Commissioner Eidson made comments in regards to the graduating classes of 2021.


Commissioner Sena made comments in regards to a Hobbs High graduate that received a full ride to Norte Dame last year has now received a summer internship.

The Lea County Board of County Commissioners created the Lea County Planning and Zoning Board.




Consideration of Lea County Resolution No. 21-JUN-119R Approving the Creation of New Precincts and Adjusting Precinct Boundaries




Pursuant to Section 1-3-5A NMSA (1978), it is the duty of the Board of County Commissioners by resolution to create, divide, abolish, combine or adjust the boundaries of any precincts as necessary to meet the requirements of the Election Code as well as the legal and constitutional requirements for redistricting.

It has been determined by the County Clerk that the 2019 amendments to the Election Code require that five new precincts be created in the County, and that the creation of those new precincts should take effect January 1, 2022, since the new precincts would have no impact on current district boundaries.

It has been determined by the County Clerk that the 2019 amendments to the Election Code require adjustments to the boundaries of existing precincts, but that the adjustments to those precinct boundaries should take effect January 1, 2022 since the adjustments would have no impact upon current district boundaries.






Precinct 23 is split along W Caprock St. The new precinct is currently named "23 North" but will be changed to a whole number of the clerk's choosing.




The New Mexico Statutes Annotated 1978, Section 1-3-2 (2019) requires that in June or July of the odd-numbered year, the Board of County Commissioners shall by resolution designate polling places.

The Board of County Commissioners finds that each polling place designated in this resolution complies with the provisions of NMSA 1978, Section 1-3-7 (2019), titled Polling Places.

The Board of County Commissioners finds that those precincts that are consolidated to create Voting Convenience Centers meet the requirements of NMSA 1978, Section 1-3-4 (2015), will be available to voters of any precinct in the county to cast a vote at the Voting Convenience Center, will make voting more convenient and accessible to voters of the consolidated precinct, will not result in delays for voters in the voting process, and are centrally located within the consolidated precinct.

The Board of County Commissioners finds that each polling place provides individuals with physical mobility limitations unobstructed access to at least one voting machine.





Section 14-8-12.2 and 14-8-15, New Mexico Statutes Annotated, 1978 as amended, allows the County Clerk to charge an equipment recording fee.

Amounts collected from the equipment recording fee shall be deposited into a County Clerk recording and filing fund which is established by the County for such deposits.

The equipment recording fee and expenditures from the County Clerk recording and filing fund shall be determined annually by the County Clerk and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

Requesting continued authorization for the County Clerk to charge a seven-dollar (\$7.00) equipment recording fee per each \$25.00 collected.



The equipment recording fee shall be expended only:

- (1) to rent, purchase, lease or lease-purchase recording equipment and for supplies, training and maintenance for such equipment;
- (2) to rent, purchase, lease or lease-purchase equipment associated with all regular duties in the county clerk's office and for supplies, training and maintenance for such equipment;
- (3) to rent, purchase, lease or lease-purchase vehicles associated with all regular duties in the county clerk's office and for supplies, training and maintenance for such vehicles, provided that the county clerk shall report annually to the board of county commissioners the usage, mileage and necessity of all vehicle acquired pursuant to this paragraph; or
- (4) for technical assistance, staff travel and training associated with all regular duties of the county clerk's office; or
- (5) for staff travel associated with all regular duties of the county clerk's office pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act.






The New Mexico Oil & Gas Association's Annual Meeting/Conference will be in Santa Fe, New Mexico on October 3 – 5, 2021.




Lea County awarded a contract with Bixby Electric, Inc. to install a PAPI (precision approach path indicator) system at the Lea County Jal Airport. While upgrading the electrical service with the electrical vault project and the PAPI installation, it was recognized that the existing electrical supply servicing the airport did not meet current electrical codes.

Lea County wishes to enter into a change order with Bixby Electric, Inc. to preform the needed electrical work to upgrade the service to current codes. The total cost of the change order is \$46,541.33.





Contractor's Bids for the reconstruction of Kansas Street were received and publicly opened on Friday, May 29, 2021 at 2:00 p.m.

Two contractors delivered responsive bids for the project including J&H Services Inc. of Albuquerque and Constructors Inc. of Carlsbad.

The two bids were verified for completeness and compliance with the bid submission requirements and were found to be responsive bids. The resident bidder preference was not used to determine the apparent low bid as both responsive bids are resident bidders.

Constructors Inc. was the low bidder with the Total Project Cost of \$2,526,040.75 excluding NMGRT.

Lea County has a long term capital plan to address roadway conditions and roadway widths of not only oilfield impacted roadways but also major thoroughfares in the perimeters of the municipalities.


The schedule and plan calls for a phased widening and reconstruction of Alabama Roadway in the north Hobbs area. This roadway is classified as a major collector roadway by FHWA due to the number of vehicles that travel it each day and its connections.

Lea County staff has requested Pettigrew & Associates to submit a proposal for topographic survey, ROW survey, geotechnical services, and a phased civil engineering design.

The total cost for all services is proposed at \$234,392 plus NMGRT
