STATE OF NEW MEXICO COUNTY OF LEA ORDINANCE NO. 99

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL ABORTION LAWS

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE

This Ordinance will be known as the Federal Abortion Law Compliance Ordinance.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE AND INTENT

The purpose and intent of this ordinance is to ensure compliance with federal abortion laws, including 18 U.S.C. §§ 1461-1462, within Lea County.

SECTION 3. AUTHORITY

Section 4-37-1 NMSA 1978 provides that all counties are granted the same powers of municipalities and included in this grant of powers are those powers necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, promote the prosperity, and improve the morals, order, comfort, and convenience of Lea County and its inhabitants.

SECTION 4. APPLICABILITY

This ordinance shall be effective and enforced within the geographical boundaries of Lea County, except for those areas that lie within the boundaries of any incorporated municipality.

SECTION 5. FINDINGS

The Board of County Commissioners finds that:

A. Federal law imposes felony criminal liability on every person who ships or receives abortion pills or abortion-related paraphernalia in interstate or foreign commerce, see 18 U.S.C. §§ 1461-62, and all such acts are predicate offenses under the federal Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations Act (RICO), see 18 U.S.C. § 1961.

B. The state constitution of New Mexico does not and cannot secure a right, privilege, or immunity to act in violation of federal statutes such as 18 U.S.C. §§ 1461-62, or to engage in criminal and racketeering conduct as defined by federal law.

C. The Board of County Commissioners is bound by oath to support and defend the Constitution of the United States, which declares it and laws made in furtherance of the Constitution are the supreme law of the land, binding the judges in New Mexico regardless of any state law to the contrary.

D. We call upon the United States Attorney for the District of New Mexico, both present and future, to investigate and enforce compliance with 18 U.S.C. \$\$ 1461-62

Avenue K from Main Street to Industrial Street is owned by the City of Lovington.

The County wishes to see the portion of Avenue K from Main Street to Industrial Street improved and reconstructed.

All costs associated with the improvement and reconstruction of Avenue K will be paid by the County and it is estimated that construction costs will be approximately \$655,000.00.

Consideration of Lea County Resolution No. 22-DEC-275R Approving a Task Order with Constructors, Inc. for Improvements to a Portion of Avenue K from Main Street to Industrial Street.

Ave K. is located on the south side of Lovington, and it includes portions of roadways that are both urban and rural. Due to construction along Main Street, the roadway has become a detour for passenger and heavy truck traffic.

This increased traffic has caused considerable damage to the roadway. The roadway also accesses the Lea County Solid Waste Convenience center located along Commercial Street.

Lea County staff and Constructors Inc. have developed a scope of work to reconstruct the roadway utilizing the Lea County Road Construction and Maintenance contract award previously.

The total cost of the reconstruction is \$654,697.97, including GRT.

Storm water runoff from the City of Hobbs storm drain system exits the city in 3 locations. One of these locations is the East Drainage Channel that crosses Landfill Road east of Hobbs.

During and after moderate storm events, this roadway becomes impassable to vehicles and leaves large debris in the roadway requiring closure of the roadway.



This will require elevating the roadway approximately 10' from its current elevation.






Ramirez & Sons, Inc Bid Form had an error in calculating the total of Item No. 303180 Base Course 8". The item price amount listed was \$45,850.00 and the total bid amount listed was \$257,859.62. Per Contract Section 3 Number 19, the unit price listed shall govern. Their unit cost listed as \$15.80 per Sq.Yd. times 2620 Sq.Yd. totals \$41,396.00. Although the discrepancy noted, Ramirez & Sons, Inc remains the lowest bidder.



Consideration of Lea County Resolution No. 22-DEC-277R Awarding Bid No. 7 (2022-2023) Sanger Landfill Road Intersection Re-Design.

This project will reconstruct portions of Sanger and Landfill Roadways and will also eliminate the curve with the intersection to the east as it is now constructed.

Instead, a traditional "T" intersection will be constructed to bring the intersection into correct geometry and eliminate sight and safety concerns.



Consideration of Lea County Resolution No. 22-DEC-278R Awarding Bid No. 9 (2022-2023) Wyoming Avenue Project.

Wyoming Road is located on the southwest side of Jal and connects NM 128 to Wyoming Road in the municipality of Jal.

This roadway continues to have increased traffic due to industrial developments along its route. The NMDOT reconstruction project of NM128 later this year will divert the current NM128 traffic onto Wyoming.

Lea County sees the need to reconstruct and widen the roadway prior to the NM128 construction project.

Lea County hired Square Root Services in February 2022 to design this improved roadway section.




Oil & Gas Production Revenue


Property Tax Revenue 6.7% of Budget – \$2,147,243






Gross Receipts Tax – All Sources
