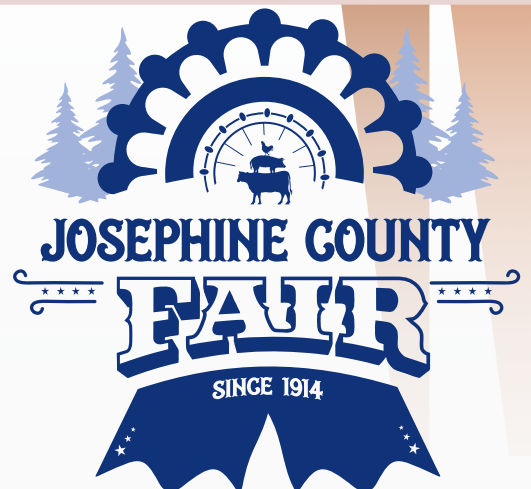

GENERAL RULES FOR NON-LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

1. All articles entered must be the work of the Exhibitor and have not been previously exhibited in a prior year at the Josephine County Fair.
2. Online entries must be submitted by the date stated and published within each Department's Rules. Information must be accurate and complete.
3. Entries must be delivered and removed only during the published scheduled times. Removal of an Exhibit before the designated time forfeits all awards for that Exhibit. Items not picked up within 10 days after the close of Fair are forfeited by the Exhibitor.
4. Entries will receive a claim check upon delivery of their item(s) and must present the claim check in order to pick up items at the scheduled pick-up time after Fair.
5. Superintendent or Judge may disqualify or transfer any exhibit to a more suitable class which, in their opinion, is not a true representation of the class in which it is entered or if published rules are not followed.
6. Departments are closed to the Public while exhibits are being judged. Ribbons and/or prizes will be as warranted. All Judge's results are final.
7. Exhibitors found in violation of rules, or to be in practices unethical or adverse to Josephine County Fair, shall be penalized by forfeiture of awards and/or privileges and removed from the exhibit.
8. The Josephine County Fair Board will take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of exhibits while at the Fairgrounds, but will not be responsible for loss, damage, theft or injury of any kind to exhibits or Exhibitors. Exhibitors shall indemnify and hold harmless Josephine County which shall include all authorities, boards, bureaus, commissions, divisions, departments, districts and offices of Josephine County and the individual members, employees, and agents thereof in their official capacities.
9. Media Disclaimer: Josephine County Fair reserves the right to use any photo or video taken at any event without the expressed written permission of those included within the photo or video. Josephine County Fair may use the photo or video in publications or other media. To ensure the privacy of an individual, images will not be identified using names or personal identifying information without written approval from the photographed Subject, Parent or Legal Guardian. Floral Building

1. All General Rules apply. There are no entry fees.
2. Entries must be registered online at <https://josephine.fairwire.com/> before drop-off/submittal. Entry deadline is Monday August 5, 2024.
3. Entries will be accepted on Tuesday August 6, 2024, from 12pm-6:30pm. All entries must have been grown by the Exhibitor for at least 60 days. The person who arranges the Floral Designs does not need to grow the plant material.
4. Container plant care will be provided by the Superintendents.
5. Judging will take place on Wednesday, August 10, 2024, from 7am-10am.
6. Competition is open to any amateur grower in Southern Oregon.
7. Exhibitors may enter more than one (1) entry in a class if the entries are different species, varieties, or colors as appropriate. Class Superintendents will make the final decision on valid entries.
8. Variety names should be provided when possible and are required in any exhibit to be considered for the Best in Show award.
9. Containers for cut flowers will be supplied by the Fair. If you use your own container, mark the upper left corner of your entry tag when you come in with a red "X" & put your name on the container bottom.
10. All exhibits are under the supervision of the Flower Show Building Coordinators and may not be moved or removed except by the class Superintendents. Exhibits that deteriorate to less than show quality will be removed by the Superintendents.
11. Exhibitors may replace spent flowers between 8am-9am on Fair days. Call your coordinator to arrange entry.
12. Exhibits and Awards must be picked up between 9am and 11am on the morning of Monday, August 12, 2024, following the Fair. After 11am the entries will be removed, check with the Fair Office for pickup location and time.

HOW TO CHOOSE THE BEST FLOWERS FOR THE SHOW

Cut flowers early Tuesday morning (entry day). See specific class number for directions. Most flowers should be cut as they are just about to open. Cut stems at an angle and plunge them immediately into very warm water. Leave the blooms in the warm water and put the container in a cool place for at least three (3) hours. Bring the blooms to the Fair in water. For specific info, call a superintendent.

Design Division Theme: “Through the Garden Gate”

1. All general rules and regulations apply.
2. Arranger need not grow plant material for designs. All designs must contain some plant material.
3. No artificial flowers, artificial foliage, artificial fruits or vegetables are permitted.
4. National flags, religious symbols, feathers of migratory birds, natural nests, and live animals are not permitted.
5. Fresh flowers in show condition are to be used in all designs unless schedule specifies otherwise.
6. Fresh plant material may never be treated. Dried materials may be colored or otherwise treated.
7. Accessories are NOT permitted unless specified in the schedule. An accessory is a subordinate object in a design while a featured object is a dominant object in a design..
8. Unless otherwise specified, exhibitors may choose materials and designs.
9. Dried line material may be used with fresh flowers, unless class specifies "all fresh".
10. Backgrounds are not allowed unless specified.
11. Designers are encouraged to condition the plant material well, and to choose materials that will have good longevity for the four (4) days of the show.
12. There is no height limitation. Width limit is 24". Designs are placed on 30" deep tables covered with white plastic and shown against white walls.
13. HWD means “height, width and depth” for Petite Designs.
14. Petite Design: SCALE will be emphasized. The size of each component should be in proportion to the overall size of the design

809-02 NOVICE –Country Garden – Traditional Mass Designs use a geometric form (sphere, cylinder or pyramid). Plant material is used in a naturalistic manner, radiating from one point. Large quantities of plant material with a closed silhouette are used. The container is subordinate, not dominant.

809-03 NOVICE – Japanese Garden – Asian Manner Design, using bamboo or bamboo like material. Choice of plant material. Accessories allowed (See Rule 7). Asia Manner Design emphasizes simplicity in line as found in nature and minimal plant material in simple containers.

809-04 NOVICE – Moonlight Garden– Creative Line Mass Design using flowers in shades of white, choice of other plant material. Line designs are adapted from Japanese design and use great restraint in quantity of plant material and have a dominant linear pattern which can be vertical, horizontal, crescent, S-curve or zig-zag. Line Mass has more plant material to enhance the strong line. Creative designs use components in a non-realistic manner and may include manufactured items and non-plant materials (see rule 3). They may have more than one focal area, use non-traditional containers, restraint in amount of plant material and any part of the design may be dominant, including the container.

809-05 NOVICE – Garden Party –Choice of Creative Design in a garden hat, choice of plant material.

AMATEUR CLASSES: (Anyone who has won 6 or more Blue Ribbons. Novices may also enter these classes).

809-06 AMATEUR – Tall Garden Shadows – Traditional Line Design. Choice of plant material (see rule 9). See 807-04 for definition of line designs. Note that the container is subordinate, not dominant in a Traditional Line Design.

809-07 AMATEUR – Twilight Serenity – Traditional Monochromatic Mass Design using cool colors. Monochromatic is one color (hue) and its related tints, tones and shades. Plant materials, containers and other components must be of the same hue or achromatic (white, grey or black). See 807-02 for definition of Traditional Mass Design.

809-08 AMATEUR – Where the Veggies Live – Choice of Traditional Design using vegetables, (state choice on entry tag: Line, Line Mass, or Mass). Choice of other, non-dominant plant materials. Choose only vegetables that will last through the 4 days of the fair.

809-09 AMATEUR – Reflection on The Pond – Asian Manner Design using a low container with area of visible water. Choice of plant material. Accessories allowed, see Rule 7. For definition of Asian Manner Design, see 807-03.

809-10 AMATEUR – Rose Arbor - Creative Line Mass Design using roses. Choice of other fresh and/or dried materials (see Rule 6). See 807-04 for definition of Creative Line Design.

809-11 AMATEUR – Winter Garden– Choice of Creative Design using bare branches evoking the feeling of winter. Choice of other plant materials.

809-12 AMATEUR –Garden Path– Creative Design using a stepping stone as a featured object, see Rule 7. Choice of other plant material.

809-13 AMATEUR – Do Fence Me In –Creative Transparency Design with choice of plant materials. Transparency Designs use see-through elements (translucent, diaphanous, grid-like material, etc.) integral to the design and permitting some components to be viewed through others.

809-14 AMATEUR –The Garden Gate– Creative Design using a frame, with choice of plant material.

PETITE DESIGN FOR ADULTS

Maximum dimensions include staging, and every part of the design.

HWD means Height, width, depth.

809-15 NOVICE – Thru A Bug’s Eye – Choice of Creative Petite Design, choice of fresh and/or dried plant material. Accessories allowed, see Rule 7. (See 807-04 for definition of Creative Designs). Maximum dimensions 5” HWD.

809-16 NOVICE – Terra Cotta Pot – Traditional Mass Petite Design, choice of fresh and or dried plant material. (See 807-02 for description of Mass Designs). Maximum dimensions 8” HWD.

809-17 NOVICE –Fairy Garden – Choice of Creative Petite Design, choice of plant material. Accessories allowed. Maximum dimensions 8” HWD.

809-18 AMATEUR –Tiny Daisies – Traditional Petite Mass Design, using daisies or daisy-like flowers. Maximum dimensions 5” HWD.

809-19 AMATEUR – Japanese Garden – Asian Manner Petite Design, choice of fresh and or dried plant material, accessories allowed see Rule 7. Maximum dimensions 8” HWD.

809-20 AMATEUR – Dancing In The Rain – Choice of Creative Petite Design and plant material. Accessories or featured object allowed, see Rule 7, (state choice on entry tag: accessory or featured object). Maximum dimensions 12” HWD.

DIVISION 810 -DESIGN FOR JUNIORS

(Exhibitors Age 11 and under may compete in ALL Division 810 classes.)

Exhibitor Age 11 and under

810-01 – Frog Pond – Choice of design, and plant materials. Accessories or figurines allowed.

810-02 – Oh Deer! – Choice of design and plant materials. Accessories or figurines allowed.

810-03 – Toys In The Garden – Choice of Petite Design, and plant materials. Accessories or figurines allowed. Not to exceed 8” height, width and depth.

Exhibitors Age 12-17

810-04 –Butterfly Wings – Asian Manner Design in a low container showing water. Choice of plant materials. Accessories or figurines allowed, see Rule 7. See 802-03 for definition of Asian Manner Design.

810-05 –Bird Friends- Choice of Design and plant materials. Accessories or figurines allowed, see Rule 7.

810-06 – Fairy Wings - Choice of Petite Design, and plant materials. Accessories or figurines allowed, see Rule 7. Not to exceed 8” HWD.
