DIVISION 73-A DEMONSTRATION SUSAN BRYANT 509-859-3861

ONLY ONE DEMONSTRATION ALLOWED PER 4-H'ER.

1. Demonstrations are to pertain to a project carried by the 4-H'er.
2. Demonstrations may be teams or individuals. If team, the superintendent is to be notified prior to the contest.
3. This year each contestant in a team will receive total points; they will not be divided.
4. A maximum of 20 minutes is allowed for each demonstration. This includes setting up, giving the demonstration, questions, comments and removing equipment.
5. The demonstrator is to introduce himself unless prior arrangements are made with the superintendent.
6. Demonstrators will be allowed to use large live animals in their demonstrations in appropriate areas.

7. Contestants are to report to the superintendent at least 10 minutes prior to their scheduled time and if not, they are subject to disqualification.
8. You must contact the superintendent for scheduling.

CLASS 01 - COOKIE DECORATING ACTIVITY

1. Open to all 4-Hers can participate anytime between 9:00 am and Noon on Monday in the 4-H Building.
2. Each participant will be provided with the same size and shape cookie. It is up to each contestant to bring frosting, decorating equipment, coconut, sprinkles, etc., for decorating. All decorations must be edible.
3. Each participant is allowed 30 minutes and only one cookie per participant is allowed. Each participant is responsible for his or her own cleanup. Each cookie will be displayed with decorator's name during Fair

**DIVISION 73-FMYSTERY MUFFIN
ACTIVITY**

CLASS 01 - MYSTERY MUFFIN ACTIVITY

This activity was created to give those enrolled in foods project(s) the opportunity to exhibit their ability to a) follow recipe instructions and b) to prepare muffins in a safe way using techniques and good baking strategies learned during their 4-H experience.

1. This activity is open to any 4-H member currently enrolled in a foods project, with approved record book.
2. Participants may enter alone or in pairs. Pairs are allowed for 1st and 2nd year members only. Full participation points will be awarded to each participant of pair.
3. Participants will be provided with recipe, ingredients, and equipment necessary to prepare one batch of muffins. Cleanup supplies will also be furnished.
4. Participants will be allowed one hour to prepare and bake muffins.
5. Each participant is responsible for leaving kitchen area clean when finished.
6. Each 4-H member must contact one of the Superintendents prior to opening day of Fair to arrange a time on Friday, Saturday or Sunday of Fair. Friday 1-5pm, Saturday 1-6pm or Sunday 10am-6pm. The Superintendents will review the finished product with each participant. Judging will be based on preparation, use of time, cleanliness, and quality of product.

DIVISION 73-GFASHION REVUE

This event satisfies the Showmanship requirements for Clothing Projects.

1. Personal Data Sheet EMO682 (available at the extension office) must be completed & turned in to Extension Office no later than August 21st.
2. Open to all members in clothing projects but the exhibitor must be enrolled in the specific clothing project in which he or she models No limit to entries, EXCEPT, entry must be of significantly different construction detail, AND must be modeled by the exhibitor. Exhibitor is limited to up to (2) exhibits for consideration for special awards. Exhibitor must choose eligible entries on "Personal Data Sheet", which also must be modeled in the Monday Fashion Show to be eligible for special

ribbons and awards. EXCEPTION: Thrift Store Fashion Finds is open to any 4-H'er.

3. Articles must be made since last year's fair.
4. Accessories and undergarments may be made or purchased by the contestant.
5. Garments in the Fashion Revue Contest must be displayed with ribbon received at fair in the fashion revue area. A Fashion Revue garment can be entered as a clothing exhibit also.
6. Each article must have a permanently attached CARE LABEL or be accompanied by a card giving care instructions.
7. No school or FHA projects accepted.
8. Soiled articles will not be judged.
9. Judging will be held on Friday August 25th at 9:00 a.m. Location and other details will be in your entry packet with all details - available at the Extension office.

DIVISION 73-I FLAG CONTEST

4H Club or FFA Chapter flags may be entered to be displayed in the 4H building.

- The flags should be made with a 2” hem at the top and be a minimum size of 3’ x 5’ hung either vertically or horizontally and with a dowel strong enough to display the flag. Maximum size: 36 square feet.
- A flag exhibited for more than three years will not be judged for premiums or ribbons. Flags older than three years may still be displayed if clean and in good condition.
- Flags must be labeled with the year made. Bring flags to the 4H Building between 9:00 am and NOON on Monday prior to Fair. Flags will be judged at noon and hung up shortly after. Flags are to be picked up on the first Monday after Fair ends at the Extension office.

**HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST PARTICIPATION IS

Exhibitors are required to perform Herdsmanship so that animals, pens, and equipment are kept safe, clean, and attractive for the public at all times. And to ensure animals are comfortable.

- Each Club or Chapter** must have at least one exhibitor on duty representing the Club/Chapter from 10:00am to 10:00pm, Thursday through Sunday and 10:00am to 6:00pm on Monday. The 8:00pm-10:00pm time may be covered by a leader or exhibitor parent. **A CLEARLY MARKED DUTY SCHEDULE MUST BE POSTED IN EACH CLUB/CHAPTER PEN AREA FOR JUDGE’S REVIEW.**

**CLASS 05 BARN HOSTING (individual exhibitor entry)
PREMIUM POINTS: 30**

2. Every 4-H Horse member required to host the 4-H Horse Barn at the Kittitas County Fair - Labor Day Fair.
3. The 4-H Horse Barn Herdsmanship/Hosting Activity participants answer questions, promote 4-H, uphold barn rules, and keep the barn clean and attractive. Each individual 4-H horse exhibitor is to sign up for a specific time block and wear distinguishing outerwear. All 4-H horse clubs will coordinate their members sign-up times to cover all required time.
4. Each participant must make a Fair entry for this Division, sign in and out and serve a minimum of two (2) hours to receive premiums. Someone must be on duty from 8:00am through 10:00pm Thursday through Sunday and 8:00am through 6:00pm Monday.
5. **A CLEARLY MARKED DUTY SCHEDULE & SIGN IN/OUT SHEET MUST BE AVAILABLE FOR JUDGE’S REVIEW.**

Herdsmanship Scores

1. Stall card **15 pts.**
 - a. Stall Cards must be in place by 8:00pm on Wednesday and will be judged once Thursday morning, this score will remain constant. Stall card’s must be clear, neat, and legible.
2. Cleanliness and neatness of stalls and pens. **30 pts.**
3. Exhibitor-Attentiveness, Appearance, and Conduct **20 pts.**
 - a. All exhibitors on barn duty must be dressed neatly in long pants, closed toed shoes and a long or short sleeved shirt of Club/Chapter shirt. No cut offs, tank tops, flip-flops or clothing representing alcohol, drugs, gang affiliation or sexually explicit message or obscenities are allowed.
4. Cleanliness and grooming of exhibits. **20 pts.**

5. Arrangement, neatness, and safety of show equipment and supplies. **15 pts.**
 - a. This includes tack rooms, blocking chute and carding areas, and aisles.

**DIVISION 73-Z BARN DECORATIONS
Superintendent:**

Barn Decorations are to be entered by 4-H/GRANGE or FFA CHAPTERS ONLY, not individual exhibitors.

1. If a club decorates more than one project area, the judge will include all areas on one club/chapter score sheet, clubs or FFA should be sure to use one theme throughout. **All Chapters need to enter each class where animals are entered by that club, so judge can include all areas entered by each club.**
2. Display Club or FFA name to be viewed from both barn directions-possibly at both ends of barn section.
3. Please indicate average age of club members.
