Notarized MCRF Exhibitor Liability/Photo release and sales contracts will be signed

Exhibitors must bring at least one parent or legal guardian to the mandatory meeting.

FFA advisors & 4-H club leaders, with chapter animals, must attend the mandatory meeting.

A complete registration includes the following:

- (1) **Steer must have an official USDA point of origin ear tag tied to a premise.** Preferred scannable USDA official 840 RFID tag. If your animal does not have a USDA tag a FDACS inspector will be at initial weigh-in and provide an official USDA bright tags for your premise ID or you may register your premises to get a USDA bright tag.
- (2) **On-line registrations** at Manateecountyfair.com completed by Thursday, August 19, 2021
- (3) **Mandatory Weigh-in Exhibitor, Parent & Steer 8-11 am Saturday, August 21st 2021**
- (4) **Proof of ownership turned in at Initial weigh in.** (bill of sale) Saturday, August 21, 2021
- (5) **Mandatory Meeting for Steers** November 3, 2021 @ 7:00 PM, Mosaic Arena
Notarized MRFA Exhibitor liability/Photo release and Sales contracts will be done or completed. Exhibitor, Parent or Legal Guardian must be present.

Failure to complete the registration, will result in disqualification.

STEER RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors must be a *bona fide* member of a Manatee County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, which is related to your project. No one who has graduated from High School will be eligible to show. All 4-H and FFA Exhibitors must attend a Manatee County Public School or reside in Manatee County. Home Schooled Exhibitors must live in Manatee County. **All Exhibitors at the Manatee County Fair must have completed one class of ethics training before being allowed to show. There will be an Ethics Training Class administered on October 30th in Manatee County. Exhibitors will be required to sign up for the class at the following site when it is available. <https://floridastatefair.com/ag/exhibitor-ethics/>**
2. No exhibition of a Steer by anyone less than 8 years of age (as of September 1, 2021) will be allowed. Exhibitor age as of September 1, 2021 will determine the class of showmanship in which the exhibitor will show. (Juniors age 8-10, Intermediates ages 11-13, Seniors ages 14 and up.)
3. At Final check-in, Exhibitor and Steer must be together in order for animal to be checked in. **A parent or legal guardian must be present to complete any and all required documentation.** The Manatee River Fair Board encourages parents to be involved in their child's 4-H and FFA Projects.

4. ****Exhibitors are not allowed to change animal exhibits after the initial check-in.****
5. There will be a \$15.00 entry fee at the time of on line registration for your Steer.
6. Exhibitors must be in good standing with their respective clubs to exhibit at the Manatee County Fair. All exhibitors will show in the 4-H Club or FFA Chapter in which they registered their steer at their respective check-in event.
7. Chapter animal's (4-H and FFA Clubs) must designate exhibitor by December 17th.
8. Each exhibitor will be permitted to enter one of the following, one steer or one swine, not both. Anyone weighing in a steer at first weigh-in is not eligible to show a swine project. **Once you have registered your Steer on-line you cannot change your animal.** Shared ownership of steer entree is not permitted. School AG-ED departments and 4-H clubs will be permitted to exhibit one steer. However, no person can raise or exhibit more than one animal, so the steer as outlined above must be shown by a member other than the ones who have a steer of their own in the fair.
9. Liability: Each exhibitor must assume all liability in case of death or injury to his or her steer until removed from the Fairgrounds property, at which time it becomes the liability of the buyer.
10. Exhibitors must wear boots (must be above the ankle height) when handling hooved animals or are in animal areas on Fairgrounds property, including the initial check-in and continuing forward.
11. Exhibitors must be in their official Dress. FFA Official Dress and 4-H are required to wear white long sleeve button down dress shirts, black pants (No Denim Blue Jeans!) during the shows and sale. No hats allowed during the show and sale.
12. No Substitute exhibitors are allowed unless there are extreme reasons and granted permission by the Manatee County Fair Livestock Committee.
13. All Exhibitors participating in their respective showmanship areas must utilize only the animal that was registered under their name.
14. All record books must be up to date and checked in to the designated committee at time of final check-in at the Fair. An up to date record book is required **which needs to include a copy of three (3) of the letters that were written to prospective buyers with their names and addresses. If your steer didn't make the final check-in, your record book is still required to be e-mailed to ManateeCountySteer@manateecountyfair.com by the end fair, in order to be eligible to show the next years in the Manatee County Fair.** A committee appointed by the Livestock Committee will check record books at final check in. EACH exhibitor showing a club or chapter animal must submit a care and feed guide, even if the animal is shared by several exhibitors.

15. All livestock must follow Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) State Health Guidelines and be transported to the Manatee County Fair in accordance with those guidelines. Animals that have been dehorned must be completely healed prior to the final check-in. "Completely healed" will be determined by either the FDACS Inspector on site or Manatee County Fair Livestock Director assigned to that area)
16. On-site inspections of any livestock may be made by authorized agents of the Manatee River Fair Association at any time, after first check-in or before Fair.
17. Use of drugs not in compliance with manufacturer's label as to method of use, dosage, time limitations and show regulations is prohibited. The use of any calming agent on animals during the Fair or the possession of same by an Exhibitor (4-H or FFA member) or anyone assisting said member with his or her animal is prohibited. Violation of this provision shall disqualify the animal from competition and any awards or premiums, including sale price of animal, shall be forfeited. If medical treatment is deemed necessary, the exhibitor or parent must notify the Area Livestock Director and/or Barn Superintendent, prior to administering treatment to the animal in any way. See rule #20
18. All animals are subject to being examined and urine or blood tested for any drug usage at any time. Refusal by the Exhibitor (4-H or FFA member) to submit their animal to such examination or test will result in immediate disqualification and forfeiture of all premiums, awards and including sale proceeds. See rule #20
19. Force filling/pumping of Steers with any substance, water included, is prohibited. This includes use of pumps, drenches, tubes, hoses, etc... All steers must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification except for the grooming and treatment of the hair and the trimming of the hooves. No graphite, hair, cotton twine, etc. may be applied. See rule #20
20. Upon disqualification, pursuant to Paragraphs No. 17, 18 & 19 the affected steer shall immediately be removed from the Fairgrounds. Exhibitor may not be eligible a finale weigh in or be eligible to sell their animal. Disqualification will result in forfeiture of premiums, awards, add-on's and including sale proceeds.
21. The sale of Steers will take place on Saturday, January 15, 2022 at 1pm.
22. All Steers must be shown and sold by the registered exhibitor. All qualified Steer exhibits must be sold in the sale during the sale.
23. No minors will be allowed in any barn after 10 pm without Parent or Guardian supervision.
24. Steer barn will be closed to the public during specified feeding and handling periods specified by the Barn Superintendent.
25. No equipment may leave the barn areas prior to the release time of your animal.

26. Exhibitors with saleable animals must have buyer sign the Buyers verification card, present buyer with a thank you card and plaque if applicable. It is strongly suggested as a thank you that you give a gift or a gift basket when you get your Buyers verification card signed. The signed verification must card be turned into the Fair office to pick up their sales check prior to July 1st, in order to be eligible to exhibit a project at the next Manatee County Fair. Sales proceeds will not be distributed until payment is received from Buyer(s).
27. The Manatee River Fair Association will only handle add-on's totaling \$25.00 or more.
Add-On forms can be printed from Manatee County Fair's website [Livestock Records \(manateecountyfair.com\)](http://manateecountyfair.com) under Livestock Records.
Add-on's must be received by February 15, 2022. Add-On checks will be mailed after April 1, 2022 after each exhibitor's add-on monies are received by the fair office.
28. Saleable animals including Steers, Swine, Beef Breeding, Rabbit and Poultry Meat Pens will have six percent (6%) of each exhibitor's sale price and any add-ons deducted by the Fair Association to help defray expenses.
29. Fair premium money must be picked up within 90 days of the end of the fair or it will be forfeited.
30. Food and Drink are not allowed in the animal areas.
31. Violation of any of these rules may result in expulsion, suspension, loss of premium and or sale proceeds.
32. All deviations from any livestock rule will be requested in writing to the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee as soon as possible, but at least two weeks before first check-in. Each request will be handled on an individual basis.
33. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by \$25.00. Monies to be refunded if protest is decided in petitioner's favor. Only violations of rules by participants in the Fair will be considered as a protest. Protest to be decided upon by the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee.
34. All entry blanks must be filled out completely. All information and signatures must be completed, or entry will not be accepted.
35. Each family or club will be issued, on a first come first serve basis, one (1) chute spot for a steer. Each chute will be issued a Tag. Those remaining chute spots will be awarded by random draw. No grooming chutes will be allowed in barn prior to 9am on Wednesday before check in. No equipment may leave barns and specific areas before release time on day of release.
36. No provision will be made to sell animals disqualified. Only animals that are shown are eligible for auction sale.

37. 4-H and FFA steer classes will be shown and judged together. Selection of Champion and Reserve Champion shall be made from first place winners from each class. The second place blue ribbon to the Champion will qualify to compete for Reserve Champion.
38. Sifted steers deemed by the Fair Livestock Committee to be dwarfs, bullocks, or stags will not be eligible to show.
39. No decorations on animals at any time. (i.e. glitter, paint, signs or use of unnatural hair dyes) This does not pertain to grooming.
40. ***Final Interpretation of these rules will be vested in the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee.***

Steer Qualifications

1. If the Steer Committee considers the physical condition of the steer to be a problem, it may result in the Steer Committee not accepting or allowing the steer to participate in the show and sale.
2. Steers must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before Thursday, August 19, 2021. Proof of purchase shall be furnished at initial weigh-in.
3. At least 144 day, pre-Fair weigh-in and registration is required. (August 21st 2021) All animals shall be weighed, marked, mouthed and registered on the date and time established by the Steer Committee, on or before 144 days prior to the Fair. This must occur on scales certified by the Florida Department of Agriculture in the presence of at **least one fair board director**. It is the intent of the Fair Committee, for fairness of the exhibitors, for the animal to be between the ages of 14 months and a maximum cap of 24 months of age at final weigh-in.
4. It is the intent of the Board of Directors, Fair Livestock Committee to allow only steers which fairly and accurately represent the Beef Industry. NO dairy cross steers will be accepted. If discovered after weigh-in, animal will be disqualified.
5. **All Steers must have a USDA Point of origin premise tag. PREFERRED scannable 840 RFID ear tag tied to the premise ID. Fair will not tag and tattoo any animal with a fair tag unless it has an official USDA Point of origin premise ear tag.** If at initial check in steer does not have an **official UDSA premise tag** a state inspector from **FDACS** will be present and **can provide you with a USDA Bright tag for your Premise ID or set up a premise ID for you and provide a USDA bright tag for you.** The Fair will consider Steer to be ineligible without a USDA ear tag. If the USDA tag falls out it must be reinserted. **If the USDA ear tag lost, it is Exhibitors responsibility to replaced it.** Contact your breeder or use one of your Premise ID tags to replace it. If you do not have one please contact Delaine Woods at FDACS 863-448-2322. If a New USDA ear tag is inserted that **Number must be given to Fair office and Steer Director for fair records so it can be updated for fair check in.**

6. All Steers will have a Manatee County Fair provided ear tag inserted at the time of the initial Check-in. If the Manatee County Fair provided ear tag falls out at any time, the exhibitor and or parent must notify the exhibitor's respective 4-H leader or FFA Advisor, Steer Director and the Manatee County Fair office within 72 hours to set up a time for the tag to be reinserted or replaced.
7. **Mandatory Meeting** all Steer Exhibitors, Parent or Legal Guardian must attend. The meeting will be held on Wednesday, November 3, 2021 starting at 7:00 PM. Exhibitor, Parent or Legal Guardian must be present to complete paper work that is required. A Notarized MRFA Exhibitor/Photo liability Release and Sales contracts will be done at this meeting. You must be at this Mandatory Meeting or Steer and Exhibitor will be ineligible.
8. All steers must be neutered prior to first weigh-in. No steers will be castrated or dehorned at first weigh-in. No exceptions. Steers with horns longer than two inches will be rejected by the Steer Committee at final weigh-in. Dehorned steers must be completely healed at final weigh-in. "Completely healed" will be determined by either the State of Florida Health Inspector on site or Manatee County Fair Livestock Director assigned to that area. Any small scurs or horns must be filed smooth. No sharp tips will be allowed. No open wounds will be allowed.
9. No steer may be exhibited in competition that cannot be properly managed and led at final check-in time. Steers that are unmanageable during the show will be pulled to the side of the ring and tied or sent home.
10. Only halters approved by Manatee County Fair Livestock Committee will be allowed. Which include rope, cloth (cotton/nylon) chain halters and leather show halters. Use of nose tongs, cable type halters and training halters are prohibited
11. All steers shall be double-tied with at least ½" inch neck and lead rope and halters of good quality.
12. **All steers at final weigh-in must weigh a minimum of 950 pounds and a maximum of 1750 pounds and gained an average of 2 pounds per day. Also, all steers must have a minimum of .25 inches of back fat as determined by ultra-sound or be a quality grade of select or better.**
13. Any steer weighing over 1500 pounds will sell as 1500 pounds, regardless of weight.
14. Steers found to have been on a nurse cow during the feeding period shall be considered an ineligible animal for show and sale. If it is discovered after the sale, the exhibitor must make restitution to the buyer and cover all expenses incurred to the Fair Association.
15. No steer shall have access to grass pastures with the exception of extreme weather conditions or while exhibitor is exercising the animal. It is the intent of the Fair Board Livestock Committee to supply ONLY grain fed beef to buyers.
16. Steers may be mouthed and any steer with evidence of eruption of any permanent teeth other than two center incisors will not be eligible to show. Discrepancies between physiological age (dental

structure) and chronological age (certified age certificate) will be resolved by relying on age as determined by dental structure. A steer must be no older than 24 months at Fair time.

17. Bedding will be supplied by the Fair Association. No bedding hay allowed.
18. Feed and water pails must be provided by the exhibitor.
19. All exhibitors of steers are required to keep the steer's space clean and removal of litter and filth twice daily.
20. All exhibitors found not properly feeding and caring for his or her steer may be disqualified from show and/or sale at any time during Fair week.
21. ***Final Interpretation of these rules will be vested in the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee.***

Exhibitor and Parent Security Passes

Exhibitors will be required to make a one-time purchase of a \$25 Security Entrance Pass that will give unlimited access to the fair for the entire run of the Fair. Families will be allowed to purchase (4) additional Security Entrance Passes at \$25 each which also gives unlimited access to the fair.

Passes need to be purchased when you register your animal on line through ShoWorks.

Last day to purchase passes is October 23, 2021.

If not purchased by October 23, 2021 the cost will be \$30 each with same limits as above.

Animal Pick-up/Drop-off & Parking

Weigh-in: Saturday, August 21, 2021 8-11am, enter gate 8 out gate 5 Mosaic Arena

Fair check-in: Wednesday, January 12th 2-6pm, enter the fairgrounds at Gate 1 on the corner of 17th St. and 14th Ave. and line up for the weigh-in. Areas around the arena are for drop-off and pick-up only.

1. **Vehicles blocking Gate 1 or 9** will be towed at the owner's expense.
 2. Exhibitors may use Gate 9 in the morning before 9AM when coming to feed and water animals.
 3. **There will be no parking along the west end of the arena at any time!**
 4. Essentials may be dropped off and then vehicles will proceed to the livestock parking area. Violators will have their vehicles towed at the owner's expense.
- Areas around the arena are for drop-off and pick-up only.
