manager's report letter



As we close another year at the North Idaho State Fairgrounds, it's with immense pride and gratitude that I reflect on our accomplishments and the hurdles we've overcome. The year 2022 was nothing short of exceptional, setting new benchmarks and continuing our tradition of excellence and community service.

Record-Breaking Attendance & Engagements

We witnessed a remarkable attendance of 168,567 at the fair, surpassing all previous records and showcasing the unwavering support of our community and visitors. Our diverse array of events, including the Gem State Stampede, educational programs, and the RV park improvements, have not only entertained but also enriched our community. Special acknowledgments to our fair board, staff, and the Gem State Stampede Committee for their dedication and hard work.

Community Impact and Initiatives

Our commitment to giving back has been stronger than ever, with over \$260,000 in earnings and savings directed to local nonprofits. Our support for the 4-H Program, farm-to-table educational initiatives, and cancer care support highlight our deep connection to our community's welfare. The RV Park's enhancements, funded through grants and community support, totaling over \$1.8 million since 2017, demonstrate our dedication to improving our facilities for all users.

Financial Growth and Sustainability

KOOTENAI COUNTY RV PARK GRANT FUNDING CONTINUES

2022 marked the fourth full year of our RV Park being fully operational and the addition of 14 new spaces. Funding for this project has been received through the Idaho State Parks & Recreation RV Grant and matching funds have been provided by the Fair Board and Fair Foundation.

To date \$1,890,151 has been invested into the development of the RV Park through these sources.

GIVING BACK TO OUR COMMUNITY

Did you know, over \$260,000 in earning and/ or savings went to area non-profits from hosting events at the fairgrounds. \$224,086 of that was earned during the 2021 North Idaho State Fair through food booths and services.

4-H PROGRAM SUPPORT

In 2022, 98 local businesses and individuals provided \$1,012,636 that went back to more than 300 local 4-H members who participated in market animal projects, many of which buy their feed and supplies locally. Of the 364 animals sold, over \$30,000 was donated to area non-profits and food banks for meat.

FARM TO TABLE DAY

Annually, nearly 1800 Kootenai County 5th grade students participate in a hands-on agriculture education field trip at the Fairgrounds, where they learn just how their food gets from the farm to their tables.

GEM STATE STAMPEDE RODEO COMMITTEE

Each year, the GSS Rodeo Committee volunteers time to run a rough stock rodeo clinic to help train upcoming contestants and continue the sports growth here in the Northwest.

RV PARK

Did you know through the resourceful efforts of the Fair Board and Staff, over \$1.8 million in capital improvements have occurred on the facility since 2017. Funds solely provided by grant funding and community support!

CONTINUING EDUCATION

Through the continuous efforts of the North Idaho Fair Foundation \$115,000 in scholarships have been awarded to outstanding youth in North Idaho!

CANCER CARE SUPPORT

Since the inception of Chicks N Chaps here at the North Idaho State Fair over \$300,000 has been raised. Over \$140,000 of that has been donated to Kootenai Health Foundation for their Cancer Support Fund to help local families. In 2022 the North Idaho Fair and Rodeo Foundation gave \$42k to Kootenai Health's Cancer Support Fund.
