Failure to complete the registration will result in disqualification.

DOG RULES

- 1. All exhibitors must be a *bona fide* member of a Manatee County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, which is related to your project. No one who has graduated from High School will be eligible to show. All 4-H and FFA Exhibitors must attend a Manatee County Public School or reside in Manatee County. Home Schooled Exhibitors must live in Manatee County. All Exhibitors at the Manatee County Fair must have completed one class of ethics training before being allowed to show. There will be an Ethics Training Class administered on October 30th in Manatee County. Exhibitors will be required to sign up for the class at the following site when it is available.

- 2. No exhibition of Dogs by anyone less than 8 years of age (as of September 1) will be allowed. Exhibitor age as of September 1, 2021 will determine the class in which the exhibitor will show. (Juniors are age 8-10, Intermediates are ages 11-13, Seniors are ages 14 and up.)
- 3. Mandatory meeting on December 14, 2021, Rogers Auditorium 4-H Center a parent or legal guardian must complete all required documentation. An Exhibitor/Photo liability release form prepared by the Fair Association must be signed and notarized. The Manatee River Fair Board encourages parents to be involved in their child's 4-H and FFA Projects.
- 4. All exhibitors must be in good standing with their respective clubs to exhibit at the Manatee County Fair. All exhibitors will show in the 4-H Club or FFA Chapter in which they registered their dog at their respective check-in event.
- 5. Each exhibitor assumes all liability in case of death or injury to his/her animal.
- 6. All Exhibitors must wear closed-toe and heel shoes (such as tennis shoes, boots, etc) on fairgrounds property, including the check-in and continuing forward. Attire: All exhibitors will be required to be clean and neat. No caps or hats. Closed toe and heel shoes or boots are required. Showmanship: dressy, church, or business-like attire that compliments your dog's color. Obedience and agility: shorts, jeans, t-shirts, etc.
- 7. All record books must be up to date and checked in to the designated committee at time of final check-in at the Fair. An up to date record book is required for all Dogs that were registered at the initial check-in, whether that Dog made it to the fair or not. If your Dog not make the final registration, your record book is still required to be e-mailed to ManateeCountyDog@manateecountyfair.com before the end of the fair in order to be eligible to show the next year in the Manatee County Fair. A committee appointed by the Livestock Committee will check record books at finale check in. EACH exhibitor showing a club or chapter animal must submit a care and feed guide, even if the animal is shared by several exhibitors.
- 8. All exhibitors must present a copy of the dog(s) shot records including a rabies certificate or titters certificate issued by their veterinarian at or before the mandatory meeting. It is recommended that

all dogs also have DAPP and Bortatella vaccines for their protection. Shot records must be submitted at the Mandatory Meeting on December 14, 2021.

Exhibitor and Parent Security Passes

Exhibitors will be required to make a one-time purchase of a day pass and can buy a \$25 Security Entrance Pass that will give unlimited access to the fair for the entire run of the Fair. Families will be allowed to purchase (4) additional Security Entrance Passes at \$25 each which also gives unlimited access to the fair.

Passes can be purchased when you register your animal on line through ShoWorks

Last day to purchase passes is October 23, 2021.

If not purchased by October 23, 2021 the cost will be \$30 each with same limits as above.

DOG RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Each handler must have worked with the dog he/she is showing for a minimum of 60 days. Youth exhibitors are expected to handle, train, and work or groom his/ her dog while on the grounds of the Manatee County Fair. Violations of this rule could result in disqualification.
- 2. All dogs must be in good health, free of parasites and licensed per Manatee County and Florida State Guidelines. Proof of the licenses must be submitted on or before the mandatory meeting to show at the Manatee County Fair.
- 3. Dogs may be pure-bred or mixed-bred and dogs must be at least 6 months of age by January 1, 2022 to compete in Obedience and Showmanship and 15 months of age for Agility.
- 4. Handlers may enter in only one showmanship class.
- 5. A six-foot leash is required for all Obedience and Agility classes below Novice level. In Obedience, appropriate collars include choke and nylon training, buckle collar and martingale style. Any style of pinch collars is not allowed. In agility, the only acceptable collar is a flat buckle collar. Off lead dogs may also run with no collar.
- 6. Any female dog in season or any dog that is injured will not be permitted to compete.
- 7. If a pre-registered dog is unable to compete (dog is injured or goes into heat, etc.), you must contact Patty Martin (941-720-4731) right away. A replacement may be approved, provided, that the dog has also been worked with by the handler. This replacement must be entered in a class appropriate to its training regardless of the class the pre- registered dog was entered.
- 8. Dogs must be kept on leash, except during performances that require unrestricted movement. Only one collar may be worn at a time and no tags or attachments are allowed.

- 9. Each owner/ handler is liable and responsible for their dog's behavior at all times. A misbehaving dog may be excluded from participation. ANY DOG EXHIBITING ACTS OF AGGRESSION WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM PARTICIPATION and must remain crated until the end of the show.
- 10. Dogs must remain at the Mosaic Arena at all times.
- 11. All entries must be made through online registration at https://www.manateecountyfair.com/ under youth livestock your animal registration area through ShoWorks.
- 12. Classes may be divided or combined if entries warrant. (Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors)
- 13. Mandatory Meeting: December 14, 2021, 6:30 PM Rogers Auditorium 4-H Center.
- 14. Trophies, ribbons and premiums will be awarded for each class.
- 15. A high combined score trophy will be awarded for highest combined scores from Agility, Showmanship and Obedience for Junior (8-12), Intermediate (11-13) Senior (13-up) age divisions.
- 16. No dogs are to be left unattended in cars. Any dog found unattended will be removed at its owner's expense.
- 17. Owners are responsible for picking up after their dog. There will be a designated exercise area available for use.
- 18. Practice will not be allowed in the show rings before, during or after the show.
- 19. All decisions of the judge are final.
- 20. Attire: All exhibitors will be required to be clean and neat.

No caps or hats.

Closed toe and heel shoes or boots are required.

Showmanship: dressy, church, or business-like attire that compliments your dog's color.

Obedience and agility: shorts, jeans, t-shirts, etc.

CLASSES

SHOWMANSHIP

Showmanship classes are judged on the ability of the exhibitor to handle his or her dog. The quality of the dog is not judged. Exhibitors will be asked to demonstrate:

*Moving the dog with the rest of the class

- * Presenting the dog in the standing position proper to its breed (including the use of an examining table for those breeds normally judged on the table).
 - * Moving the dog individually in a regular pattern.

Exhibitors are expected to know basic ring routines, use space wisely and be familiar with gaiting patterns. Exhibitors must be able to control their dogs at all times.

- 1. BASIC For first time handler and first-time dog in their first year of showing. All participants, whether they place or do not place must move to Novice class during their second year of showing.
- 2. NOVICE Experienced handler with basic dog or basic handler with experienced dog or handlers who have shown for one or more years with NO conformation titles. Any Exhibitor who has won this class three (3) times with competition at a State Level Dog Show must move up to the Open (formerly Advanced) showmanship class. No handler that has won level or earned titles in outside venues may show in this class.
- **3. Open (formerly Advanced) -** Experienced handlers showing in Novice class at AKC, UKC, etc but has not yet progressed to the open class 3 times with competition at the same level youth dog show must move to excellent. Any Champion titled dog must show in open.
- **4. Excellent** Experienced handlers showing in open or master's class in AKC, UKC, etc or who have won Best Junior three (3) or more times at any state level youth dog show or any outside venue must show in excellent.

Scoring for Showmanship will be as follows:

OBEDIENCE

Handlers and dogs will be judged according to AKC Obedience Regulations as modified by the 4-H. Dogs who have earned Obedience titles in other venues shall enter the same class level the complete in those venues. Any scoring ties will be broken first by the best sits and downs score, secondly (if needed) by the best healing score.

5. BASIC - Beginning handlers and beginning dog in their first year of showing. Dogs to be shown on a six-foot leash. Dogs who have not yet completed Novice work.

- **6. SUBNOVICE A** Experienced handler with beginning dog or beginning handler with experienced dog, except dogs with rally or obedience titles. Or second year handlers with a second-year dog. No dog that has an AKC or UKC title may compete in sub novice classes.
- 7. **SUBNOVICE B** Handlers showing dogs who have competed at AKC trials for more than one year or who have won first place in any Sub novice A class at any previous 4-H show. Dogs to be shown on a six-foot lead. Dogs who have not yet completed Novice work.

EXERCISES FOR BASIC and SUB-NOVICE

INDIVIDUAL: Heeling and Figure 8, Stand for Examination, Recall (all on lead).

GROUP: Long Sit for 1 minute, Long Down for 3 minutes (both on lead).

8. Beginner Novice- For handlers and dogs who are training for novice off-lead classes, this is an AKC class for getting ready for off-lead work. (See AKC class description for major details.)

Beginner Novice exercises are as follows: Individual: Heel on lead, Figure 8 on-lead, sit for exam, Recall off lead and sit/stay off lead (with walk around the ring), Plus one group exercise one minute down on lead. Dogs with the AKC Beginner Novice A title may still compete in Beginner Novice B.

- **9. NOVICE A -** Handlers and dogs ready to compete in novice exercises, except dogs with novice obedience titles OR handlers who have won first place in NOVICE A at any previous 4-H or Open Youth Dog Show. A novice title in obedience requires that dog and handler compete in Novice B class.
- **10. NOVICE B** Handlers showing dogs with obedience titles. Handlers and dogs who have shown in obedience competition at AKC obedience trials or have won first place in Novice A at a previous State Level Dog Show.

EXERCISES FOR NOVICE A and NOVICE B

INDIVIDUAL: Heeling On Lead and Figure 8, Off Lead Stand for Examination, Heeling Off Lead, Off Lead Recall.

GROUP: Long Sit Off Lead for 1 minute, Long Down Off Lead 3 minutes.

11. **OPEN** - For handlers and dogs who are ready to compete in open exercises. Dogs without titles show in A, dogs with titles show in B.

12. UTILITY - For handlers and dogs ready to Compete in Utility work.

EXERCISES FOR UTILITY

Signal Exercise, Scent Discrimination, Go Out, Directed Retrieve, Moving Stand and Examination, Directed Jumping.

- **13. BRACE** Dogs do not have to be of the same breed but should be similar in size. Dogs must be coupled using the same leash.
- **14. TEAM** Four handlers and dogs working simultaneously. Classes will be judges using novice exercises. (On-lead: heeling and figure 8, Off-lead: stand, recall). Handlers may respond to judges or team captain's commands. Figure 8 is done simultaneously using 5 posts. For the recall, hander's leave dogs in unison, call dogs one at a time, and finish in unison.

AGILITY

Open to handlers and dogs with agility training. Judging will be according to AKC/USDAA Junior Handler regulations as modified by the 4-H and will be out of 200 points.

Obstacles will include the following: A-Frame, dog walk, open and closed tunnels, pause table, bar jumps.

DOGS MUST WEAR FLAT BUCKLE COLLAR Handlers may NOT jump with their dogs.

Dogs WITHOUT FORMAL AGILITY TRAINING or dogs unfamiliar with obstacles SHOULD NOT be entered.

A contact obstacle familiarization with dogs will be permitted before competition begins for the On-Lead class. A handler walk-through will be allowed for both the On-Lead and Off-Lead classes.

On-lead agility classes, a loose leash must be maintained at all times. Judges will deduct points each time the leash is tightened, and a major deduction will b taken for constant tight leash. Dogs will be allowed 3 refusals. Points will be taken for each refusal, after three refusals the maximum points off will be taken and the exhibitor will be instructed to "move on" to the next obstacle.

Agility classes will be divided into the following jump height divisions:

Jump heights (measured from ground to dogs' withers.)

- 4" Dogs measure 11" and under
- 8" Dogs measure 14" and under
- 12" Dogs measure 18" and under
- 16" Dogs measure 22" and under
- 20" Dogs measure 22" and over

Note: the above chart is already adjusted down one level from AKC rules! Our goal with the youth program is to promote the safety and well-being of all animal's, therefore, the standard AKC jump heights have been reduced. However, if you wish to participate at a lower jump height you may do so as a dun run with no points, placement, prize, etc.

A dog's height is measured from the ground to its withers. Each dog's height will be verified at check-in. Dogs may enter a lower height for exhibition only.

- **15. ON-LEAD AGILITY** Dogs compete on-lead over the obstacle course.
- **16. OFF-LEAD AGILITY** Dogs compete off-lead over the obstacle course.
