ENTRY AND EXHIBITS

- Entry form deadline: Third Friday in August at 5pm.
- Displayed in the Home Arts building.
- **EXHIBITS ACCEPTED 2:00 pm - 7:00 pm On WEDNESDAY, prior to Fair ONLY, IN THE HOME ARTS BUILDING.** Judging will be Wednesday evening
- All exhibitors must be pre-entered. There is no penalty for “No Show” Exhibits.
- Entries are to be made in the proper DIVISION and CLASS number.

FLORICULTURE RULES

1. **All Specimen flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor.**
2. Flowers used in designs may be fresh or dried depending on Class and need not be grown by exhibitor. See DIVISION 16-O for entries of preserved or dried plant material grown by exhibitor.
3. Potted plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession at least three months.
4. Containers will be supplied by the Fair for floriculture specimens. Superintendents must approve exceptions. (Kittitas County Fair will not be responsible for any loss or breakage).
5. Specimens must have foliage except where otherwise designated. Foliage below the water line on each specimen must be removed.
6. A spray must have true leaves and 3-5 blooms.
7. Hybrid teas must be disbudded.
8. When a specimen requires more than one bloom, all must be the same size.

9. Judging will be done according to the Danish System, each judged on its own merit.
10. The exhibitor should provide name and variety of each specimen.
11. Professional growers may enter Divisions other than those in which they specialize.
12. Rules will be strictly observed and followed
13. Exhibits are to remain in place until 6:00 pm Monday Labor Day

All specimens entered in the Floriculture Division, except house plants, will be discarded at the close of the Fair unless prior arrangements are made with Superintendents.

14. **Entry tags, ribbons, comment cards and any awards or gift certificates will be available for pick-up 6:00pm-8:00pm Labor Day in the Home Arts Building**

ONLY ONE ENTRY PER CLASS (except as noted)

DIVISION 16-A ROSE WITH FOLIAGE

Rose must be ¾ open at time of judging Hybrid teas must be disbudded.

PREMIUM POINTS

- 01 - Peace, all varieties, 1 bloom
- 02 - Red hybrid tea, 1 bloom
- 03 - White or cream hybrid tea, 1 bloom.
- 04 - Yellow hybrid tea, 1 bloom
- 05 - Pink hybrid tea, 1 bloom
- 06 - Dk. Pink hybrid tea, 1 bloom
- 07 - Blended color hybrid tea, 1 bloom
- 08 - Orange hybrid tea, 1 bloom
- 09 - Hybrid tea any other color, 1 bloom.
- 10 - Polyanthus of any color, 1 cluster
- 11 - Floribunda of any color, single or cluster
- 12 - Climber of any color, 1 cluster
- 13 - Grandiflora, any color, 1 stem
- 14 - Shrub rose, single or cluster
- 15 - David Austin, 1 single or cluster
- 16 - Old garden rose, 1 single or cluster
- 17 - Musk rose, 1 bloom

- 18 - Damask, 1 bloom
- 19 - Any other rose, 1 bloom
- 20 - Any above rose, but more than ¾ open at time of judging, miniatures must be single.
- 21 - Miniature, white or cream 1 stem
- 22 - Miniature, yellow, 1 stem
- 23 - Miniature, pink, 1 stem
- 24 - Miniature, red, 1 stem
- 25 - Miniature, other, 1 stem
- 26 - Miniature, orange, 1 stem
- 27 - Miniature, blended, 1 stem
- 28 - Miniature, any color, one spray

DIVISION 16-BDAHLIA

Must have foliage and be disbudded. Up to 3 different varieties may be entered in each CLASS.

- 06 - Formal decorative, under 4 inches, 1 bloom
- 07 - Informal decorative, over 8 inches, 1 bloom
- 08 - Informal decorative, 4-8 inches, 1 bloom
- 09 - Informal decorative, under 4 inches, 1 bloom
- 10 - Semi cactus, over 8", 1 bloom
- 11 - Semi cactus, 4-8", 1 bloom

- 13 - Largest of all, 1 bloom
- 14 - Miniature single, 3 blooms, one variety
- 15 - Pompon, under 2 inches, 3 blooms of one variety
- 16 - Miniature Ball, 2-4 inches, 3 blooms of one variety.
- 17 - Ball, 4" and larger, 1 bloom
- 18 - Water Lily – 1 bloom
- 19 - Collarettes - 3 blooms
- 20 - Seed dahlias
- 21 - Any dahlia not listed above, 1 or 3 blooms, one variety.

DIVISION 16-CGLADIOLI

Foliage not required. Do not break off tips. Each specimen must be 1/3 open, 1/3 partial, 1/3 closed at time of judging.

DIVISION 16-D SUNFLOWERS

- 01 - Ornamental Sunflower, 1 stalk, 7"-12" diameter bloom
- 02 - Ornamental Sunflower, 1 stalk, under 7" diameter, yellow
- 03 - Ornamental Sunflower, 1 stalk, under 7" diameter, bi-color
- 04 - Ornamental Sunflower, 1 stalk, under 7" diameter, any other color

DIVISION 16-E FOLIAGE

PREMIUM POINTS

- Blue 10

CLASSES

- 01 - Hosta, Small, up to 3" across, 1 leaf
- 02 - Hosta, Medium, from 3' up to 8" across, 1 leaf
- 03 - Hosta. Large, over 8" across, 1 leaf
- 04 - Ornamental Grass, small (less than 15" tall) 3 stems
- 05 - Ornamental Grass, large (taller than 15") 3 stems
- 06 - Other ornamental foliage, 3 stems (up to 3 different, named entries may be entered in this class)

DIVISION 16-HCOMBINATION PLANTINGS

PREMIUM POINTS

CLASS 01 - Dish Garden

Miniature landscape in an open container which consists of living plants may contain forms such as rock, water and accessories, all in scale. Not to exceed 16” diameter; oblong 12”x 18 “

CLASS 02 – Terrariums

Miniature landscape in covered transparent container can include 1 or more accessory to complete the landscape. Not to exceed 16” diameter; oblong 12” x 18”

DIVISION 16-I POTTED PLANTS

1. Must have been in the possession of exhibitor at least 3 months prior to fair.
2. Plant must not have been previously exhibited at Kittitas County Fair
3. Diameter of container not to exceed 12”
4. Diameter of plant not to exceed 30”
5. Give both Latin and common names of plant
6. Foliage must not be waxed
7. Plant must be grown by a non-professional
8. Watering instructions should be put on entry tag, if special care is required.

Judged on foliage, and must not be in flower.

One entry per class

- 02 - Marigold -3 blooms of 1 variety, yellow
- 03- Marigold -3 blooms of 1 variety, orange
- 04 - Asters -3 blooms of 1 variety
- 05 - Petunias -3 blooms of 1 variety
- 06 - Nasturtium -5 blooms of 1 variety
- 07 - Sunflower – 7" diameter & smaller.
- 08 - Any flower not listed above 3 blooms of one variety (up to 5 varieties)
- 09 - Any basket of flowers, your choice

DESIGN ENTRIES:

Materials used do not need to be grown by exhibitor, but arranged by exhibitor, except where noted.

Sixty percent (60%) of the judging points for arrangements are based on the principles of design: balance, proportions, scale, dominance, contrast and rhythm. Forty percent (40%) will be based on creativity, condition and conformance with stated requirements.

DIVISION 16-MNOVICE DESIGN

A novice is a designer who enters competition for the first time, or one who has not won more than ten blue ribbons in all (not just Fair) Floral Design competitions entered.

DIVISION 16-NADVANCED DESIGN

Advanced designers include judges and any other designers who have won eleven or more blue ribbons.

- 01- Designer’s Choice (fresh and/or dried plant material) following Fair Theme
- 02- Traditional Line-Mass Design, all fresh plant materials.
- 03- Creative Line Design, all fresh materials incorporating a strong line in the design.
- 04- Miniature (under 8" in any direction, all fresh materials) design
- 05 - Pot-et-Fleurs (mixed live planting in pot, with fresh cut flowers added)

DIVISION 16-ODRIED OR PRESERVED PLANT MATERIAL

- 01– Basket arrangement of dried or preserved plant material
- 02 – Swag or wreath using dried or preserved plant material
- 03 – Table top design of dried or preserved plant material
- 04 - Sheaf of dried flowers, herbs or combination, all grown by exhibitor. (Minimum 2" diameter at tied end)

YOUTH DESIGNS

Must be the work of youth, coaching is allowed.

(Ages 14-18)

CLASSES

- 01 – Imaginative floral assembly, using a toy or other favorite item.
- 02 – A creation including fruits and/or vegetables, with or without flowers, to create an exhibit. Must include a plate, board or other base, not to exceed 16” diameter or oblong 12” x 18”

DIVISION 16-SOPEN FLORICULTURE EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY

- Create a display on a topic of educational value related to the Department.
- History, How-to, Compare and Contrast, New Developments, etc. are all appropriate prompts for an educational display.
- Display may include sound, motion, 3-D, etc.
- Use large lettering to convey the main message. All wording should be readable from 6 feet away.
- All content must be original and copyright free.

Class 01 – Large Open Educational Display

Large Display: Maximum 20 square feet combined horizontal and vertical space (e.g. tri-fold display board on top of your own card table) down to 6 square feet (combined horizontal and vertical)

Class 02 – Small Open Educational Display

Small Display: size allowed up to 24” x 36” maximum (combined horizontal and vertical), down to 11” x 17” minimum.
