A. Mural Ingram Historical Murals

Tom Moore Lumber, 112 TX-39

Original Artist: Jack Feagan, 1989

Sixteen mural 'snapshots' of local history of the West Kerr area that are over 20 years old. Fifteen 12-feet by 12-feet murals are mounted along the Hwy. 39 side of the building, while the large piece, 76 feet long and eight feet wide faces Hwy. 27 and can be found on both sides of the T.J. Moore Lumber Company at the "Y" in Ingram.

B. Sculpture Stonehenge II and Easter Island Replicas – Sculptures

Hill Country Arts Foundation Campus, 120 Point Theatre Rd S Artists: *Al Shepperd & Doug Hill, 1990*

An art project erected by Al Shepperd and his neighbor Doug Hill, the finished Stonehenge project is 90% as wide and 60% the height of the original. The Easter Island heads are 13' tall and built two years after the completion of Stonehenge.

C. Rising Star Masonic Lodge – Mural

Artist: *Jack Faegan*


Jack Faegan is known for sharing his western art murals throughout the hill country. This is his first using technology to create a longer lasting full color wrap application.

E. The Iron Camel – *Sculpture* Camp Verde Store, 285 Camp Verde Rd E

This statue represents when Camp Verde was one of the area's the United States Army used to experiment using camels for supply transport and other military purposes in 1856. The animals passed every test of their ability traveling longer and carrying heavier loads than mules and horses. However, the Fort was deactivated in 1869 ending the experiment.

1. "Welcome To Kerrville" – *Mural* Kerrville Convention & Visitors Bureau, 2108 Sidney Baker Artist: *Aurora Joleen Franklin, 2021*

A bright, colorful mural created by a local artist sharing her vision of the beauty of Kerrville. Painted on the north side of the Kerrville Visitor Center to greet people as they drive into town.

2. The Coming King Sculpture & Prayer Garden – *Sculptures* The Coming King Foundation, 520 Benson Dr

Various artists The Coming King Sculpture & Prayer Garden offers multiple sculptures throughout the grounds.

3. American Flag – *Mural* Re-max Realty, 1835 Sidney Baker St

4. "Art in Motion" – Mural

H-E-B Tennis Center, 801 Tennis St *Artists: Olivia Findley & the Fredericksburg High School Class of 2022, 2021* Tennis and art bring joy to both the participants and observers.

5. Basement Brewers – Mural Basement Brewers, 521 Clay St Artist: *Marty Garcia, 2019*

6. Kerrville Pets Alive – Mural

Kerrville Pets Alive, 414 Clay St Artist: *Sklar Savarin, 2022* Created to promote the mission of KPA to celebrate and value the lives of pets in our community.

7. La Escondida – Mural

1962 Barber Company, 516 Jefferson St Artist: *Kristin La Rue, 2020* Explore the art on the back of this barbershop and local hang out.

8. "Landprint" – Mural Kerrville Daily Times, 429 Jefferson St Artist: Michael Bailey, 2022 A four panel design using contour maps of Kerrville.

9. "Hobo Code" – Mural

Pint and Plow, 332 Clay St Artist: *Bill Tavis, 2020* Unique black-and-white mural depicting "Hobo Code" dating back to the 1880s, when distressed workers created their own form of sign language. Each symbol on the mural represents a clue they left behind for those hoping to find a handout or job. Sourced from the National Cryptologic Museum.

10. "Harry Dietert" – Mural

Napa Auto Parts 601 Jefferson St


Artist: *Bill Tavis, 2020* The mural is drawn from a photo of Harry Dietert in a small home-built car that was taken sometime around 1914 when he was still a student at Tivy High School. Harry Dietert would go on to play a role in automobile manufacturing before returning to Kerrville in the 1950s, where he and his wife made key contributions to the community that are still being felt today.

11. Pop Art – *Mural* Pop Art Hair Studio, 223 Clay St

Artists: Marty Garcia & Tivy High School Art Dept., 2019 Located on the north side of the Pop Art Hair Studio this mural depicts a bright vortex of red, orange and blue.

12. "Restore & Recharge" – Mural

Lower Level of Public Downtown Parking Garage, 201 Clay Street Artists: *Ren Wright-Trapino & students of Notre Dame Catholic School, 2021* This mural promotes environmental awareness and the evolution of clean energy.



13. "Regenerate" – Mural Voekel Engineering, 212 Clay St

Artists: Andrew & Sarah McWilson, 2021

Located on the side of the Voelkel Building and facing the home of the Kerrville Farmers Market the artists of this mural said it represents two worlds, nature and man. The artists felt compelled to paint in the colors of the river first and then the humans. The words on the mural are about shedding old parts of ourselves and in nature to make room for the "new."

14. Storybook Mosaics – Mosaics

Butt-Holdsworth Memorial Library, 505 Water St

Behind the public library you can find storybook mosaics created on the wall as well as other public art spread around the campus.

15. Riverside Nature Center – *Sculpture & Mural* 150 Francisco Lemos St

The Riverside Nature Center offers both sculpture and mural art throughout their beautiful native garden as well as educational opportunities and direct access to the Kerrville River Trail.

16. Patriotic Mural

Mamacita's Restaurant, 215 Junction Hwy A patriotic mural commissioned by a local business owner.

17. "Kerrville – Live Happy" – Mural

The Arcadia Live Theater, 717 Water Street Artist: *Brent Hale, 20*21 A larger than life mural overlooking the Guadalupe River above the deck of the historical Arcadia Theater.

18. "Butterfly Wings" – Mural

Peterson Plaza, 701 Main St Artist: *Aurora Joleen Franklin, 2018* An interactive mural where you can stand with the wings to create

your own butterfly.

19. The Star at Water Street

Water St/Earl Garrett St, 798 Water St The Star" has been created into the streets of downtown Kerrville where Water Street & Earl Garret Street intersect to recognize Kerrville's

beginnings and the history of cattles drives stopping here along the bluffs of the Guadalupe River.

20. Kerr Arts & Cultural Center – *Sculptures & Mural* Kerr Arts & Cultural Center, 228 Earl Garrett St

KACC showcases public art pieces in front of their building as well as have mural painted on one of their walls.

21. "Mother's Love" - Bronze

Downtown Kerrville, 228 Earl Garrett St, by Kerr Arts & Cultural Center Artist: James Avery, 2012

Mother's Love statue was erected in 2012 and dedicated as the James Avery Memorial in 2018 after the passing of its creator and designer. James Avery started his company in Kerrville over 60 years ago and was a great supporter of the Kerrville community.

22. "Lupe" the Guadalupe Bass – Sculpture

Louise Hays Park, 202 Thompson Dr, by Children's Splash Pad water feature Artist: *Giai Miller, 2017*

Lupe the Guadalupe Bass was sculpted by thousands of mosaic pieces and modeled after the official state fish, the Guadalupe Bass. Some of the mosaic tiles used were created by local residents.

23. "Kerrville Kindness" and

"Hill Country Strong" – *Murals* **River Hills Mall, 200 Sidney Baker So.** Artist: *Aurora Joleen Franklin, 2020* Two murals created by a local artist to promote kindness and community.

24. Museum of Western Art Campus – *Bronzes* Museum of Western Art, 1550 Bandera Hwy

Various artists The Museum showcases multiple bronzes on the grounds of their campus.

25. STEMZone – *Mural* Schreiner University, 2100 Memorial Blvd #20

Artist: Amanda White (Schreiner Alum), 2021 Lead Designer: Schreiner University Visual Arts Faculty Marcia Rae McCulley with support from Deb Conner, Kathryn Campbell, Clay McClure; Production Assistants: Danna Gamez, Jenny Taylor, Catlynn Melo, and James Claflin

26. "Riparian" – Mural

Kerrville River Trail at Hwy. 27 crossing

Artists: *Mackenzie Wade & Schreiner University Communication* Painted on the underside of the Hwy. 27 overpass this mural promotes environmental awareness, the Kerrville ecosystem, and beautifies a portion of the Kerrville River Trail as it connects to the Schreiner University campus.

27. "Love Letter to Kerrville" – Mural

Central Texas Gun & Pawn, 1217 Broadway

Artist: Aurora Joleen Franklin, 2020

Located on the back of Central Texas Gun & Pawn and commissioned by its owner, Rachel Fitch, this mural pays homage to local wildlife and the Kerrville area's abundance of natural beauty. You will even find a surprise in the lower left corner if you're a player of the game Pokémon Go.

28. "Barn Swallows" & "Ocean" – Murals Olympic Pool, 601 Olympic Dr
