Chicks n Chaps is a women-only rodeo clinic and FUNdraiser that brings together two powerhouse foundations working to provide a fun and edu-

taining event for 150 women. Proceeds from Chicks n Chaps at the Gem State Stampede benefit the Kootenai Health Foundation's Cancer & Patient Support Fund bringing real financial support to local cancer patients by providing gas cards to get to treatments or paying for an electric bill. The other beneficiary is our North Idaho Fair & Rodeo Foundation which provides educational opportunities at the Fairgrounds and funding for capital improvements on the property. To date over \$170,000.00 has been raised through the event and distributed locally between the two organizations.

Tables of eight are available now for \$750 or \$1000 (with an additional sponsorship piece). Women receive admission to the Fair, preferred rodeo seating, lunch provided by Texas Roadhouse, t-shirt, swag bag and fun and games throughout the afternoon. We find friends who gather to purchase a table for a "girls day out," or a bachelorette party. Businesses purchase tables to recognize clients or vendors or staff.
