

OKC Fairgrounds – Open Up & Recover Safely Plan



The Nation, the State of Oklahoma, and the City of Oklahoma City are under emergency orders due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Under the amended emergency order issued by the City of Oklahoma City on May 15, 2020, the OKC Fairgrounds will resume modified operations under the applicable issued guidelines. The OKC Fairgrounds are managed by Oklahoma State Fair, Inc. (OSF)

OSF and its promoters/licenseses are subject to all government issued health and safety regulations, guidelines and emergency orders both now and in the future.

This may include future modification, postponement, rescheduling or cancellation of any ongoing event or future events.

Equine Show Policies:

- Maintain between six (6) to eight (8) feet of social distancing.
- No clusters of more than fifty (50) people, in one area.
- Twenty (20) horses in arena on the rail during classes (6' - 8' distance = 280 sq. ft. for horse and rider in arena. 280 sq. ft. equals a 14' x 20' per unit area).
- Breed Show and Rail Classes will need to limit arena capacity accordingly.
- Farms and ranches (not normally a neighbor) to have at least one (1) stall between each other on barn charts (a minimum of 10').
- Vendor booths must maintain a minimum of 10' apart.
- No back to back booths.

- Producer should instruct, via their vendor packets, that no gathering of more than three (3) people per vendor is allowed at any one time. Trailer Vendors should limit to two (2) guests inside a trailer at a time.
- No vendors should be placed inside the Barn Complex.
- Show offices should minimize lines and maintain a three (3) person maximum allowed in office, for service, at a time.
- RV Office will have a sign on the door stating one (1) person in the office for check-in at a time.
- Feed and Bedding will mark the retail floor for appropriate social distancing.
- Promoters and their staff must understand, if they are not feeling well, they must not come to work and to stay at home until they are cleared by a physician. Employees must self-check prior to reporting to work and management must follow-up with employees on a daily basis.
- Staff must comply with OSHA standards on bloodborne pathogens and disposal of waste. Management is responsible for insuring all employees understand and follow these standards.
- Custodial Staff to follow CDC Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) guidelines for Cleaning and Disinfecting Your Facility (a copy is attached). In particular, segments from the Practices for Cleaning and Disinfecting section will be used.
- Insure that our Custodial Staff understands the appropriate use of cleaning and disinfecting chemicals and has access to gloves if they want to use them along with a mask and if necessary, safety glasses.

These policies are subject to revision and or cancellation at anytime at the sole discretion of OSF, Inc.
