ENTRY FEE: \$2.00 per head Open Show and \$3.00 per head Open & Junior Combined

RELEASE TIME: After Exhibitor Meeting and Awards

1. All entries must meet the Kansas State Fair General Rules and Health Requirements.
2. Dairy Goats will not be admitted into reserved pen area in the Dairy Goat barn before 10:00 am, Friday, September 18, and must be in place and **checked in no later than 7:00 pm, Friday, September 18.**
3. Check-in for Youth & Open Dairy Goats will start following the Celebrity Milking Contest and end at 7:00 PM. No late check-in allowed. No substitutions or changes of any kind will be allowed after check in.
4. Show sanctioned by American Dairy Goat Association. Only ADGA registered animals may be shown. ADGA and Kansas State Fair rules shall govern the show.
5. Junior and Senior doe shows are separately sanctioned.
Breeds sanctioned: Alpine, La Mancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, Sable, Toggenburg, Recorded Grades and will be shown in that order, not subject to change.
6. The date for computing age will be the first day of the show.
7. The original Registration Certificate **MUST** be presented to the Show Secretary for examination at check-in time. The original Registration Certificate, a stamped duplicate application or a stamped faxed duplicate application showing date received by ADGA office will be accepted for animals under six months of age. There must be a physical paper copy of all paperwork. Digital copies will not be accepted.
8. Goats registered under a singular farm name or goats that are all registered by immediate family members can be considered a single exhibitor for Premier Exhibitor Award, Breeder Award, and Group classes. Please clarify this at check-in with superintendents.
9. Group classes are limited to 2 entries per herd (herd having the same distinction from above) per class. All animals shown in group classes must be shown in their respective age and breed class.
10. Substitutions will be allowed at check-in. Animals can be substituted but total entries must remain the same for the breeder or herd. Ex. 1 Jr Alpine for 1 Sr Saanen
11. Group Classes: Registration certificates for all animals entered in any group class must be available for the animals. Failure to present the registration certificate for any animal entered in a group, if requested by the superintendent, will automatically disqualify the group for that class.

If you think you want to do the group classes, enter them. There is no charge for these classes.

- a. Junior Get of Sire – 3 Jr Does sired by the same buck.
 - i. Enter under buck's name
 - b. Mother/Daughter – Doe and her daughter
 - i. Enter under dam's name
 - c. Produce of Dam – 2 Does from the same dam
 - i. Enter under dam's name
 - d. Senior Get of Sire – 3 Sr Does sired by the same buck and in milk
 - i. Enter under buck's name
 - e. Breeder's Trio – 3 Does Bred and Owned by the Same Herd or Breeder
 - i. Enter under herd or breeder's name
 - f. Dairy Herd – 4 Does Owned by the Same Herd and all in Milk
 - i. Enter under herd or breeder's name
 - g. Kansas Dairy Herd
 - i. Only Kansas Herds or Breeders may enter this class. Only 1 Entry per herd or breeder. The dairy herd should consist of 5 does total with 3 Sr Does & 2 Jr Does. All breeds will be combined, and the dairy herd can be made up of multiple breeds. Class will follow the selection of Sr BDIS on Sunday.
12. Every Dairy Goat must be properly fitted for show and be provided with a collar, or a chain –unless other arrangements have been previously discussed. All exhibitors must be neatly and properly dressed (preferably in white) while in the show ring.
 13. Pens will be assigned by the Dairy Goat Superintendent. The pens are 5 feet by 5 feet in size. No more than two senior, standard does or four junior, standard does are allowed to be stalled in one pen.
 14. FEED AND BEDDING: Initial straw bedding is provided by the Kansas State Fair. Any change of bedding is at the expense of the exhibitor. Any exhibitor may bring in feed and forage for their use during the Fair. All aisles shall always be kept open – if this is an issue, please notify the superintendents.
 15. Youth entered in the youth show will also be entered in the open show.
 16. Kindness and patience are needed when asking questions and receiving answers. We will work to be respectful as well, but if unkind messages, verbal or written, are received, it is subject to dismissal and banning from the competition at the Kansas State Fair. Please read all livestock rules in entirety if any questions arise.

JUNIOR DOE SHOW: The Junior Doe Show consists of does fewer than 24 months of age that are not in milk and have never freshened.

SENIOR DOE SHOW: The Senior Doe Show consists of does that have freshened or are in milk. A Best Udder will be judged and selected in each class. Any doe 24 months of age or over that has never freshened shall not be shown unless she is in milk.

ADDITIONAL YOUTH RULES

1. Dairy goats must be in the name of the youth only.
2. ADGA youth must be under 21 years old.
3. Youth Show Sanctioned as Sr/Jr Combined for the following breeds: Alpine, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, All Other Purebred and Recorded Grade. Animals will show in that order. Not subject to change.
4. Showmanship will start at 8:00 AM on Saturday.
 - a. Senior + : 19-21 years
 - b. Senior: 14 – 18 years
 - c. Intermediate: 10 – 13 years
 - d. Junior: 6 – 9 years
 - e. Peewee: Under 6
5. Youth can sign-up for showmanship at check-in. Please note the order of showmanship so the showman and their goat can be ringside at an appropriate time.
6. Please consider bringing your doe in-milk early enough to be used in the Celebrity Milking Goat Contest. If you are willing, please notify a Dairy Goat Superintendent.
