Rules and Regulations

- 1. Entries and Eligibility
- (a) Entries are open to all youth exhibitors 19 years of age and under in the State of Washington.
- (b) Entries and Fees must be postmarked by June 1st late entries only accepted based on space availability, the entry fee will DOUBLE. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- (c) Ownership of potential project animals must be by the following date of the current year: Steers March 1st, Hogs April 1st, Turkeys April 1st, Goats April 15th, Lambs- April 15th, Rabbits May 3rd, Chickens: Freedom Rangers April 19th / Cornish Cross May 17th / Cornish Game Hens June 14^{th.}
- (d) Exhibitors can enter two livestock show projects of the same or different species.
- (e) A color picture will be taken of each Exhibitor and their project(s). A sign-up sheet for photo times during the Fair will be at the Livestock Barn office. SHOW/OFFICIAL DRESS IS REQUIRED, and ANIMALS MUST BE CLEAN and SHOW READY!
- (f) All animals must meet sales weight requirements to show.
- (g) Exhibitors are encouraged to bring a wheelbarrow and any tools needed to clean. Manure clean-up equipment will not be provided. Manure to be dumped on North side of Livestock Barn in dump trailer provided. Use trash barrels for trash only.
- (h) All exhibitors must attend a mandatory barn meeting every morning at 9 AM. Non-attendance will result in a loss of 25 premium points for each meeting missed. Mandatory group photo will be taken on Auction (Sunday) morning in conjunction with the barn meeting. Please wear show/official dress for the photo.

2. To receive premium points and auction checks the exhibitor **must** participate in Fit and Show, as well as abide by all show rules. If rules are not followed, the Exhibitor may be asked not to return.

3. A \$10.00 entry fee will be charged, per project entry. Entry fees are **<u>non-refundable</u>**. After June 1st entry fees are \$20.00.

4. All exhibits will be consigned for auction. Underweight and overweight animals **WILL NOT** be permitted at the Show or Auction. One weigh-in per Exhibitor per project. Any animal not making weight must leave the show grounds immediately upon notification.

5. All entries accepted with the understanding that neither the Show management, the Show organization, Show Volunteers, or the Enumclaw Expo Center nor their Officers, Employees or Volunteers shall be held responsible for any loss that may arise, or damage that may occur to livestock on exhibit during the Show or Auction.

6. Each Exhibitor must take care of and exhibit his/her own animal and will be responsible for the humane care, management, and cleanliness of their stall area. An Exhibitor may be excused by the management for reasons that are deemed sufficient upon writing a letter or request in advance and having it signed by their leader, agriculture teacher or parent, with the understanding they supply an alternate to be responsible for the exhibit for his/her period of absence. The Exhibitor must obtain and display a standard information card on their stall and summary sheet.

7. The Department Superintendent selecting animals for the Judging Contest may use any animal entered in the Show. Exhibitors must also prepare their entry for use in the Livestock Judging Contest if requested to do so by the management or forfeit their entry and all rights and privileges of the Show.

8. Livestock will be listed in the Auction and sold in order by their respective grade. Only purple and blue-ribbon animals will be sold.

9. Checks from the sale of livestock will be made available when all animals sold have been paid for. All checks issued to exhibitors NEED TO BE CASHED within 60 days of the issue date.

10. No housing accommodation will be provided for exhibitors by the Show. Exhibitors must make their own housing arrangements. RV parking is available on a first come first served basis in the RV Park, register online and in Camperville, registration form available online. Camperville camping units must have an RV ticket in dash, or you will be towed. ALL EXHIBITORS STAYING OVERNIGHT MUST HAVE A PARENT OR GUARDIAN WITH THEM.

11. EXHIBITORS UNDER AGE 18 must have adult supervision. Exhibitors from distant points must arrange to have an on-site adult responsible for supervising him/her during the Show. Exhibitors who show inappropriate behavior will lose premium points if the Superintendent feels it is justified to impose the penalty.

12. The King County Junior Livestock Show Committee will have the final authority over entries in each division.

13. All Exhibitors must be dressed in Fit and Show attire for both the Show and Auction. DRESS CODE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED AND ANIMALS MUST BE CLEAN.

14. Any animal is subject to a drug test. Positive test results will result in a permanent ban from the Show and Exhibitor will forfeit all monies associated with the project. Cattle Calmer is acceptable but not encouraged. Results will be reviewed by the Grievance Committee.

15. All animals must stay in livestock show areas.

16. For safety reasons, general prohibited attire: Spaghetti strap tops; short shorts; open toed shoes.

17. Show dress code: black pants; white - long sleeve button up shirt; closed toed dark shoes or club/chapter Officials.

- 18. Premium Point Checks
- (a) Exhibitors must deliver all written thank you cards for buyers and supporters to Enumclaw Expo Center prior to receiving their check. If thank you cards are not written and brought to Enumclaw Expo Center, premium point checks are forfeited and considered a donation to KCJLS.
- (b) Checks not received by November 1st of current year should be reported be email to <u>sandyo@enumclawexpo.com</u>.

19. Upon fair closure, each exhibitor is responsible for cleaning up their area, removing their tack and personal belongings. More details to come in emails prior to fair.

20. Any exhibitor or judging contestant found guilty of using or having in possession any intoxicating liquor, drugs, destroying of property, using profane language, or violating the IAFE CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS will be requested to withdraw his or her entry and forfeit all awards he or she may have won. No physical alterations on any livestock.

21. The IAFE CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS is to be read, signed, and returned with the entry form.

22. Grievances will be taken and addressed by the barn superintendent. The superintendent will review, research, and discuss with the grievance committee. A decision and/or course of action will be made. **ALL DECISIONS WILL BE FINAL.**

23. Tack/Pen space is available as room allows. A new column on the entry form is for information and requests. Enter on the entry form a request for a single or double pen, linear feet for steer entry, any general information that will assist in preparation.

24. Completely read and abide by King County Fair Exhibitor Fair Book Guide.

BEEF RULES

Steers may be divided into 4 equal weight classes, depending on # of entries, after all weighing is completed. Final decision on what class the steer will be entered will be up to the show committee. Classes may be added or deleted at the discretion of the show committee. The show is open to beef steers and miniatures; dairy steers and dairy crosses **not** permitted. The Show Committee has the right to change this rule at any time. Animals must be dehorned and tied with a halter and necktie.

Steers must weigh at least 1100 pounds; miniatures must weigh at least 800 pounds.

Steers must be halter-broken and led in the show and auction rings. Any animal that cannot be safely handled will be withdrawn from the Show by the Exhibitor or the Superintendent if necessary. No nose leads. **SHOW HALTER MUST BE USED!**

All steers must be accompanied by a branding permit, if applicable, haul slip, and tagged upon arrival at Show grounds. Steers shown shall not be over 30 months of age. (Full clipping of your animal must be done at home. Only touch-up is allowed at the Show)

Requests of linear footage on entry from at fair will be considered pending on space availability. Each entry will receive a minimum of 10 feet per entry.

For safety reasons, exhibitors must always wear closed-toed shoes!!

MARKET CHICKEN RULES

Chickens must be Cornish Cross, Freedom Rangers, or Cornish Game Hens. Each entry consists of a pen of 3 fryers not to exceed 8 weeks of age for Cornish Cross or 10 weeks of age for Freedom Rangers, or 4 weeks of age for Cornish Game Hens. Leg bands will be provided at check-in. Meat birds can be preordered for the auction. **Orders must be submitted by February 28, 2024.**

Exhibitors will receive 5 Cornish Cross birds at the cost of \$17.50 total, 5 Freedom Rangers birds at the cost of \$22.50 total or 5 Cornish Game Hens at the cost of \$17.50 total (paid in cash or PayPal to Ashleigh Stouffer at time of ordering) for the show and must select their pen of 3 from these birds, the weight of those animals should be a minimum of 5 pounds each for Cornish Cross and Freedom Rangers, and a minimum of 2 pounds each for Cornish Game Hens, at the time of entry. Freedom Rangers must be in exhibitors care no later than April 19, 2024. Cornish Cross must be in the exhibitors' care no later than May 17, 2024. Cornish Game Hens must be in exhibitors care no later than June 14, 2024.

All poultry should be properly groomed prior to check in. **No** whole-body bathing will be allowed on fairgrounds.

Hands-on training will be provided at the time of pick-up, which is strongly recommended for all exhibitors. A sincere thank you to Jenks Hatchery for providing these chicks to the youth who are participating in the auction.

MARKET TURKEY RULES

Turkey entries should consist of a single turkey with a minimum weight of 14 pounds and a maximum of 30 pounds and must not be over 24 weeks. Leg bands will be provided at check-in for those birds that are not yet banded.

Exhibitors will purchase a turkey at the cost of \$15 each (paid in cash or PayPal to Ashleigh Stouffer at time of ordering) for the show. Orders must be submitted by February 28, 2024.

Turkeys should be in the exhibitors care no later than April 1, 2024.

All turkeys should be properly groomed prior to check in. **No** whole-body bathing will be allowed at the Enumclaw Expo Center.

Hands-on training will be provided at the time of pick-up which is strongly recommended for all exhibitors. Please contact Ashleigh Stouffer at 253-797-7411, <u>ashleighx4@comcast.net</u> for more information.

RABBIT RULES

Each rabbit entry can consist of a meat pen, a single fryer, 1 roaster, or 1 stewer. All rabbits entered must have a permanent and legible tattoo in their left ear at the time of check-in.

Meat Pen: consists of 3 rabbits of the same breed and variety with a weight of 3 ½- 5 ½ pounds and maximum of 10 weeks old born no later than May 3, 2024. Rabbits must be raised by the exhibitor from birth.

Rabbit nails should be clipped one week prior to fair. Use of foreign substances on rabbits prior to show, will be disqualified.

Single Fryer: A single rabbit weighing between 3 ½- 5 ½ pounds, no older than 10 weeks of age and born no later than May 17, 2024. Rabbits must be raised by the exhibitor from birth.

Roaster: A single rabbit weighing 5 ½ - 9 pounds, 10 weeks – 6 months of age.

Stewer: A single rabbit weighing 8 pounds and over the age of 6 months.

MEAT GOAT RULES

Goats may be divided into equal weight classes after all weighing is completed. Classes may be added or deleted at the discretion of the show committee.

Meat goats must be at least 50% Meat Goat, No straight-bred dairy, Angora, or Pygmy goats.

Goats must weigh 60 pounds or more. Only wether and doe kids are eligible, and they must show all milk (kid) teeth.

All wethers must be castrated a minimum of 6 weeks prior to the show.

Meat goats may have horns, providing exhibited goats have horn protectors per WSU EM0758E.

All meat goats will be tagged upon weigh-in. Goats must be uniformly shorn within a month of the show. Full clipping of your animal must be done at home. Only touch-ups are allowed at the show.

KCJLS will adhere to the Federal Scrapie Program. ALL GOATS MUST HAVE FEDERAL SCRAPIE IDENTIFICATION.

SHEEP RULES

Lambs may be divided into equal weight classes after all weighing is completed. Classes may be added at the discretion of the show committee.

Lambs must weigh a minimum of 105 pounds. Only wether or ewe lambs are eligible, and they must show all lamb teeth.

All lambs must be castrated a minimum of 6 weeks prior to the Show.

All Lambs will be tagged upon weigh-in. Full clipping of your animal must be done at home. ALL LAMBS MUST BE SLICK SHORN WITH THE EXCEPTION OF HEAD AND LEG WOOL. Only touch-ups will be allowed at the show. KCJLS will adhere to the Federal Scrapie Program rules. ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE FEDERAL SCRAPIE IDENTIFICATION.

SWINE RULES

Hogs may be divided into equal weight classes after all weighing is completed. Only barrows and gilts are eligible. Classes may be added at the discretion of the show committee.

All hog entries must weigh 235-300 pounds.

The show committee may disqualify any hog showing signs of scars, hernia, arthritis, foul sheath, sores, bruises, or blemishes that might damage the carcass.

All hogs will be tagged upon weigh-in. Body clipping should be done at home prior to entry to the show.

Premium Point Awards

Premium points will be awarded per the following grid. The value of each point will be based on available monies divided by all points earned.

Bonus Points - may be awarded in instances when an exhibitor exhibits "going above and beyond". Examples: fair set up, during show and auction, fair tear down and clean up, record books.

Type Judging

All animals will be judged according to species and class. A judge will evaluate and place each class upon their decision and award ribbons (purple, blue, red) per their evaluation results. **ALL JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL.**

Fitting and Showing

Every exhibitor must Fit and Show, or auction participation and premium points will be forfeited. Exceptions approved by the Show Executive Committee only.

- A. Eligibility
 - 1. There will be a Junior (8-10 years), Intermediate (11-13 years), Senior (14-19 years) and Novice division.
 - 2. A Novice is a member that has never shown prior to this school year in this division. Divisions will be age appropriate upon judges' agreement. Judges have authority to merge age divisions.
 - 3. Entrance in this contest does not bar exhibitors from other contests in which they are eligible.
 - 4. The fitting of the animal is to be the work of the exhibitor only.
- B. Requirements
 - 1. Each contestant must own the animal he/she shows.
 - 2. There shall be seven divisions of this contest:
 - (a) Beef (b) Meat Goat (c) Sheep (d) Swine (e) Poultry (f) Rabbit (g) Turkey
- C. Score card
 - 1. Scoring will be as follows:

35 percent Fitting and 55 percent Showing; 10 percent for fleshing and condition of animal.

Youth in Action

Exhibitors may sign up to give a 30-minute presentation on a livestock related topic during the fair. Fifty (50) premium points will be awarded per participant.

Herdsmanship

The purpose of the Herdsmanship is to encourage exhibitors to care for livestock, pens and equipment properly and always keep stalls and animals clean and attractive. All entries will be entered automatically. Judges will examine pens and livestock each day and exhibits must be ready for inspection by 9 a.m. The last Herdsmanship scoring will be done by 8 p.m. or 1 hour after the show, whichever is later. Judges scores will be tallied per day; 4, premium points will be awarded on an average of all days.

Educational Exhibits

The purpose of the Educational Exhibits is to educate other Exhibitors and the public about your animals.

Entries will be limited to one poster per individual. Educational Exhibits must be turned in by 8 p.m. Wednesday, July 12th. Premiums will be paid on a point basis according to the ribbon received. Points are outlined in this premium book. Educational Exhibits will be judged on the following criteria:

Color, Lettering, Illustration, Layout, Originality, Creativity, and Educational Value

- A. Limited to one 22" x 28" current year poster per Exhibitor.
- B. Must be readable from 10 feet away.

C. A tag with name, age, phone will be placed on the poster and will be available at the Show Office.

Livestock Judging Contest Rules

- 1. This contest is open to all eligible youth exhibitors. An eligible member is one carrying a livestock project and is in good standing.
- 2. Judging, oral reasons, and scoring will be done on an individual basis.
- 3. There will be a Junior, Intermediate and Senior division.
- 4. Classes consisting of 4 animals each of market steers, meat goats, hogs and lambs are judged, if available.
- 5. To compete at a state level, oral reasons are REQUIRED.

Record Books

The purpose of a record book is to encourage record keeping to assist in learning if a project is profitable. Record keeping assists in learning daily gains if a project is gaining and to learn the cost of the gains. Good records aid in successful and profitable management decisions.

All exhibitors may present a completed KCJLS Record Book. All Exhibitors are **required** to fill out a summary sheet, example below. It is the same information to be displayed on your stall. Summary sheet cards and exhibitor cards will be available at check-in. For chickens, the cost for all animals should be included in the record book.

Record books are due at 9pm on Thursday, July 11. You must use the King County Junior Livestock Show Official Record Book. The judging of the books will be based on the judging sheet in the book.

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

- 1) All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2) Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
- 3) Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4) Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and ail procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

- 5) Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 6) The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7) Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
- 8) No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9) The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10) The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expos and any special notices to members.
- 11) The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.
