Entries are subject to the Kansas State Fair General Information and Rules

Kansas Angus Association will present awards to the Grand and Reserve Grand Champion bulls and females and to the

champion cow/calf pair.

- 1. There must be more than one exhibitor in a class to pay more than one premium placing.
- 2. The American Angus Association contribution will be included in exhibitor premium money checks. A minimum of fifty head must be shown to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year. Premiums from The Association are paid by registration number. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal for inspection at the show. Any animal which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate upon check in is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible tattoo, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
- 3. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroids, growth stimulants or artificial filling internally. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed. For an exhibitor to be eligible at shows for premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association, each exhibitor is subject to Part 3, Association Rules Section IX: Eligibility,

"Conformation and Structure of Animals Presented for Exhibition" – an overview. Included in this is rule 11: Effective July 1, 2004, at any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas. After July 1, 2004, all shows, open and junior, where the American Angus Association participates with financial support will be governed by this rule.

- 4. DNA FOR PARENTAGE VERIFICATION. Under the Association Rules each animal for which entry application (registration) is received, may be subjected to a DNA marker type or blood test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under Association Rules Part 3, Section 11, Rule 2 (F). Staff of the American Angus Association must supervise the collection of blood samples. Animals are often sampled at shows, fairs or events where the American Angus Association contributes premiums or where Association personnel participate. If a recorded parent is excluded (as a parent) as a result of blood type, the owner may request, at his own expense, the Association to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine the sire and dam disqualifies the animal's eligibility in the Angus Herd book, and the registration certificate becomes null and void.
- 5. Fans in each aisle must blow the same direction. Each aisle will blow opposite directions; direction will be designated by show officials. NO free standing, aisle fans or portable coolers are allowed.

OPEN CLASS

PARTICIPATION STATEMENT

AMERICAN ANGUS ASSOCIATION

- The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, MO, 64506 will participate in premiums offered for open class Angus breeding cattle classes according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.
- 2. A minimum of fifty head must be shown in the open class division to receive American Angus Association premium participation for the following year.
- Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is a part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of premiums. The Association does not pay on championship or any group classes, (i.e. get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire or breeder six-head).
- 4. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate, is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.
- 5. Any female shown with calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check in.
- 6. Only one person at a time shall lead animals into the show ring.
- Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800 - 810. <u>www.angus.org</u>.
- 8. Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.
- 9. At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated make up areas.
- 10. All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.
- 11. Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

* Exception to class 32: Cattle bred-and-owned by either a spouse, legal children, brothers, sisters or parents may be included; provided the exhibitor is an individual or married couple identified by member code.

**Cow/Calf pairs show in class #17 & #18 are not eligible to show in Class #1 -Special Cow/Calf Class. Any female that qualifies for standard classes is not eligible to show in this class. Entries in Cow/Calf Class are not eligible for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion female.

Class #1 Payout: Special Cow/Calf Class Cows exhibited in this class may not be entered or exhibited in any other class. However, the calf may be entered in the open show with correct entry and entry fee. This is a Jackpot event within each breed. An entry fee of \$25 per pair will be charged and 80% of the entry fee will be paid back in each breed: 1st, 40%; 2nd, 30%; 3rd, 20%; 4th,10%. The other 20% will be used as pen fee. There may be two classes per breed. Classes to be divided after animals are checked in at the Superintendent's office. Animals may be clipped and groomed. Cow/calf pairs that are part of a regular show herd can be stalled with that show herd. The cow calf pairs that are not part of a regular show herd will be stalled in special cow calf alley in the Beef Annex. Calves by side of Dam can be entered in their correct class in the open Angus Show. Calves must be registered, with legible tattoos per registration certificate. Calf registration certificate must be available for inspection at the State Fair.
