## DEFINITIONS:

**ORIGINAL (artwork)-** a unique or one-off piece of art – usually the first version – created directly by an artist's hand or a tool controlled by their hand(s). A small, hand-pulled, numbered series of prints (lithographs, screenprints, woodcuts, etching, engraving, and lithographs) are considered original art.

Exhibitor Social Security Numbers ARE REQUIRED. The Kansas State Fair is a State-entity, and the State of Kansas requires the correct SSN for verification of premium payments

Giclee, inkjets, or other, machine-printed items are not considered original art except when used to print an artist's original digital creation onto paper or other substrates.

- No seminar pieces may be entered, unless otherwise noted. (A seminar art piece is defined as a piece of art created in an instructional setting with attendees all creating the same or similar pieces of artwork to learn a technique, style, or lesson.)
- Artwork must have been completed within the last year.
- Artwork may not have been previously exhibited at the Kansas State Fair.
- Artists must disclose if art or artwork was created using an Artificial Intelligence Generator

**AMATEUR** - You are considered an amateur artist if most of the following applies to you:

- You are currently enrolled in high school or college; or
- You regularly take art classes from professional instructors; or

- You do not show your art within commercial galleries; or
- You have not won awards in national or regional juried exhibitions; or
- Your income is not significantly impacted by the sale of your artwork; or
- You enter fewer than six juried exhibitions annually.

**PAINTING** - Applying paint, pigment, color, or other medium to a solid surface. The medium is commonly applied to the base with a brush, but other implements, such as knives, sponges, and airbrushes, can be used.

**DRAWING/PRINTMAKING** - (Drawing) Using instruments to mark paper or other two-dimensional surfaces. Instruments include graphite, inked brushes, colored pencils, crayons, charcoal, chalk, pastels, erasers, markers, styluses, and metals (such as silverpoint). (Printmaking) The process of creating artwork by printing, most commonly on paper, but also on fabric, wood, metal, and other surfaces. Printmaking processes have the capacity to produce identical multiples of the same work and are created using a hand-processed technique.

**Sculpture (3D)/Ceramics/Fiber Art** - (Sculpture) Three-dimensional art. Sculpture processes include but are not limited to carving, assembling, welding, modeling, molding, and casting. (Ceramics) Various hard, brittle, heat-resistant, and corrosion-resistant materials are made by shaping and then firing an inorganic, nonmetallic material, such as clay, at a high temperature. Common examples are earthenware, porcelain, and brick. (Fiber Art) Fine art whose material consists mainly of natural or synthetic fiber and other components such as fabric or yarn. It focuses on the materials and on the manual labor on the part of the artist as part of the works' significance and prioritizes aesthetic value over utility.

**Photography** - The art, application, and practice of creating durable images by recording light, either electronically by means of an image sensor or chemically by means of light-sensitive material such as photographic film. For this competition, photographs taken with a digital camera are acceptable, but significant digital modification is not allowed in this category. Acceptable modifications include but are not limited to cropping, resizing, and slight (20% or less) color correction.

**AI - Digital Arts/Digitally Manipulated Photography** - (*Digital Arts*) Artistic practice that uses digital technology as part of the creative or presentation process. (*Digitally Enhanced Photography*) Digitally editing a photograph no more than 20%. Some examples of digitally manipulated photography are: using digital filters, manipulating color, saturation, tone, or vibrance no more than 20% or in a manner that is not the natural or original color, pixelation, any photoshopping beyond basic edits (cropping, resizing, 20% or less color correction), erasure of elements in photograph, and recombination of images, excluding art created using an Artificial Intelligence Generator. (*AI Generated Photography*) refers to a form of photography that utilizes Artificial Intelligence software to either generate new images or enhance images that mimic real photography. All photography must be your own work. Copy right law are to be followed. Any photos using AI generated software or digitally enhanced over the 20% allowance must be entered in the Fine Arts Department.

**Mixed Media** - Artwork in which more than one differing medium or material has been employed. Assemblages, collages, and certain sculptures are three common examples.

**Jewelry/Metalsmithing** - (Jewelry) Decorative items worn for personal adornment, such as brooches, rings, necklaces, earrings, pendants, bracelets, and cufflinks. Jewelry may be attached to the body or the clothes. Jewelry often contains precious metals in combination with gemstones or other materials such as shells. (Metalsmithing) The process of creating jewelry through the manipulation of various metals. Manipulations include forming and shaping, sawing, doming, fold-forming, drilling, soldering, texturing, stamping, and more.

#### GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL RULES

1. DEADLINE DATES: All exhibitors are required to submit their entries online by the deadline date of **August 1, 2026**.

Assistance for online entries is available during regular business hours only. (Monday – Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) by calling the competitive office at 620-669-3621.

2. **REQUIRED EXHIBITOR FEES:** ALL exhibitors are required to pay a \$1.00 processing fee per person as well as a \$1.00 per item entry fee. **Exhibitor Social Security Numbers ARE REQUIRED.** The KSF is a State-entity, and the State of Kansas requires the SSN for verification of premium payments.
3. **ENTRIES/LATE ENTRIES:** Entries will be accepted online at [www.kansasstatefair.gov](http://www.kansasstatefair.gov), beginning May 1, 2026. Entries will be accepted after August 1, 2026, in accordance with the following schedule: **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER AUGUST 19, 2026.**
  - August 2 (12:01 a.m.) to August 15 (11:59 p.m.) - \$5.00 late fee, per exhibitor.
  - August 16 (12:01 a.m.) to August 19 (11:59 p.m.) - \$25.00 late fee, per exhibitor.
  - No entries will be accepted after August 19 (11:59 p.m.)
4. An exhibitor may enter one (1) item per class, unless noted differently.
5. Exhibitors have up to 15 minutes to arrange, display or touch-up their exhibit upon arrival, prior to checking in.
6. Exhibits cannot be prepared or assembled on-site, unless it is a “real time” contest, and it is stated in the rules. Department Managers or Competitive Exhibit Coordinator have the right to disqualify an entry or exhibit if anyone, other than the exhibitor, has prepared it. **ALL WORK MUST BE THAT OF THE EXHIBITOR.**
7. Displayed exhibits may be limited – KSF reserves the right to only display what room allows. Any item not being displayed will have designated pick-up times. First place through third place is guaranteed to be shown. Every effort will be made to display ALL items entered in the fair.
8. Any item that does not meet Kansas State Fair requirements will not be accepted. If an item is accepted due to oversight, it may later be disqualified and/or not judged or displayed.
9. During check-in, a Kansas State Fair staff member may question if you entered your item properly, if it is obvious the item may not meet the class requirements. If an exhibitor is not sure if the item(s) are entered properly, they must ask a staff member for assistance **BEFORE** the item is checked in. This process can only be done during receiving hours and at the request of the exhibitor. If you question the class entered, and the Department Manager can justify the error, it may be moved to the proper class. Once an item has been checked in, **IT CANNOT BE MOVED**, without the prior approval of the Competitive Exhibit Coordinator. Check-in finalizes your entry. Kansas State Fair does not allow any item substitutions. If an item is entered into an incorrect category, it may be disqualified by a judge.
10. Entries will not be entered or judged in “Any Other Items” or “Not Specified” class if another class for that item is available.
11. All exhibits must have been created, grown, or harvested by the exhibitor during the season of current year unless otherwise stated. All creative items must have been completed since the 2025 Kansas State Fair (Since September 20, 2025).
12. If a “real-time” contest has fewer than two entered contestants, the contest may be changed to allow walk-up entries, with the approval of the KSF Competitive Exhibit Coordinator and sponsor (if the Division is sponsored).
13. After arrangements of exhibits for prizes, no change will be allowed except for authority from KSF Competitive Exhibit Coordinator.
14. Our primary audience consists of family and youth. We reserve the right to reject any entry that may be considered objectionable by that audience.
15. Youth Division: Youth exhibitors must be 18 or under as of January 1 of current year. Youths MAY enter the Youth Division and again in any other division for which they qualify.
  - a. Senior Division: Senior exhibitors must be 65 or over as of January 1 of the current year. Senior exhibitors MAY enter the Senior Division and again in any other division for which they qualify.

- b. Entering in a specific age division does not exclude entry into other divisions for which they qualify.
- 16. A brief description of your item when entering online (as to color, size or pattern, brand) is required.
- 17. For the protection of the exhibitor, claim stubs are required at the time of release for items. If you do not have a claim stub, items **will not** be released to anyone other than the exhibitor with proper ID.
- 18. Each article in a collection or plural exhibit must show the exhibitor's name and class of competition.
- 19. All exhibits will receive the best care and protection in their surroundings. The exhibits are subject to owner's risk and in no event will the Kansas State Fair, KSF staff, or volunteers be responsible for any damage which may occur. Delicately constructed items requiring more than normal careful handling should not be submitted. All exhibits will be displayed at the discretion of the KSF Staff.
- 20. The Kansas State Fair reserves the right to cancel any class or place if the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition or an award is not merited.
- 21. Participants will not have access to their items once they have been received by the Kansas State Fair staff.
- 22. Release/Pick-up dates will be listed in the department handbooks. Any Exhibitor who does not claim their exhibit during the listed times will be required to make an appointment with the Competitive Exhibits Coordinator for release of their exhibit. Perishable items (food) and plants will be discarded and/or donated immediately following the Fair. Non-perishable items not claimed by October 15, of the current year, will be discarded.
- 23. **All** Division Champions and Reserve Champions will receive a Rosette.
- 24. The Kansas State Fair reserves the right to cancel, eliminate, or change the published premium amounts due to lack of sponsorship.
- 25. If, at the Judge's discretion, an entry does not merit a placement, the Judge shall give no award under any circumstances. The rule applies whether there are one or more exhibits in the class. If a tie occurs in any division or class, a judge will determine the winner.
- 26. When attending the Kansas State Fair, you enter an area where photography, audio, and video recording may occur. By entering the Fairgrounds, you consent to such recording media and its release to be used for news, telecasts, web casts, promotional purposes, advertising, social media, and websites. You further waive all rights you may have to any claims in connection with publication *of these materials, regardless of the purpose or sponsoring of such publication.*
- 27. No duplicate samples for exhibition will be admitted in any class, with the following exception: duplicate exhibits from any one farm will be considered if the exhibits are from separate parcels of ground.

**SHIPPING:**

SHIPPED ITEMS

Shipping charges on all exhibits must be prepaid. Packages should be addressed to: Kansas State Fair, ATTN: (*Fine Arts, Clothing, etc*) Department, 2000 N. Poplar, Hutchinson, KS 67502 and *must* arrive by August 23, 2026. A copy of your entry receipt should also be included in your package with your pre-registered items. Please make sure all items are labeled in a manner that can be removed before judging (a note attached by a rubber band, twist tie, masking tape, safety pin, etc.)

ITEMS TO BE RETURNED

Nonperishable item(s) will be shipped back at the exhibitor's request and expense after the fair and in its original packaging. **A Prepaid shipping label must be included with the original packaging, along with any special instructions.** Additional insurance must be included on the Prepaid Shipping Label. KSF will not add additional value to any shipment.

You may now submit your item on canvas (no raw edges & must be ready to hang). Items cannot exceed 8" x 10".

**MUST BE FRAMED** - Frames and stretchers only. - **Do not exceed 40" in any direction, including frame.** Must have wire or eyes for hanging. Do not use nails on hangers or masking tape. No single mats or heavy pieces.

Stretcher canvas edges must be finished, with no raw edges. Canvas boards may also be framed. Entries can be matted within a frame. If needed, Giclée definitions are provided at the beginning of the section.

## OPEN CLASSES

Plein Aire Art (Artistry at the Fair) is open to all professional and amateur artists 18 years of age and older. Paintings, drawings, sculptures, collages.

Sessions will take place on Friday, September 11 and Saturday, September 12, 2026. You must register with the Professional Arts Department. There is a \$10 fee per entry for Plein Aire Art.

## Division 400 – Amateur Art Poster

The theme for the 2026 Amateur Art Poster is “Happy 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday, America”. We want to see your creativity and vision by creating a poster featuring the 250<sup>th</sup> Birthday of the United States of America.

**Premiums awarded for this division are 1<sup>st</sup> - \$100, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$75, 3<sup>rd</sup> - \$25. One Merit Award (\$10) will be awarded in this Division.**

### Requirements:

- **One entry per exhibitor. All work must be that of the exhibitor.**
- Must be an amateur artist. Individuals only. No group entries
- Poster needs to be on a 30” x 20”, 1/4” White Foam Board (available at Dollar Tree)
- Poster must have a vertical display.
- Any medium. Entire board must be covered.
- Kansas State Fair Logo **cannot** be included on the poster.
- All entries must be pre-registered with the Kansas State Fair.
- Exhibits will only be accepted during the Kansas State Fair’s scheduled receiving times in the Fine Arts Dept. \*No exceptions will be made.

– Frames and Stretchers Only – No Mats (Matting within a frame is acceptable). **Do not exceed 40” in any direction, including frame.** No heavy frames or heavy glass are allowed. **MUST BE FRAMED.**

**No blood is to be depicted on any of the artwork.**

Stretcher Canvas edges must be finished, with no raw edges. If needed, Giclée definitions are provided at the beginning of the section.

- Sets must be entered together in Division #403 \*The below classes are only for a single piece.
- Need to bring plate holders, stands for dolls, jewelry holders, or easels for plates, bowls, plaques, etc.
- If an exhibit entered in any antique category places, it cannot be entered again for 3 years. On the 4th year after winning, this same item can now be brought back to exhibit.
- Entries will not be judged if entered in other than their specified category.
- The following are considered one (single) item. Ex: cup and saucer, sugar and creamer, salt and peppers, matching candlesticks, etc.

- If an exhibit entered in any antique category places, it cannot be entered again for 3 years. On the 4th year after winning, this same item can now be brought back to exhibit.

## Division 404 – Barn Quilts

**A "barn quilt" is a quilt pattern painted onto plywood for outdoor display. Generally bright colors and geometric shapes are used when creating your pattern. These traits are what set it apart from ordinary decoration.**

- Appearance: Pleasing to look at; Clean, neat, unnoticeable pencil marks; No smudges or voids
- Creativity: Appropriate choice of pattern for a barn quilt; Added your own spin to the pattern; Choice of color
- Workmanship: All corners meet; all points are sharp; Difficulty of pattern; No bubble or paint ridges.

## **DECORATIVE ARTS**

Remember.....signature cannot be apparent. If signed, signatures must be covered.

Decorative Painting - This is a teachable form of art which is considered a learned skill. Decorative painters generally have no previous or known painting skills prior to learning it as a skill. Entries may be painted on any usable surface or object, using any painting medium, including oils, acrylics, watercolor, textile/fabric paint, glass paint, and colored pencils. Drawing and/or design skills are an advantage but not required. Entries may be painted individually or in a class with an instructor. All paintings must be exclusively by the artist.

- Dry mount or on an 8" x 10" foam board is recommended - but not required.
- ONLY 8" x 10" photos will be accepted. A matted photo will be allowed in an 11" x 14" mat. Photos must remain at the original 8" x 10" size. Photos must be securely mounted in pre-cut opening mat (not poster board). Hangers will be provided. \*\*\*NO FRAMES. Mat can be of any color.
- No collages.
- Print **MUST BE** on photo paper. **Not Metallic.**
- No adding or subtracting items within photos. No photo-shopping!
- Ask yourself, if we showed your photo to a thousand people, where would their eyes go first?
- No Canvas Photos
- Please refer to definitions in the front of this handbook.

\*\*\*We judge your "photo", not what you took the photo with or the color of your mat. Any camera, cellphone or tablet is allowed.
