

2022 HORSE BARN RULES & TOP 5 CHOICE

KITTITAS COUNTY FAIR (Labor Day Weekend) and KITTITAS COUNTY JUNIOR HORSE FAIR

Junior Horse Fair

Thursday August 18th – Sunday August 21st

Kittitas County Fair

Thursday September 1st - Monday, September 5th

1. **Jr. Horse Fair Vet Check:** 7:00 – 8:30am August 18, 2022
Horses in place by 9am. Safety Meeting after Vet Check: 9am, Bloom Pavilion *required
2. **Fair Vet Check:** Horses will only be allowed onto the fairgrounds **AFTER VETERINARIAN INSPECTION** between **1:30 – 2:30 PM ONLY**, Horses in place by 3:00pm on Wednesday prior to fair. **4-H exchange horses**, Saturday of Fair, between **7:00am to 8:00am ONLY**
3. No horses are allowed to be standing in the barn aisle-ways during Fair hours.
4. All horses must be groomed, saddled, harnessed, etc. within stalls during Fair hours. No blankets or hoods on horses during Fair hours.
5. When horses are entering or exiting the Barns, pedestrian traffic must be monitored by assistant. **Director and/or Superintendent must be notified whenever horses are leaving the Barn.**
6. **No riding horses in or out of the Barns.**
7. No horses are allowed North of Horse Barns unless scheduled to be in Rodeo or other events, and Superintendent and Director are notified in advance.
8. No switching stalls without prior clearance of the Barn Superintendent.
9. Area and aisles must be kept clean and uncluttered at all times.
10. It is the owner’s responsibility that their horse(s) have a fresh supply of water and food as well as the stalls and aisle-way cleaned every day prior to fair opening. If you are not able to there, be sure someone else is authorized to take care of these responsibilities.
11. Horse owners must be sure Barn Superintendent has updated emergency information including: their home and work phone numbers, friend or relative’s phone number, veterinarian’s name and phone number and any important health information on the horse.
12. Report any damages to stalls or injured/sick horses to the Barn Superintendent and/or Director promptly. Horses exhibiting disease symptoms or unsuitable behavior during the course of the Fair must be removed from the fairgrounds with the approval of the Superintendent, Director, and/or veterinarian.
13. No hay nets unless owners are present at all times. Any empty hay nets must be removed from the stalls, for the safety of the horse.
14. All horses that are to be hitched up to pull, together or individually, must be walked out of the Barn individually and then hitched up outside the barn (south side) with helpers providing safety barriers.

NO SMOKING IN THE BARN. No Food or Drink allowed in any barn.
