ENTRY INFORMATION

LOT 1. SHOWMANSHIP (see Showmanship Rules)

All age divisions based on age as of October 1 of the previous fair year.

Class 1. First Year Showman – 8-10 and never shown species before

Class 2. Junior – 8-10

Class 3. Intermediate – 11-13

Class 4. Senior – 14-18

LOT 2. CLUB OR CHAPTER HERD

Each club/group or chapter may show one group of three steers owned by two or more members. Animals judged on conformation, fleshing, and uniformity of size and quality.

Class 5. Club or Chapter Herd

LOT 3. BREEDING STOCK

Open, 4-H, FFA—Please Specify Breed

CLASS 6. Two year old bull; calved between Jan 1st and Aug 31st year before last

CLASS 7. Senior Yearling Bull; calved between Sept 1st and Dec 31st last year

CLASS 8. Junior Yearling Bull; calved between Jan 1st and Apr 30th last year

CLASS 9. Summer Yearling Bull; calved between May 1st and Aug 31st last year

CLASS 10. Senior Bull Calf; calved between Sept 1st and Dec 31st last year

CLASS 11. Junior Bull Calf; calved after Jan 1st of current year

CLASS 12. Junior Steer Calf; calved after Jan 1st of current year

CLASS 13. Mature Cow; must have calved

CLASS 14. Two Year Old Cow; calved between Jan 1st and Aug 31st year before last

CLASS 15. Senior Yearling Heifer; calved between Sept 1st and Dec 31st last year

CLASS 16. Junior Yearling Heifer; calved between Jan 1st and Apr 30th last year

CLASS 17. Summer Yearling Heifer; calved between May 1st and Aug 31st last year

CLASS 18. Senior Heifer Calf; calved between Sept 1st and Dec 31st last year

CLASS 19. Junior Heifer Calf; calved after Jan 1st of current year

CLASS 20. Get of Sire; 4 animals, both sexes represented, by one sire

CLASS 21. Pair of Yearlings; 1 yearling bull and 1 yearling heifer

- CLASS 22. Pair of Calves; 1 bull calf and 1 heifer calf
- CLASS 23 . Cow / Calf Pair; cow and her off-spring of any age
- CLASS 24 – Pen of Four; 4 feeder steers

LOT 4. MARKET BEEF

Open, 4-H, FFA—Please Specify Breed

A pair of two steers shown by two different exhibitors in a Market class who were bred by the same breeder. Breeder must be Klickitat County resident for a minimum of five years. Steers must be from a natural selection breeding program (not artificial insemination). Breeder should be present during class showing.

Second and third place trophies sponsored by Craig and Donna Schuster. Trophies to be presented at the annual Livestock Growers Banquet.

SIXTY LIVESTOCK CARCASS AWARD: Sixty Livestock / Karla Nolen will award cash prizes to the top three carcass steers sold through the market stock sale. First place: \$75; Second place: \$50; Third place: \$25

KLICKITAT COUNTY LIVESTOCK GROWERS MEMORIAL STEER AWARD: Applications for award will be handed out to exhibitors during beef pre-show. A beef department committee will review applications and choose (and announce) award winner during fair.
