** Kendall County Fair Association ** Homestead Heritage Exhibit Hall History

The first exhibition hall was built in 1918 and had been the center stage of fair events and celebrations throughout the early years of the Kendall County Fair Association. A devastating misty early morning fire on Friday, February 17, 1984, completely burned the sixty-six-year-old building to the ground, along with a structure history, a wealth of Kendall County Fair memorabilia and mementos were destroyed. Burned also and never to be replaced were seventeen antique showcases that was stored inside the hall. With a plea from the association to the community for donations of fair memorabilia and mementos the association replaced many of the destroyed items lost in the fire. Only a few of the early president's pictures and catalogs have not been replaced along with selected fair mementos such as trophies, ribbons, and pictures. Shortly before the fire the exhibition hall had just gone under a remodel and was electrically re-wired. With the remodel complete the solid aged structure promised many more decades of usefulness. The actual cause of the fire has never been determined. With the help of association members, women's auxiliary, and community volunteers the now existing exhibition hall was built with donated funds and many volunteered hours. With all this effort and pride for the Kendall County Fair Association the newly built exhibition hall doors were opened for the 79th Annual Kendall County Fair on September 1st, 1984.

From the earliest days of the Kendall County Fair exhibition hall was and is the "Heart" of the annual fair. It continues to showcase the many talents of Kendall County citizens year after year. Each year the locals from all ages enter exhibits into judging competition against their fellow friends, neighbors and even family members for a chance to win a ribbon or the "Best of Division" Award for Best Overall Entry in divisions from baking to taxidermy or maybe the "Best of Show" Award chosen from the "Best of Division" winners or an "Honorable Mention". Showcases are brimful of fair memorabilia and mementos of the past and present. "The President's Wall" atop the showcase displays pictures of the association's presidents from 1949 to 2023. Selected walls throughout the hall display pictures of fair royalty, projects, and celebrations. A wall of plaques honoring association individuals is displayed listing their designated titles and years of service. The exhibit hall will be open daily and nightly with selected hours for fair visitors to enjoy the exhibits and take a trip down memory lane by viewing the history on display from the first exhibition hall to memorabilia of the Kendall County Fair Association since its first fair held in downtown Boerne on September 4th, 1905.

Scholarship Program

The Homestead Heritage Exhibit Hall Scholarship was established in 2008. The association became an IRS designated 501 (c) 3 Corporation in 1913 and the Exhibit Hall was a program under the tax exemption. The Homestead Heritage Exhibit Hall Scholarship was established to comply with the Mission and Vision statements of the association. Funded by donations, sponsorships and /or proceeds of raffles and other fundraising opportunities such as the annual garage sale and from donated premium money exhibitors donate back to the fund during the annual Kendall County Fair. The Scholarship Program is to financially assist high school graduating Seniors who are continuing their studies in any field. Any high school senior from Boerne High School, Champion High School, Comfort High School, Home School Program and/or Private School within the boundaries of Kendall County, Texas who are a candidate for high school graduation in the current year is encouraged to apply for the scholarship within the scholarship applicant criteria requirements. The first Homestead Heritage Exhibit Hall Scholarship(s) presented was in 2014 and has been presented annually except in the years 2020 and 2021 due to COVID-19 pandemic.

General Information, Rules and Regulations

1. Exhibitors must be from Kendall County or the surrounding trade area. (Trade area is defined as the area served by the Boerne, Fair Oaks, or Comfort school districts or those who participate in and consider themselves a part of the communications situated in Kendall County). In keeping the local trade area open only to local Kendall County residents the Kendall County Fair Association provides an opportunity for county residents to exhibit their skills and receive recognition for their achievements. No out of county residents will be allowed to enter an exhibit into any division and/or judging competition. Can enter exhibit(s) as "DISPLAY ONLY".

2. Every entry/exhibit in the Homestead Heritage Exhibit Hall entered for judging competition or for display purposes shall be under the control of the Kendall County Fair Association and while every possible precaution will be taken for the safekeeping of entries/exhibits the Kendall County Fair Association will in no case be responsible for damage, theft, breakage, or any type of loss which may occur from any cause. Exhibitor(s) accept the preceding conditions as set forth when their exhibits are entered and received for show during the fair.

3. All exhibitors must pay a \$5.00 entry fee before being assigned an exhibitor number. For record keeping exhibitor entry forms must provide the exhibitor's name and complete address. The exhibitor must provide telephone numbers for fair official/exhibitor contact. No information on the identity of the exhibitor will ever be used in any inappropriate manner. All names of exhibitors remain unidentified until judging process is complete and the "Best Of Division" award for the best overall outstanding entry in each division is awarded and the "Best Of Show" award is judged and awarded. "Best Of Show" award is chosen from all the "Best Of Division" winning entries from all divisions as a whole as well as the "Honorable Mention".

4.Entries/Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and shown in the exhibitors name. We desire to showcase the work of the past year in the exhibit hall from fiscal calendar year September 2022-2023 with the exception of article(s), item(s) that have never been entered or placed in judging competition in previous years. Any false statement in regard to any entry/exhibit shall be grounds to exclude the exhibitor from awards and future competition during the 2023 Kendall County Fair. 5. The Kendall County Fair Association, Inc. reserves the right to decline or reject any article(s), item(s) for entry /exhibit into the Homestead Heritage Exhibit Hall for judging competition or display purposes. Entry/Entries/Exhibits(s) must be clean in presentation and appearance and confirm to the division and class specifications listed in the 2023 Exhibitor Handbook. No miscellaneous classes for any entry/entries/exhibits. No competing against oneself in any division or class. Unclassified Entry Classes is allowed in noted Divisions or can be added to any Division under discretion of Division Chairman. The fair is a family event and the Kendall County Fair Association, Inc. reserves the right to determine content appropriate for family viewing therefore no nude or indecent entry/entries/exhibit(s) will be allowed to enter.

6. Division Chairman's will receive and place entries/exhibits in divisions with the help of fair members/volunteers. Division Chairman's have the care and complete supervision and are authorized to refuse, decline and/or reject any entry/entries/exhibit(s) in their designated division.

7.Dispute and protests not settled by the division chairman will be decided by the Kendall County Fair Association Exhibit Hall director in charge. If the dispute or protest is not resolved by the two named, the President of the Kendall County Fair Association will make the deciding and final decision.

8.Exhibitor age groups are as follows:

- Adult (age 18 Plus Years)
- Junior (age 13 through 17 Years)
- Youth age group A (Ages 4, 5, 6)
- Youth age group B (Ages 7, 8, 9)
- Youth age group C (Ages 10, 11, 12)

Some division are age group classified as "No Age Requirement".

9. All entries/exhibit(s) will be accepted as stated on the following pages with NO EXCEPTIONS!

- This is the ONLY date and time Art And Photography can be entered. **Saturday, August 26, 2023 From 9:00 A.M.-3:00 P.M.
- Judges Books Close At 3:00 P.M. On August 26, 2023 For All Art And Photography.
- No Art And Photography Can Be Entered On Thursday-August 31, 2023.
- 2. Early entry day: Non-perishable entries
- Exhibitors wanting to enter on Thursday-August 31, 2023 can complete the exhibitor application and be assigned an exhibitor number on Saturday, August 26, 2022 to avoid the rush on Thursday-August 31, 2023.
- 3. Regular entry day: For all non-perishable and perishable entries
- Thursday-August 31, 2023 from 8:00 am-5:00 pm
- 4. All exhibitors must pay a \$5.00 entry fee per exhibitor not per entry.
- 5. All exhibitors must be from Kendall County.
- 6. No professional or dealers will be allowed to enter exhibits.

7. Exhibit Hall hours:

- Closes at 5:00 pm for judging
- Friday, September 1, 2023, 5:00 pm 11:00 pm
- Saturday, September 2, 2023, 10:00 am 11:00 pm

- 8. Release day for exhibitor entries:
- Monday, September 4, 2023, 8:00 am 11:00 am
- All entries must be picked up on this date and during these hours.

9. No bicycles, skateboards, roller blades, shoe skaters or scooters allowed inside exhibit hall at any time. rule will be strictly enforced during Exhibit Hall hours.

10. No smoking or any tobacco products allowed in Exhibit Hall.

11. No pets (Except for Service Animals).

12. Exhibit Hall is wheelchair accessible., except for the restrooms.

"Enter Your Best"

Whether you enjoy hobbies, baking, art, crafts, collecting, or many other passions, there is likely a division in the 117th annual Homestead Exhibit Hall. We encourage anyone above the age of 4 with any skill level to enter their best work in one of the 19 divisions for judging competition.

"Best of Division"

The "Best of Division" award will be awarded to one 1st place entry within the division for each age group. If there are 3 age groups in a division, there will be 3 best of division awards.

"Honorable Mention"

The "Honorable Mention" award will be awarded to one 1st place entry within the division. The "Best of Division" Winner is not eligible for the "Honorable Mention" award.

"Best of Show"

The "Best of Show" award will be awarded to one "Best of Division" winner from the entire show. There is only 1 award given for "Best of Show".

Question & Answer

Question: Who Can Enter Exhibits?

Answer: Anyone who lives in Kendall County. You must be the owner of and the individual who grew, built, created or raised the exhibit you want to enter.

Question: What Does It Cost To Enter?

Answer: Each exhibitor must pay an entry fee of \$5.00 per exhibitor. (Not Per Exhibit).

Question: Can I Enter Exhibits In More Than One Division And Class In A Division?

Answer: Individuals are not limited to the number of divisions or classes in which they submit entries. However, if an individual enters more one entry in a division class this would be competing against one self and we strongly suggest this not to happen. Each division requires an individual entry form

Question: How Far In Advance Must I Enter An Exhibit?

Answer: Deadlines vary from individual divisions. Exhibit entry days for art and photography are as follows:

- Saturday, August 26, 2023 From 9:00 am 3:00 pm
- Please note this is the ONLY day Art and Photography can be entered
- Early entry day for Non-Perishable Entries is Saturday, August 26, 2023 from 9:00 am till 3:00 pm
- Regular entry day for all perishable and non-perishable, Thursday, August 31,2023 from 8:00 am till 5:00 pm

Question: I Have An Unusual Item That I Would Like To Enter, But Not Sure If It Will Be Accepted, What Do I Do?

Answer: We Welcome and encourage unusual items. We are limited to space so we ask you if you have an entry of unique collections and/or large scale item(s) to contact the fair office before entry day so we can work with you to see if we have the space and area to secure the entry.

Question: How Are Exhibits Judged?

Answer: The American Judging System is used for judging. Under the American System, the judges evaluate all exhibits in each division and class and select a first, second, and third place in each class of each division. From all the qualified first place winners in each class of each division the judges than pick a Best of Division. An Honorable Mention award will be awarded to one of the remaining 1st place winners in each division for each age group. A panel of Judges than pick a Best Of Show from the qualified Best Of Division winners.

Question: What Do I Do When I Bring My Exhibit To The Exhibit Hall?

Answer: After entering the Exhibit Hall go directly to the Exhibitor Entry table located at the front of the entrance to the Exhibit Hall and complete an Exhibitor Application. After completing you will directed to the area assigning entry numbers and collecting the exhibitor fee. After completing you now take your entry and entry number to the appropriate division. Volunteers are available for helping and directing you into the right direction.





16th Annual Applie Pie

Contest



They were oozing with fruity apples and flavor inside a flaky crust. The ingredients varied from regular flour to mixtures of apples along with sour cream, pralines, to fire ball whisky along with basic spices. The Homestead Heritage Exhibition hall was filled with the aroma of the pies entered in this year's contest from early morning when check in began.

A panel of judges tasted and rated the home baked pies using a scoring point system of 1-5, with 5 being the highest point. Pies were judged before the initial slicing on overall appearance for 15 points and 10 points for creativity. After slicing the pies, they were judged on the crust for 20 points, 25 points for the filling and 30 points for flavor. After tallying the scores, the results were announced giving three local bakers bragging rights for the next year for baking the Best Apple Pie in Kendall County. Winners were presented with cash premiums along with a rosette placement ribbon.

Official Rules for the Apple Pie Contest:

- 1. Open to all residents of Kendall County, except for professional bakers.
- 2. As long as a different recipe is used, more than one pie can be entered by exhibitor.
- 3. Entry Fee is \$5.00 per pie entered.
- 4. Pie(s) must be homemade from scratch, to include filling and crust.
- 5. Pie(s) must be freshly baked in a 9"inch disposable baking tin.
- 6. Pie(s) must be 100% apples. No other fruits or ingredients.
- 7. No store bought canned apple pie filling or store bought pie shells or rolled crust allowed.
- 8. Pie(s) must be crusted and /or crumb crusted topping.
- 9. Pie(s) recipe(s) must be typed, printed or legible hand writing on a 5"x 8" index card. a. All ingredients must be listed and entrants name must not be listed on index card.

Official Rules for the Apple Pie Contest - Con't:

- 10. Check in Pie(s) and recipe from 8:00 am till 10:00 am on Sunday, September 3, 2022 at the Exhibit Hall Office.
- 11. Judging begins at 2:00 pm and is open to the public.
- 12. A panel of judges will use a scoring scale point system of:
 - a. 1 through 5, with 5 being the highest point
 - b. A perfect score is 100.
 - c. Before slicing, pie(s) will be judged on:
 - i. Overall appearance for 15 points
 - ii. Creativity for 10 points.
 - d. After slicing sliced they will be judged on crust for 20 points, 25 points for filling and 30 points for flavor. Scoring will be sole responsibility of the judges and the judge's results will be final. Judges score sheets will be available to entrants upon request after contest is over and winner s have been announced.
- 13. All entrants are asked to attend a Group Contestant Picture after the contest.
- 14. All entrants are asked to donate their pie(s) for public tasting after the contest. This is not a mandatory request and any entrant can opt out of request.
- 15. First Place-\$75.00, Second Place-\$50.00 and Third Place-\$25.00 Plus a Rosette Ribbon for each placement.

4th Annual Salsa Contest

- 4. Salsa must be homemade from scratch. All entries will be refrigerated until judging and People's Choice judging.
- 5. Exhibitor can entered more than one salsa into contest as long as it uses a different recipe.
- 6. Recipe used must be entered with the entry. Recipe must be typed or legibly hand written, or printed on ingredient list form. Exhibitors name should not be listed on ingredient form.
- 7. Salsa entry must be in clean pint mason jars. Lids must be rust free.
- 8. Exhibitor is required to submit 2 pint mason jars of Salsa. (Must be in Mason Jars). 1 pint for judging. 1 pint for the People's Choice Judging. Only mason jars will be returned to exhibitor after close of contest. For food safety reasons all salsa not consumed during judging will be disposed of.
- 9. Salsa jars entered for judging will be labeled with the entry number only.


