Rules & Information

The following rules and regulations apply to all non-commercial exhibitors/exhibits participating in the current year. Fair exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with these rules and exhibit in accordance with them. The Fair reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations, arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with the Fair.

The King County Fair will be held at the Enumciaw Expo Center July 14–July 17, 2022.

Official Fair Hours:

The Fair will be open to the public at the following times:

Thursday, July 14 10 am to 10 pm Friday, July 15 10 am to 10 pm Saturday, July 16 10 am to 10 pm Sunday, July 17 10 am to 6 pm

Grounds

The general supervision of the grounds, and the entire exhibition, are vested in Fair management. Outside agencies are contracted to provide medical and law enforcement services during the annual Fair. Property of the Fair, or its outside agencies, may not be removed from the grounds. Possession of alcoholic beverages are prohibited at the Fair except in the designated beer gardens and purchased from the Fair.

Parking

Parking passes and preauthorization required for all vehicles on the grounds inside the gates parked or driving inside barns, buildings or on lawns at any time. Overnight parking is allowed only in Camping Lots. Reservations can be made at KingCoFair.com. Area traffic/parking signs will be observed at all times. Designated fire lanes must be kept clear. No person shall knowingly interfere with the free flow of persons or vehicles upon or through the Fair or otherwise knowingly prevent the orderly and efficient use of Expo property for its primary purpose.

Dogs and Other Pets

No dogs or other pets are permitted at The King County Fair. Exception: on duty police dogs, service animals (as defined by ADA), trained animals in scheduled acts and animals entered in competition.

Advertising

No person shall post, distribute or display signs, advertisement, circulars, printed or written matter at the King County Fair. This includes "FOR SALE" signs over specific exhibits or entries. Please contact your Superintendent for further information.

HOLD HARMLESS: The Owner/Exhibitor agrees to protect, defend, indemnify, and save harmless the Enumclaw Expo & Events Association, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers and agents from any and all costs, claims, judgments, and/or awards for damages, arising out of or in any way resulting from the activities associated with their entries. The Owner/Exhibitor of the exhibit(s) releases the Association, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers and agents from any and all liability for loss, damage, or injury to property while at The King County Fair. In the event the Association incurs any judgment, award and/or cost arising there from, including attorneys' fees to enforce the provisions of this article, all such fees, expenses, and costs shall be recoverable from the Owner/ Exhibitor.

Forfeiture of Privileges or Awards

Any person who violates any general or special rule or intent will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as Fair management may deem appropriate, including removal from the Fair grounds.

Lost and Found

Lost and found is located at the Information Booth during business hours. Found items without identifiable ownership or items requiring owner contact, should be taken to the Information Booth. The Fair office will retain lost /found items for a period of (2) two weeks then they will be donated or thrown away.

First Aid

In the case of a medical situation, exhibitor shall immediately contact the nearest Superintendent or Fair employee. They are responsible for making the appropriate contacts. Exhibitor may help the situation further by keeping the area cleared until medical assistance arrives. The first aid unit is located at the North end of the Les Schwab Hall during public hours of the Fair. A First Aid kit and AED Unit is located in the Restorx Activity Hall Kitchen.

Law Enforcement and Security

Security is provided at the Fair before, during and after public hours. They are based out of the Administration office.

General Rules and Regulations:

The King County Fair has specific rules and age limitations based on species.

Only youth ages 8-18 (as of January 1, 2022) are eligible to compete in Open Class. Exhibitors ages 8-18 must show his/her own livestock without assistance. Youth ages 5-7 (as of January 1, 2021) may participate but the exhibitors animals will not be judged competitively. Exhibitors ages 5-7 may be assisted by an adult.

- Youth do not have to be a King County 4-H member to participate in the King County Open Class Animal Exhibits.
- Exhibitors must have "cared for" all animals at least 30 days prior to the date of the show.
- Exhibitors must provide food and water for their animal exhibits and keep their animal's area clean and presentable at all times.
- Animals will be released after the completion of the Fair on Sunday, July 17 at 6PM. There will be no removal of animals while the shows are in progress.
- Poultry and Rabbit exhibits must remain in place the duration of the Fair.
- Any exhibitor removing animals without official release or before release time will forfeit any prize monies and/or awards.
- The judge's decisions are final.
- Please see specific animal class for due dates for applicable forms.
- All requested information must be completed for an entry form to be considered official.

- Entries will be received until the entry deadline.
- Drop off/mail/email entries to: Enumclaw Expo Center, 45224 – 284th AVE SE, Enumclaw, WA 98022
- Exhibitor MUST clean up their area at the conclusion of the show and dispose of any shavings or manure before leaving the fairgrounds.
- Any exhibitor using abusive or excessive force with their animal will be asked to leave the fairground and forfeit any premium money or awards.

Judging

Judging is done by the Danish System. Exhibits are judged on their own merit and not against other like entries. Ribbons given are:

Blue – excellent; exhibit meets or exceeds the standard.

Red – good; relative to pre-established standards, a few specific shortcomings.

White – fair; many improvements are needed in order to meet standards..

Entry Age Classification

State age on entry form for proper classification during judging process:

Youth - Anyone 18 years and younger

Adult - Anyone 19 to 61 years

Senior - Anyone 62 years and older

Premiums and awards paid out

- 1. **ALL** premium checks will be mailed no later than September 30^{th.}
- ALL premium checks must be cashed by December 1 of the current year issued. No checks will be reissued after December 1 of current year.
- 3. Any error in the records of premiums caused by oversight or neglect shall be subject to correction whenever proof is furnished to the fair office that a mistake has been made. Errors and checks not received in the mail by November 1st of current year should be reported via email to renep@enumclawexpo.com.
- 4. Checks that are lost or damaged will be subjected to a \$35.00 fee for canceling and replacing a check.
- 5. 1099 Information: If you exceed \$600.00 in total premiums, you will need to file a W-9 form. These are available in the Fair office.
- 6. Premium checks will not be issued unless we have the completed W-9 form.

- Each club is responsible for sending a representative to the daily 9:30 am barn meetings and relaying information to other club members. Clubs are responsible for ensuring that their members adhere to barn herdsmanship requirements and agreements.
- Families (parents and children) who do not fulfill their herdsmanship responsibilities may forfeit awards.
- Cavies will exhibit Wednesday July 13th at vet check to Sunday, July 17, 2022. Incomplete entry forms will be returned to club leaders/parents.
- Every club is responsible for removing their items and helping with cleanup of the barn.
- A separate entry form must be used for each member. Members may enter in both Rabbits and Cavies but must use separate forms.
- Entries for the sow and litter competition qualify as one entry.
- Sows must have a minimum of two (2) pups to qualify for sow and litter.
- Sows entered in this competition are not allowed to compete in other type competitions. Pups must be 2-3 weeks old at the time of fair and must not have been previously weaned.
- Animals entered in Breeder's Choice Competition must have been bred and raised by the exhibitor.
- Members entering Breed Class must show in Fitting and Showing class.
- Your Fitting and Showing animal must be entered in breed class and be part of the exhibitor's project. Pet class is available for cross breeds and cavies that don't meet their breed type.
- A cavy project member who does not have a cavy in the Fair can still participate in the Judging Contest, Cavy Bowl, and/or Cavy Breed ID.
- Animals will be inspected before caging. Cavies exhibiting signs of mites, lice, colds, or other infectious diseases will not be caged and must be removed from the fairgrounds without delay. Cavies must have ear tags prior to health check.
- Exhibitors are required to bring bowls and water bottles for feeding and watering their animals. Animals will be disqualified
 from type competition by the judge if they meet any of the disqualifications as listed in the ARBA Standard of Perfection,
 with the exception of pet class.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor or a youth member to see that your cavy gets to the judging table when its Class is called. Parents and other adults are not to handle exhibitor animals unless there is an emergency.
- Breeding or selling of cavies during the fair will result in forfeiture of awards and State Fair Qualification.

All horses check in Wednesday July 13, 2022 & stay until Sunday, July 17

- All horses will arrive and be vet checked before entering the grounds.
- Any exceptions to arrival/departure schedules must be cleared in advance by the Superintendent. The Enumclaw Expo
 Center must receive completed Fair entry forms no later than <u>June 1, 2022</u> to be eligible to show at the King County
 Fair. Fair entry will include required fees of \$25.00 per section entered. Entry fees are only required for the sections
 entered. Exhibitors are allowed entry of one horse per section. If exhibitor brings two horses, they will pay two entry
 fees (one for each horse/section).
- If the exhibitor is in the barn for Western Games and is also entering the "Kick The Dust Up" barrel race, the entry fee for the barrel race will be paid separately. Contestants for "Kick The Dust Up" barrel race will run in the first draw, keeping those horses separated from the horses hauling in only for the race.
- No entry forms will be accepted after June 1, 2022. Class additions are not allowed after June 1, 2022, only class scratches will be accepted after that date. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS. If time allows, additional classes may be offered Sunday before closing.
- Premium points will be paid by Enumclaw Expo Center. Premium classes must be designated on entry form. Two
 premium classes allowed per section.
- Parent/Guardian will be on site for all youth exhibitors.
- Horse barn hours 6:00am 10pm.
- Stalls will be decorated during all 4 days of the Fair.
- Herdsmanship will be maintained by each exhibitor. That will include your stall and area in front of your stall. NOTE:
 Herdsmanship is basically good horsekeeping. Clean stall, water buckets cleaned and filled, aisle swept in front of
 your stall, tack neatly stored off the floor, etc.

- Stall decorations will be judged by the public on popularity and agricultural theme.
- Educational posters will be judged and premium points will be paid.
- Educational poster requirements will be provided for reference.
- Every exhibitor is encouraged to decorate their stall.
- Horse barn rules will be provided prior to arrival.
- Stall decorations will remain in place until the closing of the Fair.
- Every exhibitor is encouraged to display a poster with a story/information about your horse, including pictures.
- Stall dimensions will be posted for decorating purposes. No staples or duct tape allowed. NOTE: Some horses may eat or destroy your decorations, keep that in mind when planning your theme.
- Stall assignments will be considered for exhibitors that want to be stalled next to friends. Please note that request on entry form. Shared tack stalls may be available upon request.

SHOW RULES

- Exhibitors are obligated to read and follow all rules and regulations in this guidebook as well as King County Policy and Procedures including fair dress code. Any exhibitor or adult displaying unacceptable conduct (i.e. profane language, abusive treatment, poor sportsmanship) may at the discretion of the Superintendent(s) be dismissed and jeopardize awards or future Fair participation.
- Poultry will exhibit during the duration of the King County Fair, from Wednesday Vet Check to Sunday closing.
- Leaders & parents from each club/family must help on set up day, Saturday, July 9th, 2022.
- Please bring your own supplies: club decorations, herdsmanship equipment (broom, buckets, water refill container, aprons, etc.), cage cups (9 oz. tapered clear plastic 4 per bird), and own feed to provide self-care during the fair. Containers will not be allowed to set in shavings. Rubber bands provided to secure cups. Exhibitors bringing turkeys, game birds, or pigeons must provide adequate containers to suit the needs of the animals, as well as proper feed.
- NOTE: If bedding supplies are not donated by set up day (white shavings, tar paper, and plastic table skirting) exhibitors will be asked to pay a portion of the cost, up to \$10 per exhibitor. To donate any of these items, contact nbaskett@wsu.edu.

Entry times:

- a. Non-animal projects Class 18-21 set up day before Fair.
- b. Live birds @ Vet Check Classes 1-17 see vet check above.

Health notice: Poultry must be clean, in good condition, free of parasites and disease. Dust your birds 2 weeks before the Fair. Birds with missing feathers or injuries are not suitable for public display. Birds must pass vet checks including WSDA conducted NPIP testing (or receipt of NPIP hatchery purchase) prior to placement in cages.

Entry limits:

- Each exhibitor may enter up to 8 birds (at least 4 months old) Please list your top 5 entries. Additional entries, after top 5, need to be listed in the order of preference for entry. Premium points will be paid on listed top 5 entries regardless of the number entered at the Fair. No additional cage space allocated after the entry deadline.
- Eggs enter one dozen per lot in each class (must be from the laying flock of exhibitors).
- Poultry project members with no poultry entered in the Fair may participate in Classes 18- 21 complying with all entry requirements and deadlines.
- Entering birds at the Fair means that each exhibitor must provide self-care of animals (bring your own 9 oz. clear plastic cage cups allow 4 per bird & poultry feed), participate in an educational display (poster), showmanship, poultry judging, and complete minimum requirement of herdsmanship duty to include set up, clean up, and check out.
- Primaries are eligible to enter any activity & are awarded for participation without competition.
- To complete entry forms list birds in class order. Birds are cooped & judged in order of class, so contact your leader if you need help identifying class of entries.

Each club leader or designated resource leader/parent shall:

- Be responsible for correctness of club entries: breed, class, & variety according to the Standard.
- Provide the number of cages needed by the club with a club entry form packet.
- Verify club bird entries and changes on set-up day.
- Be present for set-up day, duration of Entry times, and Clean-up/check out at end of Fair.
- Complete and hang cage cards for club entries on set-up day before fair.
- Participate in barn duty one evening & 2 hours daily 9am-5pm. In addition an overnight in the barn as security if other
 livestock departments decide is necessary. Additional shifts may be required to adequately supervise the barn activities
 based on entry numbers and weather conditions.
- Be responsible for providing adult supervision appropriate for number & age of members.
- Each club is encouraged to provide club decor, an educational display, & poultry activities assistance.
- Purpose of club sign and cage decorations is to distinguish each cage from other clubs as well as make the barn more
 interesting. For safety reasons no decorations may be suspended from the ceiling but may be mounted on and above cages
 or walls but may not restrict the flow of air to the birds. Use durable materials (no paper streamers) to keep decorations neat
 and attractive for the length of the fair.

Showmanship

- Exhibitors shall have a neat and clean appearance, wear long sleeve white shirt with black pants, jeans or skirt.
 Showmanship is judged on appearance of the exhibitor; handling, condition, and training of bird, and general knowledge of poultry.
- Senior, Intermediate, and Junior Showmanship Champions will participate in the Small Animal Round Robin (cats, dogs, poultry, cavies, & rabbits) on Sunday, July 17th in the Poultry Barn. Blue alternate will be the Reserve Champions. Check with Supt. for updates.

Judging

- Poultry and exhibits are judged on a Danish system based upon established standards of quality for each type of entry.
 Each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets the standard.
- All standard bred poultry will be judged by comparison to the latest edition of American Poultry Standard of Perfection
 All commercial utility fowl (classes 12-13) will be judged on condition and suitability to utility. Please be sure to enter birds
 accordingly and have numbered leg bands on all birds. Websites for more information and how to purchase standards:
 APA is www.amerpoultryassn.com ABA is www.bantamclub.com

- A modified Danish system is then used to determine best of class awards (Champion) for the poultry and exhibits
 judged Blue place. Best of division (Grand Champion) winners are judged against each other to select
 the Best in Show winner.
- The Judge may not award a champion ribbon if the exhibit does not merit the placing.
- Exhibits that contain incorrect information may be judged, but not displayed at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- All 4-H members and youth exhibitors are eligible for participation at the Washington Junior Poultry Exposition at the Western WA State Fair in Puyallup, September & April of each year. Exhibitor information available at www.thefair.com.

Herdsmanship

- A minimum of 1 hour per day. Additional hours may be required based on the number of exhibitors and will be available on set up day along with duty signup sheets. Bring your schedule. The purpose of herdsmanship is to help members and all youth learn how to make a presentable exhibit for the public as well as learn skills in courtesy, neatness, and proper care of poultry. Ensuring poultry that are securely caged, clean and comfortable, well fed and cared for and exhibit area aisles and cages, attractive, feed and equipment safely stored.
- Barn closes on Sunday 6pm. Each club/family is responsible for removing their items and cleaning of the barn to include removal of shavings and tar paper, stacking of broken down cages, and sweeping the floor. No one will be dismissed until our area of the barn is clean.
- Exhibitors must check out with Superintendent upon completion of barn clean up as the final part of herdsmanship duty.

Chickens/Miscellaneous (Classes 1 - 14) Premium Points: Blue 40 - Red 30 - White 20

- Each exhibitor may enter up to three in each lot for each variety entered (as long as total birds do not exceed 8). To enter, locate your class of bird (class #) and list breed of bird and sex/age of bird. Class indicates the poultry class this bird belongs in. Description on entry form shall state breed, variety, leg band number/sex/age.

- Rabbits will exhibit Thursday July 14, 2022 to Sunday July 17, 2022.
 Remark cards and score sheets will be released on Sunday, July 17, 2022 at checkout. Each exhibitor is responsible for attending daily 10:00am barn meeting.
- Health Check Animals will be inspected before caging. Rabbits exhibiting signs of ear mites, infected hocks, vent disease, snuffles, or other infectious diseases will not be caged and must be removed from the fairgrounds without delay. Rabbits must be clearly and permanently tattooed prior to health check.
- Herdsmanship ALL EXHIBITORS must COMPLETE barn herdsmanship requirements. EXHIBITORS who do not fulfill
 their herdsmanship responsibilities may forfeit awards .The purpose of herdsmanship is to help exhibitors learn the skills of
 courtesy, public speaking, neatness, and the ability to demonstrate the proper care of rabbits. Herdsmanship sign-up will be
 available after the barn meeting each day of fair; a minimum of one hour of herdsmanship is expected each day during fair.
 Additional hours may be required based upon the number of exhibitors.
- Exhibitors are required to bring cups or cans for feeding and watering their animals. Water bottles are acceptable but they must be mounted on the inside or back of cages. Cages may have decorations but they must not obstruct the view of the rabbits on exhibition.
- Carry cages must be removed from fair grounds upon coop-in, and will be allowed back in the barn at 6pm Sunday for coop out.
- **Right to limit entries:** At this time we reserve the right to limit entries based on space/ equipment available. **Please enter your top 5 entries.** Additional entries, after top 5, need to be listed in the order of preference for entry. Premium points will be paid on listed top 5 entries regardless of the number entered at the fair.
- Members entering Breed Type must also show in Fitting & Showing class to receive awards. It is the responsibility of
 the exhibitor or a youth member of your club to see that your rabbit gets to the judging table when its Class is called.
 Parents and other adults are not to handle exhibitor animals unless there is an emergency. Animals will be disqualified from
 type competition by the judge if they meet any of the disqualifications listed in the Standard with the exception of Pet and
 Crossbreed classes.
- **Fitting and Showing animals must be entered in Breed Type** and be part of the standard classes available for rabbits that meet their breed type.

FLEECE SHOW RULES

- 1. Fleeces must be delivered between 10 am and 4 pm to the Livestock barn at the King County Fairgrounds on Saturday, July 9. No mail in entries will be accepted. Attendant will give exhibitor an entry tag for each class. THESE MUST BE REVIEWED AND COMPLETED BEFORE THE FLEECE WILL BE ACCEPTED. Tag MUST BE PRESENTED FOR PICKUP.
- 2. Fleeces must remain on display until release time Sunday, July 17th @ 6pm. The Fair will not be responsible for fleeces after that time.
- 3. Fleece must be shorn from animals owned by the exhibitor.
- 4. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months growth. The definition of 12 months shall be the definition commonly accepted by the wool trade.
- 5. Exhibitors are limited to winning two premiums per class and limited to entering a total of four breed classes.
- 6. Fleeces will be judged based on type and class but can be further classified by the judge into smaller or larger classes based on entries. Ram or whether fleeces may be shown in designated classes and commercial classes.
- 7. Fleeces may not be tied. Present the fleece in large, clear plastic bags with no tears.
- 8. Natural colored fleeces entered in breed classes, Division 750 and 751 cannot be entered in the natural colored fleece classes Division 753 and 755. Natural Colored fleece division will be judged according to criteria established by the Natural Colored Wool Growers Association.
- 9. Goat Entries -
 - Buck Fleeces are limited to kids under one year of age.
 - Cashmere Fleeces may be shown in 2 gallon zip-lock bags.
 - Cashmere may be shorn or combed but cannot be dehaired.
 - Cashmere Fleece must be a minimum of 1 1/4 inches long.

10. Alpaca & Llama Entries -

- Fiber must be sheared and not brushed, have its locks structure intact, and be displayed cut side out.
- Fiber must represent the full blanket/barrel.
- Alpaca & Llama fleeces must be noodled in a plastic sheet and placed inside a large, clear, plastic bag.
- Minimum length of llama fiber undercoat is 3 inches. There is no maximum length of fiber for animals under 24 months of age. Maximum staple length is 8 inches on animals over 25 months.
- Minimum length of alpaca fiber undercoat is 3 inches. There is no maximum length of fiber for animals under 24 months of age. Huacaya Alpacas over 25 months of age have a Maximum staple length of 8 inches. Suri alpacas over 25 months of age may have a maximum fiber length of 14 inches.
- 11. Depending on the number of entries, Llama and Alpaca classes may be divided by color and lots added.
- 12. All judges' decisions will be final. Judges may disqualify any entry for just cause, and may reassign entries to categories, as seem proper.
- 13. All Prizes and Awards will be announced at a later date.

- By submitting an entry into the King County Fair, exhibitors agree to abide by all rules, regulations, and entry requirements of the King
 County Fair and of the department(s) to which they are submitting their entries. It is important that exhibitors read and be familiar with
 the rules in this book, as well as the Departmental Exhibitors Rules and Regulations.

- Sheep Show Information:
 - 1. Online entry registration is due by May 1, 2022, or until capacity is reached.
 - 2. Entry fee is \$6.00 per head. Entry fees must be paid at the time you submit your online entries.
 - 3. No entry fee for group classes.
 - 4. Sheep Arrive: Wednesday, July 13, 2022, 7am to 12pm.
 - 5. Sheep Leave: After 6pm on Sunday, July 17, 2022. All sheep must be removed Sunday.
 - 6. Judge: TBA
 - 7. Judging Wool Breeds: Saturday, July 16, 2022, 1pm-3pm
 - 8. Judging Meat Breeds: Saturday, July 16, 2022, 1pm-3pm
- Sheep Show Rules
 - 1. An exhibitor must enter a minimum of three (3) sheep in one breed to have their entry accepted. An individual exhibitor may enter a total of eight (8) sheep per breed, whatever sex or age, lamb or yearling. Entry fees must be paid at the time you submit your online entries (\$6.00 per head). Any change in entries must be made with the superintendent or show staff before the day of showing. Substitutions may be made only within the same breed and class. Entry fees will not be refunded unless superintendent is presented with a veterinary certificate stating health reason for cancellation.
 - 2. All out-of-state sheep are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, with a statement saying they are free of clinical signs of sore mouth, foot rot and caseous lymphadenitis, and all rams over six months of age require an entry permit number. All sheep must have official Scrapie Identification.

All animals must meet Fair health requirements. Fair veterinary personnel will examine all entries and exhibition animals to ensure freedom from ectoparasites and symptoms of contagious or infectious diseases before animals are penned. Blankets/covers on sheep must be removed for veterinary inspection.

Exhibitors must submit vet check-in slip to the Superintendent or designee of their livestock department in order to proceed to livestock barn. NO EXCEPTIONS.

3. Animals are to be delivered to assigned pens between 9am and 12pm on Wednesday, July 13, 2022. Any late arrivals must be cleared with the superintendent, or space will be forfeited at 12pm. Please contact the superintendent if you will be late or will be scratching your entry. There will be a waitlist managed by the superintendent.

Please check your registration papers with the superintendent or staff as soon as possible after your sheep are stabled.

- 4. All animals must remain in barns until their designated release time as set by the King County Fair and department superintendents. Failure to do so could result in forfeiture of premium money and, potentially, the privilege to show at future livestock shows.
- 5. Sheep must be removed from pens after 6pm on Sunday, July 17, 2022. Any arrangements made by exhibitors for sale or delivery of animals must be transacted off the grounds, and sheep cannot be left in pens for pick up.
- 6. Straw for bedding will be provided by the King County Fair. First straw will be in the barn. Straw and bedding must be racked and disposed in provided containers.
- 7. Sheep may not be blanketed during fair hours, except before they are shown.
- 8. All sheep (including lambs over 60 days) must be registered by the appropriate association and have ownership recorded in the name of the exhibitor no less than 30 days before show date. All entries must have an ear tag or tattoo matching at least one number on their registration papers.
- 9. Animals must be entered and shown in the name of the registered owner.
- 10. There will be a limit of two premiums in the individual classes, and one premium in the group classes, per exhibitor. An exhibitor is defined as any individual or farm or partnership in whose name the sheep are registered.
- 11. The base for birth dates shall be Sept. 1. Animals must show appropriate lamb or yearling teeth. If there is a doubt of the age of any animal, the judge will decide age by examining the teeth of that animal.
- 12. Lambs will be divided into Fall and Spring Divisions as follows:
 - Spring Lambs: January 1 August 31
 - Fall Lambs: September 1 December 31
- 13. All sheep entered in young flock, get-of-sire, or pair lots must also be entered in an individual lot. Get-of-Sire and Young Flock must be bred and owned by the exhibitor. One "Best Pair" entry per exhibitor, per breed.
- 14. Any breed with only one exhibitor will automatically go into Division 716 "Other Wool Breeds" or Division 731 "Other Meat Breeds".
- 15. Please Note: NCWGA has Class Divisions A & B. Animals for group classes may not be interchanged between Divisions A & B to create a Best Pair, Young Flock, Flock, etc. They must be shown in the division in which the individual animal was entered.
- **16.** All sheep should be clean. Meat breeds shall be fit in accordance with the individual registry association rules. Wool sheep shall be shown in their natural state. Animals not in show-worthy condition will not be allowed in the barn.
- 17. All judge's decisions will be final. Judges may disqualify an entry for just cause and may reassign entries to categories as seem proper to the judge.
