YOUTH CLUBS & FFA BEEF RULES

1. Current year means 2022 / 1 yr. Previous means 2021/ 2 yrs. previous means 2020.
2. Beef check in: between 12:00 pm - 2:00 pm, in place by 2pm. **No animals will be accepted after 2:00 pm, no exceptions.** Exhibitors with improper or incomplete paperwork will go to the end of the line.
3. Weigh-in at 2:30 pm

DIVISION 50-AFITTING AND SHOWING

The top ten exhibitors in each Class will receive a placing ribbon in addition to the Danish placing ribbon.

05 - Two-year-old Heifer

Born May 1 to April 30, two years previous

06 - Senior Yearling Heifer

Born May 1 to December 31, two years previous

07 - Junior Yearling Heifer

Born January 1 to April 30 of the previous calendar year

08 - Summer Yearling Heifer

Born May 1 to August 31 of the previous calendar year

09 - Senior Heifer Calf

Born from September 1 to December 31 of the previous calendar year

10 - Junior Heifer Calf

Born after January 1 of the current year

11 – Cow/Calf Pair

Calf born in current year

DIVISION 50-C.....MARKET & FEEDER STEERS

- All breeds show together
- All market animals not making weight will automatically be entered in a feeder division and will not be eligible for market sale.

DIVISION 50–D..... MINIATURE BEEF MARKET AND FEEDER STEER

Miniature Beef Rules

1. Official weight & height
 - a. The height and weight recorded at the time of weigh-in will be the official weight & height of the animal
 - b. Maximum Steer height of 48 inches at the hip at time of check-in. Steers over 48-inch height limit will not be eligible to show.
 - c. Maximum height for heifers is 46 inches.
2. Miniature market steers weighing less than 650 pounds at the Fair weigh in will be placed in a feeder class and will not be eligible for the Livestock Sale.
3. All breeds show together
4. All market animals not making weight will automatically be entered in a feeder division.

CLASS 01 - Beef Carcass

Carcasses meeting the following specifications will qualify for Steer of Merit. **Premium Points: 30**

Requirements for Steer of Merit:

1. **Hot Carcass Weight** - Must weigh 600 to 900 pounds.
2. **Rib-Eye Area** - Based on carcass weight, the sliding-scale requirement is derived from the USDA Yield Grade equation. The minimum rib-eye requirement using the sliding-scale method would be equal to or greater than (Hot Carcass Weight x .012) + 3.8 for carcasses up to 775 pounds and those carcasses weighing 775 and above will have the 13.1 requirement.

Hot Carcass Weight	Minimum Rib-Eye Area Requirement
600	11.0
650	11.6
700	12.2
750	12.8
775	13.1

3. **Quality Grade** - Must be low Choice or better
4. **Yield Grade** – Yield grade requirements depend on

- are reported to the tenth of a yield grade (the 1/100th decimal digit is dropped; for example: a yield grade of 2.99 is reported as a 2.9).

- Average Daily Gain** - Minimum of 2.60 pounds per day, fed a minimum of 100 days before the show.

DIVISION 50-H.....COUNTY PRIDE AWARD

JOHN P. BURKE MEMORIAL AWARD

The permanent John P. Burke Memorial Award, donated by the Ken Hartman Family, and a keeper trophy sponsored by **Get Up and Go 4-H Club** will be awarded to the Beef exhibitor who attains the highest combined score in Livestock Judging, Beef Showmanship, Rate of Gain on a Market Steer, and Placing in class with a Market Steer. If exhibitor exhibits more than one market steer, the steer with the highest combined score -rate of gain and placing- will be used. Each of the four items shall be used as 25% of the total score. Ties will be broken by the steer with the highest rate of gain.

CHAMPION BEEF CARCASS

The Kittitas County Fair will award a trophy to the top
Steer of Merit

ALL AROUND CARCASS STEER

Kittitas County Farm Bureau will sponsor a belt buckle to the steer exhibitor who attains the highest combined score in Steer Carcass placing (25%), Market Steer placing (25%), Livestock Judging (25%), and Beef Showmanship (25%). Ties will be broken by steers with the highest placing in the Steer Carcass Contest.

PHIL BLOOM CARCASS AWARD

Exhibitors of the top beef, lamb and hog carcasses shall have their names placed on a perpetual plaque displayed in the Extension Office.

COUNTY PRIDE AWARDS

County Pride Award of \$200 will be presented to the YOUTH CLUBS/FFA exhibitor with the highest placing county born and raised steer in the Market Beef division. An award of \$100 will be presented to the YOUTH CLUBS/FFA exhibitor with the second highest placing county born and raised steer in the Market Beef division.

County Pride Award of \$200 will be presented to the YOUTH CLUBS/FFA exhibitor with the highest placing county born and raised mini steer in the Market Mini Beef division.
