GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

The Board of Directors of the Latah County Fair have endeavored to make this Fair representative of the agricultural interests, as well as the growing number of other interests, in Latah County, and to provide wholesome entertainment for the patrons. The board welcomes suggestions for improving the Fair. Plan to attend the Fair and pass along a good word. Exhibit your products and suggest your neighbors do the same.

ENTRIES, ENTRY FORMS, AND FEES

- Entries, unless stated in Special Rules, are open to residents of the Palouse region.
- All exhibits must be entered by & released through respective department superintendents.
- All exhibits are under the control and direction of the Fair Board, Fair Staff and superintendents while on exhibition.
- Management reserves the right to limit entries to facilities available, & to limit the number of entries of an exhibitor.
- Entries must be in place and must be removed only at the times specified; any exception to this rule shall be at the discretion of Management.
- **Exhibits will be released at 5:00 p.m. Sunday**
- **All animal entries must turn in an official entry form by August 1. Animal entry forms are available at: www.latahcountyfair.com and in the Fair Office.**
- General entries require an entry tag to be filled out at time of entry. Premiums and awards can not be awarded to incomplete entry tags

Return address labels are recommended for entry tags.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- Anyone attending the Latah County Fair either as an exhibitor, relative, spectator, superintendent, judge or Fair official must conduct themselves in a manner that demonstrates the utmost respect for all other Fair attendees. They are to follow all rules and regulations outlined in the Fair book and by judges, superintendents and Fair officials.

EXHIBITS AND EXHIBITORS

- Management reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered if it is deemed objectionable in any way, or requires excessive space.
- Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Latah County Fair Board from and against all claims for damage to persons/property caused by them or by their exhibits.
- Exhibitor names and exhibit photos may be published.
- Management will take reasonable precautions to insure safety of exhibits while on the grounds, but will in no way be responsible for loss, damage, theft or injury of any kind to exhibits or exhibitors.
- Exhibitors found in violation of rules, or in practices unethical or adverse to the Latah County Fair, shall be penalized by forfeiture of awards and/or privileges.

JUDGING

- All classes and sections shall be judged under the Danish System of Judging unless another system is specifically indicated.
- A judge shall disqualify or transfer to the correct section any exhibit or animal which is not a true representative of the class or section in which it is entered.

- A judge may disqualify any exhibit not of show quality.
- No person attending the Fair shall criticize or interfere with judges, sponsors, Fair officials, or exhibits at any time during the Fair. Violators may be excluded immediately from the event and/or the fairgrounds and may be subject to further penalties, including cancellation of awards and loss of future Fair privileges.
- It is understood that the act of entering an exhibit or contest at the Latah County Fair is asking the Fair Management and Department Staff to secure a qualified judge to place a judgement on the exhibit or performance. It is therefore courteous to gracefully accept the decision of the judge, realizing that it may be in conflict with your set of standards. Every reasonable effort will be made to secure highly qualified and conscientious judges. If you feel you are not willing to accept this judgement, please write "exhibit only" on your entry. The decision of the judge is final. Any concerns should be directed to the Superintendent of the Division.
- Protests may be filed by exhibitors in writing to the Latah County Fair Board within 24 hours of the judging. Protests must be accompanied by a \$20 deposit, a sum which may be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests shall be adjudicated by the Fair Management.

RIBBONS

- All exhibits are judged for initial quality and ribbons are awarded as follows: Blue is the best followed by Red, White or Green.
- All the Blue Ribbon exhibits in a class are judged again and ribbons are awarded as follows: Best of Class is best followed by Silver then Bronze.
- All Best of Class exhibits are again judged and one Best of Show ribbon is awarded per show.

AWARDS

AWARDS MAY VARY FROM BOOK LISTING.

- No more than one money award per class will be allowed per exhibitor, unless otherwise stated.
- Only the judges' results as recorded in the official entry books will be used as evidence for payment of awards. Ribbons and tags will not be accepted.
- Premiums are paid in this order for youth and adult divisions. Best of Class, Silver, Bronze
- Awards donated by our Fair sponsors are given to Best of Show winners, some Best of Class winners, or the sponsor's choice.
- Sponsored awards may vary from book listings.
- 2019 Premiums will be PAID IN CASH from the Fair Office during Fair. Friday 12pm to 6pm, Saturday 11am to 6pm, Sunday 1pm to 5pm and the week after Fair from 9am to 1pm. NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED. All premiums or prizes not picked up by October 11, 2019 will be donated back to the Fairgrounds.

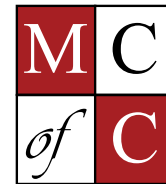

YOUTH Tasty Toaster Tarts

INGREDIENTS

Crust:

- 2 cups King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup (16 tablespoons) unsalted butter, cut into pats
- 1 large egg
- 2 tablespoons milk

Filling:

- 1/2 cup brown sugar, packed
- 4 teaspoons King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 large egg, to brush on pastry before filling
- Topping (optional)
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon

DIRECTIONS

1. To make the dough: Whisk together the flour, sugar, and salt. Work in the butter until the mixture holds together when you squeeze it, with pecan-sized lumps of butter still visible. Mix the egg and milk, and add it to the dough, mixing just until everything is cohesive.
2. Divide the dough in half. Shape each half into a rough 3" x 5" rectangle, smoothing the edges. Wrap in plastic or waxed paper, and refrigerate for 30 minutes; this will relax the gluten and firm up the dough a bit, making it easier to roll. You can also refrigerate the dough for up to 2 days; let it rest for 15 to 20 minutes at room temperature before you roll it out.
3. To make the filling: Whisk together the brown sugar, flour, and cinnamon.
4. To assemble the tarts: Place one piece of the dough on a generously floured work surface, and roll it into a rectangle about 1/8" thick, large enough that you can trim it to an even 9" x 12". Trim off the edges; place the scraps on a baking sheet, and set them aside, along with the 9" x 12" rectangle of dough.
5. Roll the second piece of dough just as you did the first. Press the edge of a ruler into the dough you've just rolled, to gently score it in thirds lengthwise and width-wise; you'll see nine 3" x 4" rectangles.
6. Beat the egg, and brush it over the entire surface of the dough. Place a heaping tablespoon of filling into the center of each marked rectangle. Place the second sheet of dough atop the first, using your fingertips or a chopstick to press firmly around each pocket of filling, sealing the dough well on all sides.
7. Press the tines of a fork (or the chopstick) all around the edge of the rectangle. Cut the dough evenly in between the filling mounds to make nine tarts. Press the cut edges with your fingers to seal, then press with a fork or chopstick to seal again.
8. Gently place the tarts on a lightly greased or parchment-lined baking sheet. Prick the top of each tart multiple times with a fork; you want to make sure steam can escape, or the tarts will become billowy pillows rather than flat toaster pastries. Sprinkle the tarts with cinnamon-sugar, if desired. Refrigerate them, uncovered, for 30 minutes.
9. Preheat your oven to 350°F.
10. Remove the tarts from the fridge, and bake them for 30 to 35 minutes, until they're a light golden brown. Remove them from the oven, and allow them to cool on the pan.
11. Store on the counter for up to 2 days, or freeze for up to a month.

Yield: 9 tarts. Bring 4 tarts for judging.

ADULT Mashed Potato Doughnuts

INGREDIENTS

Doughnuts:

- 2 1/2 cups King Arthur Unbleached All-Purpose Flour
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 cup vegetable shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 3/4 cup mashed potato
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 1/2 quarts (3 pounds) lard, shortening, or vegetable oil, for frying

Coating:

- Granulated sugar or cinnamon sugar, for coating

DIRECTIONS

1. Sift together the flour, baking soda, salt, baking powder, and nutmeg. Set aside.
2. In a separate bowl, cream together the shortening and sugar. Add the eggs and mashed potatoes to the shortening mix.
3. Measure out the milk. Add the flour mixture and milk alternately to the creamed mixture, beginning and ending with the flour mixture.
4. The resulting dough will be quite soft, more like a drop-biscuit dough instead of a "rollable" dough. The dough can be covered and refrigerated overnight, if desired.
5. Turn the dough out onto a very well floured surface and knead a few times to make it stiff enough to roll with a rolling pin. Roll the dough using a well-floured rolling pin until it's about 1/2" thick. Dip a doughnut cutter in flour (each time you cut), and cut out the doughnuts. Save the holes; or re-roll them with leftover dough. Try to handle the dough as little as possible; the less you work the dough, the more tender the doughnuts will be.
6. Heat the fat to 365°F. Test the temperature with a thermometer; or with a slice of bread, as follows: lower half a slice of bread into the hot fat. If it takes 1 minute for the bottom side to brown nicely, the fat is at the best temperature for frying doughnuts.
7. Fry doughnuts about 2 minutes on each side or until golden brown. Drain on brown paper bags or paper towels. Check one of the fried donuts after it is cooled to be sure the center is cooked through.
8. While still warm, shake doughnuts in cinnamon-sugar or plain granulated sugar.

Yield: About 2 dozen doughnuts (plus holes). Bring 4 for judging.

All specimens must be fresh, untreated plant material grown by the exhibitor in the Palouse Region. Entry Limit of One Per Class/Section per Exhibitor. The Flower Show Committee reserves the right to subdivide or add sections if the number of entries warrants.

Conditioning. Water your plants early in the day and cut specimens in early evening for best quality. Place in tepid water and store in cool dark place for several hours.

Judges may open any jar for inspection; however, if other visible characteristics of product eliminate the product from consideration of award, the judge is not obligated to open for further evaluation.

All entries in this department must have been completed by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair to be eligible for special awards. Items which have been show at previous Fairs are not eligible.

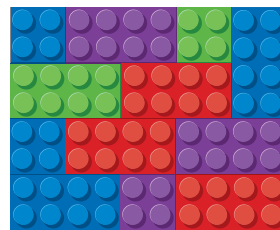

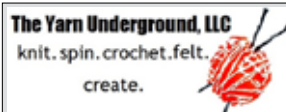

1. Exhibitor must be enrolled in the current 4-H year through the Latah County 4-H program and have paid annual member dues to be eligible to compete. 4-H members may enter an exhibit for each project carried.
2. All 4-H projects exhibits shall be completed as outlined in the "Idaho 4-H Project" Requirement.
3. All entries must be properly labeled.
4. Record books displayed as a part of the exhibit MUST be signed by an authorized leader and parent.

4-H General Projects

General 4-H Projects are due in the 4-H area of the Palouse Ice Rink Wednesday from 3:00pm – 7:00pm.

4-H Livestock Projects

1. Unless otherwise specified, all breeds in all categories will compete in Quality and Fitting and Showing Classes. Members must compete in Fitting and Showing to complete the project.
 - a. Quality: Animals will be judged and shown according to breed characteristics. Quality classes for market animals will be based upon weight of the animal.

- b. Fitting and Showing: Members are judged on fitting of the animal, training of the animal, and appearance of the exhibitor. Fitting and Showing classes will be based upon the exhibitor's age as of January 1 of the current year. If further classes are needed, the exhibitor's experience will be considered. Age divisions are as follows:

- (1) Junior - 8 to 10 years old
- (2) Intermediate - 11 to 13 years old
- (3) Senior - 14 to 18 years old

2. A completed and signed Market Animal livestock record book is due to the Extension Mobile Office from 2:00 – 4:00 pm on Sunday.

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR RULES

1. All animals must remain at the Fair until 5pm Sunday
2. Livestock exhibitors may remove chutes and large tack boxes before 8am or after 5pm on Sunday
3. Take down, including decorations, may not start until 4:30pm
4. No vehicles or trailers may enter the grounds between 8am and 5pm on Sunday
5. No campers may leave until 5pm on Sunday.

LIVESTOCK CARE

1. All animals must be fed and watered at least 2 times per day.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for all their animals care until close of fair at 5:00 p.m. Sunday.
3. Animal pens or stalls must be kept clean.
4. Animals NOT PROPERLY cared for may be sent home and premiums forfeited.
5. Exhibitors NOT PROPERLY caring for their animals will not be allowed to enter future livestock projects.
6. Sheep and goats should not be washed without permission from their superintendent.

Market Animal Sales Rules & Regulations

1. All consignors must be enrolled in a Latah County 4-H club or be a member of a FFA vocational agriculture department in Latah County. Only one market project may be sold by each consignor.
2. All animals sold must have an initial weight and been carried as a project for the length of time listed for each animal in the 4-H and FFA project requirement in order to be considered complete. No initial weight for swine.
3. The number of market animals accepted and the order of sale will be determined by the 4-H and FFA Market Animal Sale Board of Directors.
4. Market projects to be sold must be weighed the Wednesday of fair on certified scales at the Fairgrounds.

Market Swine: 6:00 - 11:00 a.m.

Market Beef: 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.

Market Sheep/Goat: 1:00 - 2:00 p.m.

Re-weights must be requested and take place immediately after 1st weigh

No Late Weigh-Ins

All selling weights of livestock must meet the following restrictions to be sold through the 4-H and FFA Market Animal Sale. (Beef, sheep, swine, & goats over the listed maximum weight will sell at the maximum weight)

Beef: weight 1050-1500 lbs.

Lambs: weight 110-150 lbs.

Goats: weight 70-120 lbs.

Swine: weight 230-290 lbs.

5. All youth must complete and turn in a Latah County Market Animal Sale Consignment Form and Latah County 4-H/FFA Commitment to Excellence form. These must be turned in to the Fair Office with camper and livestock registration forms by August 1st.
6. Animals entered in the sale must have been entered and judged for quality in the 4-H or FFA Division of the Latah County Fair.
7. Animals consigned to the Latah County Fair Market Animal Sale will be solely consigned to this sale.
8. The 4-H and FFA Market Animal Sale will be held at 9:00 AM, Saturday.
9. All sales are final.
10. Add on support money will be accepted for one week following the sale.
11. Market beef project animals must have Brand Inspection papers, Hauling Permits and Bill of Sale to present to the Superintendent prior to weigh-in.

Livestock 4-H & FFA Quality Show

Show groups will at the discretion of the Superintendents, 4-H Director, and Fair Management and dependent on entry numbers. Market animals not making minimum weight will only show in an exhibition class and receive a participation ribbon only.

BEEF

All cattle must be doubled tied when in the barn with rope halters and neck ropes. NO chain halters or neck chains. Only de-horned or naturally polled cattle will be eligible to show. Horns over 2 inches from the skin at the base of the horn to the tip will be disqualified. Straight bred dairy steers, stags, and cryptorchids are not eligible.

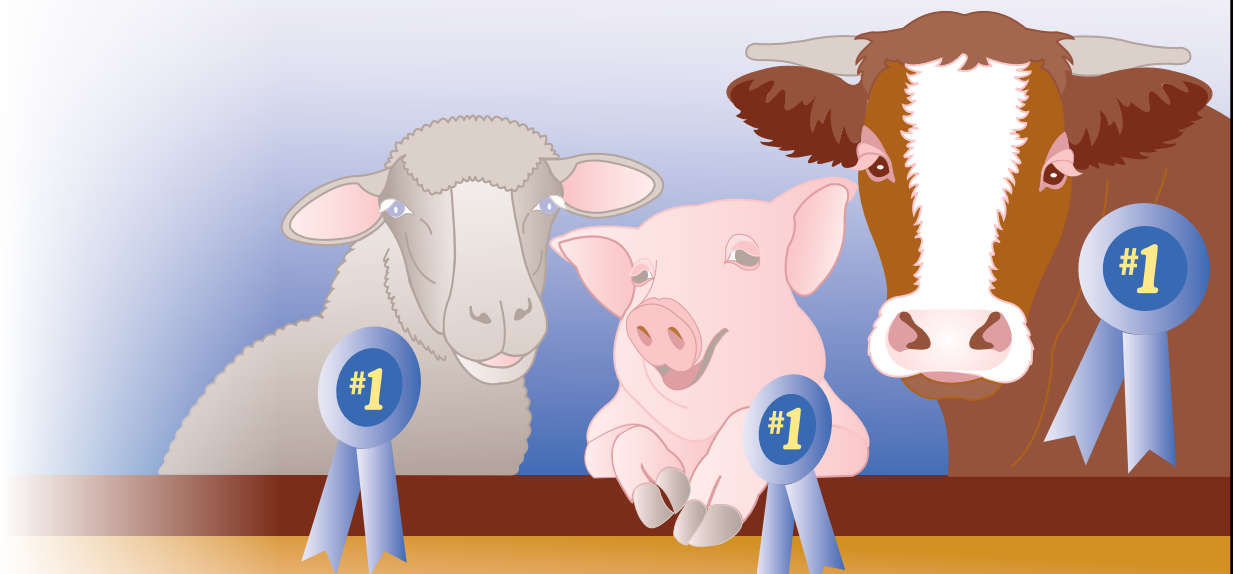
