Finance Committee - Lucas Espericueta, Chairperson

Lucas- The cash position continues to be strong with a cash balance of \$5,904,878.53. The cash balance for March 2021 was \$2,168,703.77. Deferred Charges of \$1,045,103.53 are Deferred Outflow of Resources Pension part of the GASB 68 that were adjusted in September and backdated December 31, 2020, which means there will be no adjustments in 2021. There is Deferred Income of \$23,500.00 that consist of payments made for upcoming events. Unclaimed Property is uncashed, stale dated checks \$153,805.44 with no change from June 2021. We had a Depreciation Expense for March which was \$18,722.27, for a profit of \$1,157.15. Revenue for March is \$250,153.09. Total Operating Expenses for March is \$230,273.67 for an operating profit of \$19,879.42. All revenue was receipted from Pacific Coast entry fees and Non-Fair Rental Operation, which also includes revenue from KC Marketplace, Building and Grounds rental, Equipment rental, Food Concessions, Cell Tower Revenue, and Parking Revenue. Overall, The Kern County Fair and Event Center Has been steadily increasing its revenue and continues to be in a stable position with a forecast for another successful year for 2022.

Ned- Is there a way we can just check into the stale dated checks instead of having them just sitting there? Can the state just take it?

Mike- The state can't take it because the checks are on our books and not the states. I will see what we can do to find some of the people to reissue checks.

Ned-Yes, that way they can be removed and not sitting on that account.

Electrical upgrade for Livestock moving forward and bids will go out soon. New electrical outlets and power for Beef, Dairy, Sheep and Goat Barns. Working the grass areas with weed and feed. Adding grass seeds. Preparing grass area for multiple events. New equipment, forklifts, water truck and tractor all working great.

The staff are taking good care of the equipment. Waiting for New Bobcat, golf carts and utility vehicles that are on order. California Construction Authority (CCA) starting the bid process to take down the Gazebo in the Main Plaza. CCA meeting to discuss a new roof for administration building. Holes and leaks. a. F2022-04 Poultry Health Inspection

Mike-This memo from CDFA requests that all poultry be inspected for symptoms of disease or illness by a certified Poultry Health Inspector from the CDFA/UC Certification Program. Biosecurity practices need to be in place to minimize risk of spreading Avian Diseases for Poultry Show by Exhibition Organizers and Poultry Exhibitors. This is required for all fairs. There is a grant funding through the USDA, which will reimburse for actual expenses incurred up to \$300.00 per fiscal year. In order to be reimbursed we will have to submit invoices and backup documentation which I will submit at the end of Fair.
