6th Annual Cowboy Ball Raises Over \$76,000

The 6th Annual Cowboy Ball went off without a hitch on April 7, 2017!

The North Idaho Fair and Rodeo Foundation's premier fundraiser was a success, once again, thanks to all of the sponsors in attendance and to all of the volunteers who helped organize the event. Overall, the event raised \$76,419 for the Foundation. These funds will be used for capital improvements on the Fairgrounds as well as to provide scholarships to local youth.

2016 Gem State Stampede & Extreme Bulls

The 2016 Gem State Stampede at the North Idaho State Fair proved to be one of the best on record. Sellout crowds for the Extreme Bulls on Thursday night and the rodeo Friday and Saturday night were not disappointed.

On Thursday afternoon, the Gem State Stampede welcomed the Women's Professional Rodeo breakaway roping for the 2nd consecutive year. This event was free and a great opportunity for our Women ropers to compete for prize money and other awards including a beautiful buckle to the winner.

Thursday night's Extreme Bulls was exciting. The sellout crowd got to witness 12 Cowboys make the whistle in the long round with Garrett Smith winning the round with an 86.5 score. Dallee Mason won the short round with an 88 point ride and




PRCA NFR and PBR World Finals cowboy Shane Proctor won the average. The Gem State Stampede Rodeo Committee put in new metal bucking chutes which were a big hit for the bull riders and stock contractors.

The actual PRCA rodeo started on Friday and concluded on Sunday with multiple PRCA NFR contestants and World Champions coming to Coeur d'Alene to compete for over \$68,000 in prize money. A few of the highlights of the weekend



included Tyler Waguespack placing in the Steer Wrestling. Tyler went on to win the PRCA World Championship at the 2016 NFR. In the Team Roping, Ellensburg cowboys Riley and Brady Minor won the event with a time of 4.0 seconds. Riley and Brady went on to the NFR and won the American in Fort Worth this February. Canadian's Levi Simpson and Jeremy Buhler placed second at the rodeo catapulting their 2016 NFR appearance and World Championship. Jesse James Kirby won the Saddle Bronc riding with a score of 78.5 on Flying Diamond's Dust Bowl. The 2017 American Rodeo Champion Cody Demoss won 2nd with a score of 78 points. The Tie Down roping included multiple NFR cowboys including Tyson Durfey who went on to win the 2016 PRCA World Championship at last year's NFR. Paul David Tierney won the event with a time of 7.7 seconds. Rodeo fans got to witness two consecutive record times in the barrel racing with NFR qualifier Jana Bean winning with a time of 17.7 seconds. Former World Champion Mary Walker placed second with (at the time) a record time of 17.23 seconds to place 2nd. The bull riding featured multiple NFR cowboys with Mike Sparks winning the event. Multiple fast times in the barrel racing were the result of the work the rodeo committee put into improving



the ground for the cowgirls. Jana Bean went on Rural Radio with Announcer Steve Kenyon and complimented the rodeo committee and the ground saying it was the best track she has seen at our rodeo.

Through the years, the Gem State Stampede Rodeo Committee has been dedicated to producing the family event of a Professional rodeo during the North Idaho State Fair, as well as, hosting and promoting junior rodeos and clinics throughout the region to encourage participation in rodeo. The committee is now stepping up its efforts by introducing a Bareback & Saddle Bronc Rodeo Clinic with the intent of giving local youth the chance to learn these rodeo events from the ground up. This clinic will give a comprehensive look at the fundamentals of the sport and allow the students to learn the correct way from successful rodeo cowboys. The committee's hope is to create an opportunity for local youth to join the sport of rodeo and pursue the western sports lifestyle. Youth 13 and older showing interest and desire to learn the rodeo sport of Bareback and Saddle Bronc riding are eligible to participate. 8-time NFR qualifier, Ryan Gray, along with local favorite, Jed Mckinlay, will lead the bare back portion of the clinic. Saddle Bronc instructor(s) will be announced soon. The schedule will be released shortly.
