manager's report letter

2019 was a year full of exciting changes, some may have been seen and others barely noticed, yet all helped us become more functional in our daily operations. It is always nerve-racking when you decide to make change but without change, we cannot progress. We held true to our goals and kept sight of our mission while bringing about change that helped us move into an all-out record-breaking year.

From our number of fairgoers, to the number of interim events held, we took all records from the year before and shattered them. Throughout the year we kept up the good

work we started in 2017, continuing to further gain on ADA compliance and deffered maintenance. Thanks to many of our community partners we are able to accomplish so much while still remaining frugal. We spent many hours and worked with multiple companies to help bring about changes in 2019 that would make us more effective and efficient for the future.

Last year brought in over 300,000 visitors to the fairgrounds who attended one or more events held here or who choose to stay at the new RV Park along their summer journeys. Each weekend brought new life to the facility and brought new people into our community. Our interim event numbers were higher than ever proving our community truly has chosen the Kootenai County Fairgrounds as their gathering place.

Between events we still managed to find time to continue our efforts on ADA improvements and deferred maintenance. These projects all created improved lighting, accessibility and infrastructure throughout the facility. With the installation of fiber optics thanks to our great community partners, we are now more connected than ever! Just when we thought we were moving along the project list pretty good, Mother Nature decided to redirect our focus. It only took a moment for a major windstorm to rip the top of the Silver Buckle Club off and toss it across the Findlay Arena. With help from the North Idaho Fair & Rodeo Foundation we were able to ask for emergency funding to construct a permanent structure over the top of our Silver Buckle Club platform just before opening the Fair.

The Fair came with much anticipation. We spend over a year planning each Fair and this year, change was the name of the game. We brought in a new ticketing company and jumped into the digital age with both feet. We listened to the voices of our fair patrons and contracted a new carnival company, changed parking patterns, layouts, and offered a wider variety of entertainment than ever before. With all the changes to implement we are proud to say we have never had a better fair! We were up in attendance, carnival, food sales, parking and admission. A packed house for the concert, rodeos and demo derby each day, breaking each record from years before. Our 4-H program has grown to be the largest in the state and their support is astonishing. It is clear we are providing our community an event the whole family can enjoy, and we work hard to make the experience better each year. With International recognition on our 2019 North Idaho State Fair we are honored to create a fair rooted in tradition yet still aiming to grow to new heights!

Looking back on 2019 we are proud of our accomplishments. Much was done and many records were broke yet again, but we certainly will not stop here. With a very successful 2019 in the books we look ahead to clearly see what all 2020 holds, and we do it with excitement!

GIVING BACK TO OUR COMMUNITY

Did you know, over \$200,000 in earning and/ or savings went to area non-profits from hosting events at the fairgrounds. \$95,401 of that was earned during the 2019 North Idaho State Fair through food booths and services.

PROVIDING MEALS

At the 2019 North Idaho State Fair \$61,239 was donated from the livestock sale in meat to local non-profits. In fact, the Children's Village received enough meat to feed the kids for a year!

4-H PROGRAM SUPPORT

In 2019, 204 local businesses and individuals provided \$855,260 that went back to more than 300 local 4-H members who participated in market animal project, many of which buy their feed and supplies locally.

FARM TO TABLE DAY

Annually, nearly 1,200 Kootenai County 5th grade students participate in a hands-on agriculture education field trip at the Fairgrounds, where they learn just how their food gets from the farm to their tables.

SUMMER SERVICE DAY

Each year volunteers form North Idaho roll up their sleeves and help tackle projects at the Fairgrounds to help keep the grounds beautiful and looking fresh!

GEM STATE STAMPEDE RODEO COMMITTEE

Each year, the GSS Rodeo Committee volunteers time to run a rough stock rodeo clinic to help train upcoming contestants and continue the sports growth here in the Northwest.

RV PARK

Did you know, thorugh the resourceful efforts of the Fair Board and staff, over \$1.2 million in capital improvements have occurred on the facility since 2017? Funds solely provided by grant funding and community support!

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Through the continuous efforts of the North Idaho Fair Foundation \$65,000 in scholarships have been awarded to outstanding youth in North Idaho!

CANCER CARE SUPPORT

Since the inception of Chicks N Chaps here at the North Idaho State Fair over \$170,000 has been raised. Over \$86,000 of that has been donated to Kootenai Health Foundation for their Cancer Support Fund to help local families.
