Batten disease, cerebrovascular accident (stroke) cerebellar ataxia, cerebral palsy, Coffin-Lowry syndrome, cystic fibrosis, Down syndrome, dwarfism, fragile X syndrome, Friedreich’s ataxia, Guillain-Barre syndrome, hearing impairment, Hunter syndrome, juvenile rheumatoid arthritis, mental retardation, microcephaly, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy, post-polio syndrome, Prader-Willi syndrome, Rett syndrome, spina bifida, spinal cord injury, Tourette syndrome, traumatic brain injury, trisomy disorders and visual impairment.
3. During the Lead Line class, one handler per entry is authorized to facilitate the safety of the exhibitor. The handler must be 16 years of age or older. The handler must have a lead line in their hand at all times which is attached to the horse’s bridle or halter. An additional side walker per entry is also authorized to ensure the rider’s safety.
4. During the Equestrian with Disabilities Walk/Trot class, each entry may have one handler in the ring, but not with the rider and horse. Each handler shall have a lead line in hand in the event of a safety issue, which requires the assistance of the handler.
5. Handlers shall not obscure the judge’s line of vision, unless their assistance is required and requested by the judge or ring steward in the event of a safety issue.
6. A blind or deaf exhibitor may have an assistant who communicates via verbal or sign language or cue cards to the competitor so they may hear the judge’s directives or pattern instructions. This assistant will be outside the ring and their position known to the judge and ring steward.
7. **All horses are required to have a negative Coggins test within 12 months, AND all horses are required to obtain a Kansas Health Certificate within the previous 30 days.** All horses must be vet checked in on Tuesday, from 7:30 – 8:30 am. Open show will start at the conclusion of the 4-H horse show on Tuesday.
8. Safety Rules:

- a. There shall be no lunging in the arena once the show has started. Lunging is permitted in the round pen during the show.
- b. All horses ridden on the fairgrounds must use proper tack (bridles – no halters).
- c. No horses are allowed in the camping area or past the poultry building.
- d. No smoking or electric cigarettes inside the barn.
- e. Sei-Asim approved helmets are optional, and are encouraged. You will not be counted down for wearing them in class.
