

Market Lamb Show

1. Market lambs may be wethers or ewes. Ram lambs or cryptorchids cannot show. All lambs must have their lamb teeth and will be mouthed at check-in.
2. A classifier will be hired for classification and acceptance of all lambs. All market lambs will be classified by breed into the proper breed classes - regardless of the breed designation on entry forms. The decision of the classifier is final.
3. Market lambs must weigh a minimum of ninety pounds (with no top weight limit) in order to show. Lambs will not be allowed to re- weigh once they have checked in. Exhibitors will declare weight for their lamb. Weight cards will be turned in at check in time. Any animal with a declared weight not meeting the minimum weight limit will not be allowed to show.
4. At the time of health check-in, all market lambs must be "slick shorn" with uniform wool length not to exceed .20 inch from the knee and hock joints up before arrival on the grounds, including the head. There will be no shearing of market animals or commercial ewes allowed on any part of the grounds. Touch-up clipping with scissors, hand shears or cordless clippers is allowed. No blocking/trim tables for sheep are permitted anywhere on the grounds. Violation will result in disqualification of animal.
5. No belly wool allowed.
6. No sheep head holders, single show rails or head stalls Blocking alley way.

Breeding Ewe Show

1. Registration or transfer papers for animals in the breeding classes must be in the sole name(s) of the exhibitor by July 1 of the current year. (Breeding ewes that are registered in a farm name or whose papers include the name of adults are not eligible to show.) Breeding sheep may be co-owned and co-registered by two or more Kansas 4-H or FFA members of the same family. The "flock tag" number of the animal must match the flock number on the registration papers.
2. The base date for determining age of registered breeding sheep is September 1.
3. Registered ewes must have ear tags as required by their respective breed associations. All ewes must have a scrapie tag.
4. No belly wool allowed.
5. Yearling ewes must be born between January 1 (previous year) and December 31, (previous year) Ewe lambs must be born after January 1, (current year). At the time of check in, ALL commercial ewes will be mouthed. Ewe lambs must have only baby teeth visible. Yearling ewes may be showing no more than two visible permanent incisors in wear.
6. Registered sheep for which a separate breed division is not established will be shown in the registered AOB class.
7. Registered Ewes will show first with a Champion and Reserve from each breed being selected. Commercial Ewes will show with Light, Middle and Heavy Divisions. The Champion and Reserve Commercial Ewe will be selected. Champion and Reserve winners compete in Supreme Drive.
8. No sheep head holders, single show rails or head stalls Blocking alley way.
