Exhibitor Social Security Numbers ARE REQUIRED. The KSF is a State entity, and the State of Kansas requires the SSN for verification of premium payments.

GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL RULES

1. DEADLINE DATES: All exhibitors are required to submit their entries online by the deadline date of **August 1, 2023**. Assistance for online entries is available during regular business hours only. (Monday – Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.) by calling the fair office at 620-669-3626.
2. REQUIRED EXHIBITOR FEES: ALL exhibitors are required to pay a \$1.00 processing fee per person as well as a \$1.00 per item entry fee.
3. ENTRIES/LATE ENTRIES: Entries will be accepted beginning June 1, 2023. Entries will be accepted after August 1, 2023, in accordance with the following scheduled: **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER AUGUST 23, 2023.**

August 2 (12:01 a.m.) to August 15 (11:59 p.m.) - \$5.00 late fee, per exhibitor.

August 16 (12:01 a.m.) to August 23 (11:59 p.m.) - \$25.00 late fee, per exhibitor. No entries will be accepted after August 23 (11:59 p.m.)

4. An exhibitor can enter one (1) item per class, unless noted differently.
5. Exhibitors will have up to 15 minutes to arrange, display or touch-up their exhibit upon arrival, prior to check in. Exhibits cannot be prepared or assembled on-site, unless it is a “real time” contest, and it is stated in the rules. Department Managers have the right to disqualify an entry or exhibit if anyone, other than the exhibitor, has prepared it. **ALL WORK MUST BE THAT OF THE EXHIBITOR.**
6. Displayed exhibits may be limited – KSF reserves the right to only display what room allows. Any item not being displayed will have designated pick-up times. First place through third place is guaranteed to be shown. Every effort will be made to display ALL items entered in the fair.
7. Any item that does not meet Kansas State Fair requirements will not be accepted. If an item is accepted in oversight, it may later be disqualified and/or not judged or displayed.
8. During check-in, a Kansas State Fair staff member may question if you entered your item properly, but only if it is obvious that the item may not meet the class requirements. If an exhibitor is not sure if they entered their item(s) properly, they must ask a staff member for assistance **BEFORE** the item is checked in. This process can only be done during receiving hours and at the request of the exhibitor. If you question the class entered, and the Department Manager can justify the error, it may be moved to the proper class. Once an item has been checked-in, **IT CANNOT BE MOVED**, without the prior approval of the Competitive Exhibit Coordinator. Check-in finalizes your entry. Kansas State Fair does not allow any item substitutions.
9. Entries will not be judged in “Any Other Items” or “Not Specified” class, if there is already a class for that item available.
10. All exhibits must have been created, grown or harvested by the exhibitor during the season of current year unless otherwise stated. All creative items must have been completed since the 2021 Kansas State Fair (Since September 20, 2021).
11. If a “real-time” contest has fewer than two entered contestants, the contest may be changed to allow walk-up entries, with the approval of the KSF Competitive Exhibit Coordinator and sponsor, if any.
12. After arrangements of exhibits for prizes, no change will be allowed except on authority from KSF Competitive Exhibit Coordinator.
13. Our primary audience consists of family and youth. We reserve the right to reject any entry that may be considered objectionable by that audience.
14. Youth Division: Youth exhibitors must be 18 or under as of January 1, current year. Youths cannot enter in the youth division and again in another division in the same class.
Adult Division: Adult exhibitors must be 18 as of January 1 of the current year.
15. A brief description of your item when entering on-line (as to color, size or pattern, brand) is appreciated.
16. For the protection of the exhibitor, claim stubs are encouraged at the time of release for items. If claim stub is lost, you must have a valid photo ID to claim the items.
17. Each article in a collection or plural exhibit must show the exhibitor’s name and class of competition.
18. All exhibits will receive the best care and protection in their surroundings. The exhibits, at times, are subject to owner’s risk and in no event will the Kansas State Fair, KSF staff, or volunteers be responsible for any damage that may occur. Delicately constructed items requiring more than normal careful handling should not be submitted. All exhibits will be displayed at the discretion of the KSF Staff.
19. The Kansas State Fair reserves the right to cancel any class or placing if the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition or an award is not merited.
20. Participants will have no access to their products once they have been received by the Kansas State Fair staff.
21. **All** Division Champions and Reserve Champions will receive a Rosette.
22. The Kansas State Fair reserves the right to cancel, eliminate, or change the published premium amounts due to lack of sponsorship.

23. If, at the Judge's discretion, an entry does not merit a placing, the Judge shall give no award under any circumstances. The rule applies whether there is one or more exhibits in the class.
24. When attending the Kansas State Fair, you enter an area where photography, audio, and video recording may occur. By entering the Fairgrounds, you consent to such recording media and its release to be used for news, telecasts, web casts, promotional purposes, advertising, social media, and websites. You further waive all rights you may have to any claims in connection with publication of these materials, regardless of the purpose or sponsoring of such publication.
25. *Competitive exhibition is open to all registered Boy Scouts/ Girl Scouts in good standing. Classification for entries will go by Scouts registration rank from September 2021, through August 2022.*
26. *Exhibit articles must have been made by the exhibitor since the previous year's Fair and never previously exhibited at the Kansas State Fair, except for collections which may be exhibited more than once if new additions are made, labeled, and dated.*
27. *Food entries should include (6) samples of one variety. A typed recipe on 8 1/2" x 11" paper with name, address and phone number on bottom left corner must accompany each entry. Recipes become the property of the Kansas State Fair. All food entries should be in a sealed food container such as a storage bag or box.*
28. *Collection items need to be clearly labeled. Collections may be entered in consecutive years, provided new additions are labeled and dated. No item may be exhibited more than (2).*

SHIPPING:

SHIPPED ITEMS

Shipping charges on all exhibits must be prepaid. Packages should be addressed to: Kansas State Fair, ATTN: Agriculture Department, 2000 N. Poplar, Hutchinson, KS 67502 and must arrive by September 6. A copy of your entry receipt should also be included in your package with your pre-registered items. Please make sure all items are labeled in a manner that can be removed before judging (a note attached by a rubber band, twist tie, masking tape, safety pin, etc.)

ITEMS TO BE RETURNED

Nonperishable item(s) will be shipped back at the exhibitor's request and expense after the fair and in its original packaging. **A Prepaid shipping label must be included with the original packaging, along with any special instructions.** Additional insurance must be included on the Prepaid Shipping Label. KSF will not add additional value to any shipment.
