Director Espericueta – The corrected May financials are corrected and presented to you today. The 6/30/2020 are the most recent. The memo from Diane, dated 6/8/2020, was a good month where we thought we were coming out of this scary time. There was some revenue getting generated. The swap meets were open and we were getting some money in to help. The loans that were received and the payout from the AB-1499 helped us a bit. We actually had a good current standing and a working capital perspective. We are currently at a net of \$744,000 of cash in the form of several bank accounts. We had a solid interim income of \$399,000 for the month of June from the renting out of the facilities for the COVID testing and the swap meet. We had a net profit for the month of June of \$161,000. Cash reserves are sitting pretty good.

#### **Old Business**

a. Review and Discussion regarding the consideration of whether or not to cancel the 2020 Kern County Fair.

CEO Olcott – I've been speaking with the County Health Department and of course they are suggesting we follow the states guidelines, which we do. The Fair wouldn't be allowed to open unless we go into stage 4, which we are currently going backwards back into stage 2. Our numbers are going backwards very quickly. Things don't look as good as they did back in June. I don't see any way we can go forward like we hoped we could.

Director Dunphy – This is being brought up because we need to make a decision because we need to be able to cancel contracts in a timely manner. Its very doubtful that anywhere in the state will be open and be at a stage 4.

CEO Olcott – We were very hopeful when we heard that Disneyland was going to open, but then they pulled back and changed their opening plan.

Director Dunphy – What were we at last week? 400?

CEO Olcott – We were around 700 positive cases in Kern County.

Director Dunphy – We need to just pull the band-aid.

#### **CEO Report**

The Network of Fairs continues to work with the elected officials to lobby for funding. The next round of stimulus funding is hopefully coming in the next couple weeks. Almost all of the fairgrounds in California have been activated and are being used for emergency services with little to no funding, while fairs continue to keep employees and continue to maintain the property. I encourage the public to contact their local politicians to emphasize how important funding is not only for the Kern County Fair but also the California Network of Fairs.

Currently there is \$40 million dollars in the state budget reserved for those fairs that are in the layoff process. The funds are to be used for leave balances, payroll and unemployment insurance. CDFA has yet to roll out the complete details of how to receive these funds, but all of us should be receiving information soon.

CFSA has reassessed our General Liability and we will be receiving a reduction in our payments of \$1,000 a month. They also have reassessed our Workers Compensation and we will be receiving a reduction in payments of about \$7,600 a month.

CalHR has directed that all permanent staff will have a reduction in pay of 9.23%. Depending on the classification of the employee, certain deductions and additions were included on their midmonth checks.
