NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.

2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.

3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.

4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drugs. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event, which culminates with the animal entering the food chain, shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statues, regulations, and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event.

If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested (by the approved laboratory to which it is sent) is the one taken from the animal in question. Its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise at any hearing in regard to the matter conducted by the fair or livestock show.

At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural

contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair, or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show against such individuals published in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

The deadline to submit Record Books is March 17, 2025, from 5-8 PM. Record Books not submitted by the deadline will result in exhibitor disqualification and forfeiture of premiums in this program.

RECORD BOOK GUIDELINES

It is suggested that a copy of the record book be made for use as a "work copy" and the information be transferred to a 'final copy" to be submitted to the Fair.

- All non market record books will be accepted AS IS at the Record Book Turn In. Record books will be reviewed
 and any exhibitor submitting an incomplete record book will <u>RECEIVE A ZERO AND</u> will be notified along with their
 Leader/Advisor. Any record book deemed incomplete will forfeit the exhibitor from participation & show at the
 Lake County Fair.
- Record Books MUST be labeled in the top right corner on the front of the folder, to include the exhibitor's name, age division, and animal species. Record books that are not labeled properly will result in a 10-point deduction from the overall total.
- Place the Record Book inside the prongs of a 2 prong or 3 prong folders <u>WITH POCKETS</u>. No 3 ring binders or page protectors.
- Only one book per exhibitor/per species. If you have more than one animal species in this fair, you must have a separate Record Book for each of those species.
- Completed Record Book must include Printed Photos of your Current Project Year.
- Always double check your work, especially your math calculations.
- Your final record book <u>MUST</u> be handwritten in <u>PENCIL</u> by the EXHIBITOR. Exceptions will be made on signature pages. No computerized books or record books written in pen will be accepted.
- Record books must be complete at the time of submission. Parents and advisors/leaders are responsible for reviewing for completeness prior to signing.
- Exhibitors will be in age divisions: Junior, Intermediate and Senior. Refer to the premium book to determine age definitions.
- Your record book should begin at the purchase or start of your project.
- Attach to the end of this book, in the order listed, the following documents:
 - Bill of Sale
 - Copy of letter sent to potential buyers.
 - Copy of example letter to be sent to award sponsor.
 - Copy of example letter of thanks to be sent to your buyer.
- If there are any issues regarding record books or an entry, it will be the exhibitor's responsibility to provide proof of registration. (ShoWorks Receipt)

PROJECT INVENTORY

An inventory, at the start and the close of the project, is a necessary part of the record keeping. It is a record of everything you have before you start your project, those items you purchase or receive (items given or donated still have a value) during your project and what you have on hand at the end of the project. Beginning inventory values are either: 1) the amount paid, or the estimated value if donated and, 2) in those cases where equipment was not purchased, but was already on hand, the estimated market value, or your ending value from previous year.
