- 1. <u>ACH TRANSACTIONS</u> Vendors may be required to accept payment electronically through an Automated Clearing House (ACH) Transaction.
- 2. <u>APPROPRIATIONS</u> Award of this Contract is contingent upon sufficient appropriations being allocated by the County. If the County does not make sufficient appropriations and authorize their allocation, the agreement shall, notwithstanding any other provisions, terminate immediately upon Contractor's receipt of written notice of termination from the County. Lea County's decision as to whether sufficient appropriations are available shall be accepted by the Contractor and shall be final.
- 3. BRIBES, GRATUITIES AND KICK-BACKS Pursuant to 13-1-191 NMSA 1978, (including 30-14-1, 30-24-2, and 30-41-1 through 30-41-3 NMSA 1978), the criminal laws of New Mexico prohibit bribes, kickbacks and gratuities, the violation of which constitutes a felony. Further, the Procurement Code (13-1-28 through 13-1-199 NMSA 1978) imposes civil and criminal penalties for its violation.
- 4. <u>CLARIFICATIONS</u> Any inquiries or requests regarding clarification of this procurement document shall be submitted <u>in writing</u> to Procurement Officer Kelli Ferguson, 100 N. Main, Suite 11, Lovington, NM 88260, email <u>kferguson@leacounty.net</u>. Offerors may contact ONLY the Procurement Officer regarding questions or information on this

"Request for Proposals". Other County employees do not have the authority to respond on behalf of the County.

- 4.1 Offerors shall promptly notify the County Procurement Officer of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which they may discover upon examination of the RFP. Any response made by the County will be provided in writing to all Offerors by addendum. No verbal responses are authorized.
- 4.2 No Addendum will be issued later than three (3) days prior to the date for receipt of Proposals, except an Addendum withdrawing the Request for Proposal or one which includes postponement of the date for receipt of Proposals.
- 5. <u>COLLUSION</u> Collusion among Offerors or the submission of more than one proposal under different names by any firm or individual shall be cause for rejection of all proposals without consideration. Offeror's proposal may not be made in the interest, or on behalf of, any undisclosed person, partnership, company, association, organization or corporation. Offeror may not, directly or indirectly by agreement, communication or conference with anyone attempt to induce any action prejudicial to the interest of the County, or of anyone else interested in the proposed contract. Two or more specifically identified organizations may choose to submit a collaborative proposal. The enclosed **Non-Collusion Affidavit** must be executed along with the Proposal.
- 6. <u>COMPETITION</u> In signing a contract with Lea County the Contractor certifies that the Contactor has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any action in restraint of full competition in connection with the proposal submitted to the County.
- 7. <u>CONTACTS</u> Offerors <u>MAY NOT</u> contact other Lea County Departments, the Lea County Manager or his staff, members of the Lea County Board of County Commissioners or their staff, and any other Lea County Elected Official or their staff regarding inquiries or requests regarding clarification to this RFP. All inquiries or requests regarding clarification of this procurement document shall be submitted to the Procurement Officer in writing.
- CONTRACTS The contents of this RFP, as revised and/or supplemented, and the successful Offeror's proposal, including best and final offer, will be incorporated into and become part of the contract.
 - 8.1 Should an Offeror object to any of the County's terms and conditions, that Offeror must propose specific alternative language with the proposal. The County may or may not accept the alternative language. General references to the Offeror's terms and conditions or attempts at complete substitutions are not acceptable to the County and will result in disqualification of the Offeror's proposal. Offerors must provide a brief discussion of the purpose and impact, if any, of each proposed change, followed by the specific proposed alternate wording.
 - 8.2 Offerors must submit with their proposal any additional terms and conditions that they would like to have included in a contract negotiated with the County. Such terms must be clearly identified in the proposal.

- COST All costs incurred by an Offeror in connection with responding to this RFP, the
 evaluation and selection process undertaken in connection with this procurement, and any
 negotiations with the County will be borne by the Offeror.
- 10. <u>DEBARMENT & SUSPENSION</u> The Offeror certifies that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntary excluded from participation in this transaction by any Federal department or agency. It further agrees that by submitting this proposal that it will include this clause without modification in all lower tier transactions, solicitations, proposals, contracts, and subcontracts. Where the Proposer/Offeror/Contractor or any lower tier participant is unable to certify to this statement, it shall attach an explanation to this solicitation/proposal. The enclosed Certificate of Debarment and Suspension must be executed along with the Proposal.
- 11. <u>DEFINITIONS</u> This section contains definitions that are used throughout this procurement document, including appropriate abbreviations:

"Agency" or "County" means Lea County

"Contract" means an agreement for the procurement of items of tangible personal property or services.

"Contractor" shall mean successful Offeror.

"Determination" means the written documentation of a decision of a procurement manager including findings of fact required to support a decision. A determination becomes part of the procurement file to which it pertains.

"Desirable" The terms "may", "can" or "prefers" identify a desirable or discretionary item or factor.

"Evaluation Committee" means a body appointed by the County Management to perform the evaluation of Offeror proposals.

"Evaluation Committee Report" means a report prepared by the Procurement Officer and the Evaluation Committee for submission to Board of County Commission and/or County Manager for contract award that contains all written determinations resulting from the evaluation.

"Finalist" is defined as an Offeror who meets all the mandatory specifications of the Request for Proposal and whose score on evaluation factors is sufficiently high to qualify that Offeror for further consideration by the Evaluation Committee. "Mandatory" The terms "must", "shall", "will", "is required", or "are required", identify a mandatory item or factor. Failure to meet a mandatory item or factor will result in the rejection of the Offeror's proposal.

"Offeror" or "Proposer" is any person, corporation, or partnership that chooses to submit a proposal or an offer.

"Purchase Order" means the document which directs a contractor to deliver items of tangible personal property or services pursuant to an existing contract.

"Procurement Officer" means the person or designee authorized by the Agency to manage or administer a procurement requiring the evaluation of request for proposals.

"Request for Proposal" or "RFP" means all documents, including those attached or incorporated by reference, used for soliciting proposals.

"Responsible Offeror" means an Offeror who submits a responsive proposal and who has furnished, when required, information and data to prove that his financial resources, production or service facilities, personnel, service reputation and experience are adequate to make satisfactory delivery of the services or items of tangible personal property described in the proposal.

"Responsive Offer" means an offer, which conforms in all material, respects to the requirements set forth in the request for proposal.

- 12. **EXCEPTIONS** Any exceptions to the scope of work and/or specifications shall be listed separately, and specifications attached are the minimum requirements. The specifications submitted herein are all that were available to the Purchaser at the time of this mailing. Minor deviations to the specifications as listed, may be considered.
- 13. **EQUAL OPPORTUNITY** The Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, or national origin. The Contractor shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion,

color, sex, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the policies of nondiscrimination. The Contractor, all subcontractors, and all sub-subcontractors shall, in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, or national origin.

- 14. <u>INCOMPLETE RESPONSES</u> The County reserves the right to eliminate any Offeror that submits incomplete or inadequate responses or is not responsive to the requirements of this RFP.
- 15. **IRREGULARITIES** The County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Any sole response that is received may or may not be rejected by the County depending on available competition and timely needs of the County. The County reserves the right to award the contract to the responsible Offerors submitting responsive proposals with resulting agreements most advantageous and in the best interest of the County.
- 16. <u>NEGOTIATIONS</u> If the County is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the business(es) considered to be the most qualified at a price determined by the County to be fair and reasonable, negotiations with that business shall be formally terminated.
 - The County reserves the right to discontinue negotiations with any selected Offeror.
- NO OBLIGATION This procurement in no manner obligates Lea County until a valid signed contract is executed.
- 18. PROCUREMENT UNDER EXISTING CONTRACTS In accordance with NMSA Procurement Code, Section 13-1-129, Offerors are hereby notified that other government entities within the State of New Mexico, or as otherwise allowed by their respective governing directives, may contract for the goods or services included in this procurement with the awarded contractor. Contractual engagements accomplished under this provision shall be solely between the awarded vendor and the contracting government entity with no obligation by Lea County.
- 19. **PROPOSAL DISCLOSURES** The contents of the proposals will be kept confidential until a contract or contracts have been awarded. At that time, all proposal documents pertaining to this procurement will be open to the public, except for the material which is marked as proprietary or confidential. The Procurement Officer will not disclose or make public any pages of a proposal on which the Offeror has stamped or imprinted "proprietary" or "confidential" subject to the following requirements.
 - 19.1 Proprietary or confidential data shall be readily separable from the offer in order to facilitate eventual public inspection of the non-confidential portion of the offer. Confidential data is normally restricted to confidential financial information concerning the Offeror's organization and data that qualifies as a trade secret in accordance with the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, 57-3A-1 to 57-3A-7 NMSA 1978. The price of products offered or the cost of services proposed shall not be designated as proprietary of confidential information.

- 20. PROPOSAL AWARD The County reserves the sole right to:
 - 20.1. Determine responsible Offerors and responsive proposals.
 - a. <u>Responsible Offeror</u>: An Offeror who submits a Responsive Proposal and who has furnished, when required, information and data to prove that his financial resources, production or service facilities, personnel, service reputation, and experience are adequate to make satisfactory delivery of the items described in the Request for Proposal.
 - b. <u>Responsive Proposal:</u> A proposal which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the Request for Proposal.
 - 20.2 Determine and waive minor technicalities in the proposal form or requirements not affecting price, quality, or quantity of items or services sought.
 - 20.3 Award this RFP to one (1) or multiple Offerors.
 - 20.4 Reject any or all proposals in part or in whole.
- 21. **PROTESTS** Any Offeror who is aggrieved in connection with a solicitation or award of an Agreement may protest to the Purchasing Office in accordance with the requirements of the State Procurement Code. The protest shall be made in writing within 24 hours after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto, but in no case later than 15 calendar days after the facts or occurrences giving rise thereto (§13-1-172 NMSA 1978).
 - 21.1 In the event of a timely protest under this section, the County will not proceed further with the procurement unless the Purchasing Department makes a determination that the award of Agreement is necessary to protect substantial interests of the County (§13-1-173 NMSA 1978).
 - 21.2 The Procurement Officer or his designee shall have the authority to take any action reasonably necessary to resolve a protest of an aggrieved Offeror concerning a procurement. This authority shall be exercised in accordance with adopted regulations, but shall not include the authority to award money damages or attorneys' fees (§13-1-174 NMSA 1978).
 - 21.3 The Procurement Officer or his designee will promptly issue a determination relating to the protest. The determination will:
 - 23.3.1 State the reasons for the action taken; and
 - 23.3.2 Inform the Protestor of the right to judicial review of the determination pursuant to §13-1-183 NMSA 1978.
 - 21.4 A copy of the determination issued under §13-1-175 NMSA 1978 will immediately be mailed to the Protestor and other Offerors involved in the procurement (§13-1-176 NMSA 1978).
- 22. <u>REJECT ALL</u> Pursuant to Sec 13-1-131 NMSA, 1984, as amended, Lea County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, in whole or in part, submitted hereunder, provided that such rejections shall be accomplished by a written statement declaring the reason for the rejections.

- 23. <u>RFP RESPONSES</u> By responding to this RFP, Offerors acknowledge and consent to the rights and conditions set forth in this RFP.
- 24. **SOLE INTERPRETER** Lea County has the right to refuse any or all proposals and is the sole interpreter of the intent of any clause of the specifications, and sole judge as to whether the item proposed, or any part or fitting thereof, complies with the specifications.

PART II - THE PROJECT:

OVERVIEW

Lea County is soliciting qualifications-based proposals to provide various community services through a competitive contract award process. **Proposed services shall qualify as care and maintenance of the sick and indigent.**

Pursuant to §13-1-153 NMSA 1978 of the New Mexico Procurement Code, the County reserves the right to multi-award this RFP. The County intends to enter into a single contract with one or more organizations to provide the above mentioned services for which the Offeror has been qualified pursuant to its response to this RFP. The term of these contracts shall be from date of award until June 30, 2023.

Lea County government strives to enhance the health, safety, and quality of life for all residents as determined by law and community interests. Services are provided through innovative leadership and teamwork in a fair, respectful and professional manner.

Proposal Requirements:

- 1. Services must be performed within Lea County.
- Organizations who have previously been awarded a contract from the County must demonstrate a project history of successful program and budgetary management.
- Proposal must demonstrate organizational capacity to implement the proposed project by providing their most recent certified audit or financial review and, if applicable, proof of their U.S. Internal Revenue Service 501(c) 3 application or final determination of their non-profit status.
- 4. Proposals must contain budgets that are cost effective and appropriate to the program and provide an evaluation assessment of their program.

SECTION A

SPECIFICATIONS

Offerors may submit proposals for one or more of the following services, or other services that qualify as care and maintenance of the sick and indigent. It is not necessary for Offerors to submit proposals for all services.

Service	Description
1. Food	Provide meals to sick and indigent.
2. Alcohol/Substance Abuse	Provide counseling services to sick and indigent.
3. Child/Youth/Domestic Abuse	Provide temporary maintenance and care to persons subjected to
Protection	abuse who are indigent.

The services offered must be in accordance with all applicable federal and state of New Mexico regulations and standards including but not limited to:

- 1. Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), 45 C.F.R. Parts 1610-164, ("The Privacy Rule") and all state and federal guidelines regarding confidentiality.
- 2. Both clinical services and supervision by licensed practitioners must be in good standing and in accordance with their respective licensing board regulations.

All items in Section A. are REQUIRED under this procurement. In order and by number, provide written response as specified for each of the specifications detailed in Section A.

Evaluators will provide a numerical ranking for each of these criteria based on Offeror's response to each item. Offeror must initial where indicated (see Part III) that they are able to meet each of these minimum criteria and provide documentation / explanation of this ability in the narrative response to this proposal.

A.1 Program Summary (Max 1 page)

Briefly summarize an overview of the program and services being offered. This summary will be used to describe services in official County documents and media.

Brevity and clarity of the response will be considered in points awarded.

A.2. Demonstration of Need: The proposal must describe the need to be addressed and how it relates to the priority area for the target population using recent data. Include relevant and current information about the population to be served, and explain why the identified need is not being adequately met.

A.3 Proposal Description and Approach

The offeror must describe type of services and approach to meet the scope of work. Description must include:

- models of care,
- level of service provider, and
- impact on individual treatment status.

(One description for each service type).

Points will be awarded based on clarity, quality, and thoroughness of the response, including but not limited to quality of service delivery method, comprehensiveness of treatment services including substance abuse, domestic violence, in-patient rehabilitation and detox.

A.4 Program Outcomes: The proposal must clearly identify and describe one or more measurable outcomes that are related to the identified need and expected outcomes listed in the priority areas. Each outcome should demonstrate the impact on the population and/or community affected by the need.

A.5 Organizational Capacity and Experience

The offeror must describe ability to perform the services and expertise with similar work. Description must include capacity, human resources, and other programs or resources that can be used to leverage effective delivery of care.

Items to address in detail include but are not limited to:

- a. Describe administrative capacity including education and experience of key personnel in leadership, eligibility and customer service positions.
- Describe treatment capacity including education, licensing, and experience of key provider and educator positions.
- Experience of staff to effectively communicate and interact with individuals within the target population. Culturally competent bi-lingual Spanish speaking providers, staff and materials.
- d. Proposed strategy for developing and maintaining cultural competence standards.
- e. Years of experience in providing these services.

Points will be awarded based upon an evaluation of organizational and staff capacity, specialized experience and cultural competency.

A.6 Community Collaboration

The offeror must describe collaborative efforts to decrease duplication, ensure comprehensive care and improve the effectiveness of the safety-net care system. Must identify other payer sources when available, referrals for comprehensive care, integrated care, and recovery support. Include examples of agreements or letters of collaboration for delivery of care and services.

Points will be awarded based upon the evaluation of:

- supporting documentation of agreements with other agencies,
- a clear description of collaborative efforts, types of partnerships addressing gaps in safety-net care systems and streamlined services for patient-centered county-wide delivery systems.

FOOD

The County is seeking providers to provide food security and related resiliency activities for the sick and indigent. Services should focus on increasing access to nutritious foods. The expected outcomes include:

- 1) Improved access to food for low-income families
- 2) Increased knowledge of food security resources

ALCOHOL / SUBSTANCE ABUSE

The County is seeking providers for inpatient/outpatient alcohol and substance abuse treatment for the sick and indigent. Services should focus on restoring individuals to an alcohol/substance free lifestyle. The expected outcomes include:

1) Successful completion of programs by clients

2) Restoring individuals to a lifestyle free of alcohol/substance use/abuse.

CHILD / YOUTH / DOMESTIC ABUSE PREVENTION EFFORTS

The County is seeking providers to provide child/youth/domestic violence prevention activities. Services should focus on providing temporary shelter, including food, for victims of abuse. It may include education and awareness about violence prevention, and reducing risk factors and improving protective factors. Expected outcomes include:

- 1) Reduced spouse, partner and family violence, including exposure to violence
- 2) Improved individual capacity to identify and/or prevent violence
- 3) Increased coordination of community-based efforts to address violence

SECTION B

METHOD OF AWARD

An evaluation committee will judge the merits of proposals received in accordance with the evaluation factors defined herein. The recommendations of the committee will be forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners for approval. Failure of the Proposer to provide any information requested in the Request for Proposals may result in disqualification of the proposal and shall be the sole responsibility of the Proposer.

The selection committee *may* interview the Offeror(s) of the top rated proposals; however, contracts may be awarded without such interviews.

The County will enter into contract negotiations with one or more qualified Offerors(s) for the services contemplated under this RFP at compensation determined to be justified, fair and reasonable. In making this decision, the County shall take into account the estimated value of the services, accessibility, the scope, complexity and professional nature of the services to be rendered. Should the County be unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with an offeror at a price determined by the County to be fair and reasonable, negotiations with the offeror shall be formally terminated.

Compliance with Anti-Donation:

The Offeror certifies and affirms that any funds it receives from the County will be used consistent with Article IX, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of New Mexico as follows:

"Neither the state nor any county, school district or municipality, except as otherwise provided in this constitution, shall directly or indirectly lend or pledge its credit or make any donation to or in aid of any person, association or public or private corporation....Nothing in this section prohibits the state or any county or municipality from making provision for the care and maintenance of sick and indigent persons."

SECTION C

NARRATIVE RESPONSE

- 1. A concise overview of Offeror's qualifications and ability to comply with specifications of the RFP;
- 2. Detailed Response to the scope of work and specifications list in Section A;

- 4. Completed Cover Letter, taken from Part III, all items shall be completed, the document executed and included as page 1 of your submittal.

This section must fully list and describe the expected expenses. The budget section must include a line item budget and a narrative that justifies and/or explains the budget.

Points will be awarded based on clearly defined justification for unit costs for the levels of service provided that are directly related to the program description and budget calculations, including but not limited to value-based and cost effective standards for services.

The state agency or local public body that procures the services or items of tangible personal property shall indicate on the form the name or names of every applicable public official, if any, for which disclosure is required by a prospective contractor.

"Family member" means spouse, father, mother, child, father-in-law, mother-in-law, daughter-in-law or son-in-law of (a) a prospective contractor, if the prospective contractor is a natural person; or (b) an owner of a prospective contractor.

"Pendency of the procurement process" means the time period commencing with the public notice of the request for proposals and ending with the award of the contract or the cancellation of the request for proposals.
