Swine, Exhibitor, and a Parent or Legal Guardian must be present.**

- Sales contracts will be signed by exhibitor and a parent or legal guardian

**MANDATORY Meeting** will be held at 5pm before show & showmanship classes, and at 12:00 noon on sale day in Mosaic Arena.

### **A complete registration includes the following:**

- (1) Swine must have an official USDA 840 ear tag tied to a premise. Preferred, scannable USDA official 840 RFID tag.** If your animal does not have a USDA tag a FDACS inspector will be at the mandatory check in and provide an official USDA tag and be able to register you for a premise ID to register the USDA official tag.
- (2) On-line registration** completed by October 6, 2022 Youth Ag Exhibits ([manateecountyfair.com](http://manateecountyfair.com)) then click on ShoWorks On-Line Registration/Purchase Passes..
- (3) Entry fee \$25.00** at time of online registration.
- (4) MANDATORY Check in for Swine, with the Exhibitor and Parent or Legal Guardian**  
Copy of Proof of Ownership turned in (bill of sale with USDA tag# on it).  
The Fair will insert an official fair ear tag and apply a tattoo. A side view picture of the swine with the fair tag and Exhibitor may be taken on October 8th or 9th at check in. Enter gate 8 exit Gate 5.

**Failure to complete the registration, will result in disqualification.**

## SWINE RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All exhibitors must be a *bona fide* member of a Manatee County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, which is related to your project. No one who has graduated from High School will be eligible to show.
2. Exhibitors must be in good standing with their respective clubs to exhibit at the Manatee County Fair. All exhibitors will show in the 4-H Club or FFA Chapter in which they registered their swine at their initial check-in.
3. All Exhibitors at the Manatee County Fair must have completed one class of ethics. If the Exhibitor shows anywhere besides Manatee County Fair, they may need retake the class every 3 years. **Manatee County will offer an Ethics Training Class on Saturday, October 29, 2022. Exhibitors are not required to take the class in Manatee County, as the training is sponsored by the Florida State Fair. Classes are offered throughout the state.** Exhibitors will be required to sign up for the class at the following site when it is available.

<https://floridastatefair.com/ag/exhibitor-ethics/> All ethics numbers must be turned in no later than December 1<sup>st</sup> to be eligible to show. All ethic numbers need be submitted to [vquattlebaum@manateecountyfair.com](mailto:vquattlebaum@manateecountyfair.com).

4. No exhibition of Swine by anyone less than 8 years of age (as of September 1, 2022) will be allowed. Exhibitor age as of September 1, 2022, will determine the class of showmanship in which the exhibitor will show. (Juniors ages 8-10, Intermediates ages 11-13, Seniors ages 14 and up.)
5. At Final check-in, Exhibitor and Swine must be together for animal to be checked in. **A parent or legal guardian must be present to complete all required documentation that is needed.** The Manatee River Fair Association encourages parents to be involved in their child's 4-H and FFA Projects.
6. \*\* Exhibitors are not allowed to change animal exhibits after the initial check-in\*\*
7. There will be a **\$25.00 entry fee** at the time of online registration for your Swine.
8. Chapter animal's (4-H and FFA Clubs) must designate the exhibitor **by December 1, 2022**, using the Club / Chapter Declaration Form, and email to [vquattlebaum@manateecountyfair.com](mailto:vquattlebaum@manateecountyfair.com).
9. Each exhibitor will be permitted to enter one of the following, one steer or one swine, not both. Anyone weighing in a steer at first weigh-in is not eligible to show a swine project. **Once you have registered your Swine on-line you cannot change your animal.** Shared ownership of swine entree is not permitted. FFA Chapters and 4-H clubs will be permitted to exhibit one swine. However, no person can raise or exhibit more than one animal, so the swine as outlined above must be shown by a member other than the ones who have a **swine or a steer of their own** in the fair.
10. Liability: Each exhibitor must assume all liability in case of death or injury to his or her hog until removed from the Fairgrounds property, at which time it becomes the liability of buyer.
11. Exhibitors must wear boots (must be above the ankle height) when handling hoofed animals or are in animal areas on Fairground's property, including the initial check-in and continuing forward.
12. Exhibitors must be in their official Dress. FFA members must show in Official Dress and 4-H members are required to wear white long sleeve button down dress shirts, black pants (No Denim Blue Jeans!) during the shows and sale. No hats allowed during the show and sale.
13. No Substitute exhibitors are allowed unless there are extreme reasons and granted permission by the Manatee County Fair Livestock Committee.
14. All Exhibitors participating in their respective showmanship areas must utilize only the animal that was registered under their name. The top five for showmanship will be selected.

15. All record books must be up to date and checked in to the designated committee at time of final check-in at the Fair. An up-to-date record book is required **which needs to include a copy of three (3) of the letters that were written to prospective buyers with their names and addresses**, to be eligible to show in the Manatee County Fair. A committee appointed by the Livestock Committee will check record books at final check in. EACH exhibitor showing a club or chapter animal must submit a care and feed guide, even if the animal is shared by several exhibitors.
16. All livestock must follow Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS) State Health Guidelines and be transported to the Manatee County Fair in accordance with those guidelines.
17. If the Fair Livestock Committee considers the physical condition of the swine to be a problem, it may result in the Committee not accepting an entry or not allowing the swine to participate in the shows and sale. Example: Crippled, limping, herniated, skin disease, lame or injured (must be able to walk naturally on their own around the arena) etc., but not limited to these examples. If the disqualification occurs at any time following the final check-in, the swine will not be permitted to leave the barn until after the sale and must go directly to one of the Manatee County **Fair Livestock approved USDA-FSIS approved slaughterhouses** at the exhibitor's expense.
18. On-site inspections of any livestock may be made by authorized agents of the Manatee River Fair Association at any time, after first check in or during Fair.
19. **All animals are subject to DNA verification** if deemed by the Manatee County Fair Livestock Committee. At initial check in hair samples may be taken for DNA verification. If an individual wants to contest an Exhibitor's animal, there will be a \$250.00 fee for the inquiry. If the animal is found to be different, through DNA verification, the \$250 will be refunded to individual making the inquiry. In the event the animal is found to be the same, the \$250.00 will be forfeited. Any animal failing DNA verification will be disqualified and all proceeds forfeited. Any Exhibitor found in violation of this rule will be banned from participating for life in the Manatee County Fair. See rule #25
20. **Ractopamine HCl (ex. Paylean or Engain) will be prohibited** from being used in Swine being entered in the Manatee County Fair. Some feeds and supplements contain Ractopamine be sure to read labels. Any Swine at any time may be tested if you have entered to exhibit that animal in the Manatee County Fair. If Ractopamine HCl is found it will result in immediate disqualification. Testing may occur at the will of Livestock Directors. See rule #25
21. Use of drugs not in compliance with manufacturer's label as to method of use, dosage, time limitations and show regulations is prohibited. **The use of any calming agent on animals during the fair or the possession of same by an Exhibitor (4-H or FFA member) or anyone assisting said member with his or her animal is prohibited.** Violation of this provision shall disqualify the animal from competition and any awards or premiums, including sale price of animal,

shall be forfeited. If medical treatment is deemed necessary, the exhibitor or parent must notify the Area Livestock Director and/or Barn Superintendent, prior to administering treatment to the animal in any way. See rule #25

22. All animals are subject to being examined and urine or blood tested for any drug usage at any time. Refusal by the Exhibitor (4-H or FFA member) to submit their animal to such examination or test will result in immediate disqualification and forfeiture of all premiums, awards, including sale proceeds. See rule #25.
23. All entries must be market hogs. All will have teeth cut and barrows will be castrated before entry date and castration will be verified by fair officials. No open wounds will be allowed. See rule #25.
24. All breeds and crosses of domestic type hogs will be eligible. **Absolutely no wild woodhogs or crosses will be accepted. Violations of this rule will result in disqualification.** See rule #25
25. Upon disqualification, pursuant to Paragraphs No. 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, & 24 will result in immediate disqualification. Exhibitor may not be eligible for final weigh in or may not be eligible to show and/or sell their animal at the sale. If animal has made final weigh in and then disqualified, the **exhibitor will have to pay for slaughter and processing at one of the Manatee County Fair approved USDA FSIS slaughterhouses**, at the exhibitor's expense. **Swine in some cases will be sold at rail price. Disqualification will result in forfeiture of all premiums, awards, add-ons, and sale proceeds.**
26. **Any banners or displays** in your assigned area need to be limited to a maximum of 2'x2' any larger will be removed.
27. **Any graphics or wording** in the barn or displayed on the panels deemed inappropriate by the Livestock Committee will be removed.
28. Barrows and gilts must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before October 6, 2022.
29. All Swine entries will be screened by a sifting committee.
30. **Mandatory Meeting** 5pm before show & showmanship classes, and 12 noon on sale day in Mosaic Arena FFA advisors & 4-H club leaders, with chapter animals, must attend the mandatory meeting.
31. **All Swine must have an official USDA 840 ear tag tied to the premise. Preferred scannable USDA official 840 RFID ear tag. The Fair will not tag and tattoo any animal with a fair tag unless it has an official USDA ear tag.** If your animal does not have an official USDA 840 ear tag a FDACS inspector will be at initial weigh-in and provide an official USDA tag and be able to

register you for a premise ID, to register the USDA official tag. The Fair will consider your animal to be ineligible without a USDA ear tag and fair tag. If the USDA tag falls out it must be reinserted. **If the USDA ear tag lost, it is Exhibitor's responsibility to replaced it.** Contact your breeder or use one of your Premise ID tags to replace it. If you do not have one, please contact Delaine Woods at FDACS 863-448-2322. **If a New USDA ear tag is inserted that Number must be emailed to [vquattlebaum@manateecountyfair.com](mailto:vquattlebaum@manateecountyfair.com)** for fair records so it can be updated for fair check in

32. All swine will be weighed in on the certified scales at the Fairgrounds. THAT WEIGHT WILL BE FINAL.
33. \*\*\*All swine at the final weigh-in must weigh between **230 and 300 pounds** and have a minimum of .50 inches of back fat and a maximum of 1.10 inches of back fat as determined by ultra-sound.
34. **Mandatory check-in and Tagging:** Exhibitors have either day to choose from, **Saturday, October 8, 8am-12 noon or Sunday, October 9, 1-5pm.** At Check-in you must have present **Swine, Exhibitor, and Parent or Guardian.** You Must bring a copy of proof of ownership (Bill of sale with USDA Point of origin tag # on it) to be turned in at this check in. **The Exhibitor or a representative designated by the exhibitor shall handle the hog** for the committee to place a FAIR TAG and a TATTOO in the hog's ear and a picture will be taken of the Swine and Exhibitor with the fair flat tag showing at the mandatory check in. **A Notarized MRFA Exhibitor Liability/Photo Release must be completed and handed in along with the Sales contracts that will be completed. Exhibitor and Parent or Legal Guardian must be present. You must be at this mandatory check in or the animal & exhibitor will be ineligible.**
35. All animals must be checked in by a FDACS inspector. All exhibitors must comply with FDACS Animal Industry guidelines, and all animals must meet minimum health standards as determined by the Fair veterinarian. **All Swine will be sold in the sale and must be transported to a Manatee County Fair Livestock committee approved USDA-FSIS facility for slaughter.** Swine exhibited at the Manatee County Fair are not allowed to return home as this is a **Terminal Swine Show.**
36. All animals will be trained and under control during the check-in, show and sale, a Crop/Whip may be used.
37. **All Swine Must remain within the paneled off swine area under the Mosaic Arena.**
38. A designated person may be in the pen with the Exhibitor during pre-show and post show times. That one designated person must be in the pen with the swine and exhibitor and can follow up to the ring and back to the pen.

39. Only the exhibitor will be allowed to care for the show animal and will be required to help clean the barn.
40. **Waterers and Feeders should be supplied by the Exhibitors.** The fair does have a limited number of waterers and feeders available. Exhibitors are responsible for watering and feeding their own animal. Feeders may only remain in pens for feeding and cannot stay in pens. Clipped feeders may remain in pens during show times. Exhibitors not properly feeding, caring for and/or managing hogs will be charged a fee and forfeit the right to all premiums won.
41. **ON THE DAY OF THE SALE, SWINE MUST BE FED BEFORE 9AM AND RESUME FEEDING AT THE CLOSE OF THE SALE.**
42. No Substitute exhibitors are allowed unless there are extreme reasons and granted permission by the Manatee County Fair Livestock Committee. A stand-in is not eligible for Showmanship. Violation of this rule will result in animal being sold at rail price.
43. 4-H and FFA Swine classes will be shown and judged together. Selection of Champion and Reserve Champion shall be made from the first-place winners in each Division. The second-place blue ribbon to the Champion in that Division will qualify to compete for Reserve Champion. This pattern will remain to select the next 3 winning animals to recognize the top 5 swine in the barn.
44. All grooming of hogs will be done in their pens. Wash rack area will be available at designated times determined by the Swine Director.
45. All Swine must have a minimum of 1/2 inch of hair.
46. The use of any cosmetics on a show animal may result in that animal being disqualified. Example: oil, powder, creams or altering agents. Exhibitors may use professional swine grooming products only. Force filling/pumping of swine with any substance, water included, is prohibited. This includes use of pumps, drenches, tubes, hoses, etc... All swine must be shown in their natural conformation and structure without alteration by modification except for the grooming and treatment of the hair and the trimming of the hooves.
47. **Only Initial bedding** will be supplied by Fair association. Extra bedding is at the exhibitor's expense. No bedding hay allowed.
48. The sale of hogs will take place on Saturday, January 21, 2023, at 1pm.

49. All Swine must be shown and sold by the registered exhibitor. All qualified Swine exhibits must be sold in the sale ring during the sale.
50. No minors will be allowed in any barn after 10 pm without Parent or Guardian supervision.
51. Swine barn will be closed to the public during specified feeding and handling periods specified by the Swine Barn Superintendent.
52. No equipment may leave the barn areas prior to the end of the Awards Ceremony.
53. Exhibitors with saleable animals must have buyer or buyer's representative sign the buyer's verification card, present the buyer with a thank you card and plaque if applicable. It is strongly suggested as a thank you that you give a gift or a gift basket when you get your **Buyers verification card signed by the Buyer or there representative. The signed verification must card be turned into the Fair office to pick up their sales check prior to July 1<sup>st</sup>, to be eligible to exhibit a project at the next Manatee County** Sales proceeds will not be distributed until payment is received from Buyer(s).
54. Fair premium money must be picked up within 90 days of the end of the fair or it will be forfeited.
55. Food and Drink are not allowed in the animal areas including wash rack and grooming area.
56. The Manatee River Fair Association will only handle add-on's totaling \$25.00 or more.  
**Add-On forms can be printed from Manatee County Fair's** website

Add-on's must be received by February 15, 2023.  
Add-On checks will be mailed after April 1, 2023, after each exhibitor's add-on monies are received by the fair office.
57. Saleable animals including Steers, Swine, Beef Breeding, Rabbit and Poultry Meat Pens will have six percent (6%) of each exhibitor's sale price and any add-ons deducted by the Fair Association to help defray expenses.
58. Violation of any of these rules may result in expulsion, suspension, or loss of premium and or sale proceeds.
59. All deviations from any livestock rules will be requested in writing to the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee as soon as possible, but at least two weeks before first check-in. Each request will be handled on an individual basis.



60. **All protests must be in writing and accompanied by \$25.00.** Monies to be refunded if protest is decided in petitioner's favor. Only violations of rules by participants in the Fair will be considered as a protest. Protest to be decided upon by the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee.

61. No provision will be made to sell animals that are disqualified. Only animals that are shown are eligible for auction sale.

62. *Final Interpretation of these rules will be vested in the Manatee River Fair Board Livestock Committee.*

### Swine Qualifications

### Exhibitor and Parent Security Passes

Exhibitors will be required to make a one-time purchase of a \$25 Security Entrance Pass that will give unlimited access to the fair for the entire run of the Fair. Families will be allowed to purchase (4) additional Security Entrance Passes at \$25 each which also gives unlimited access to the fair. **Passes can be purchased when you register your animal online at [Youth Ag Exhibits \(manateecountyfair.com\)](http://Youth Ag Exhibits manateecountyfair.com)** then click on ShoWorks On-Line Registration/Purchase Passes.

**Last day to purchase passes is October 28, 2022.**

If not purchased by October 28, 2022, the cost will be \$30 each with same limits as above.

**\*\*THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS ON PASSES\*\***

### **Animal Pick-up/Drop-off & Parking**

**Fair check-in:** Wednesday, January 18<sup>th</sup> 1-6pm, enter the fairgrounds at Gate 1 on the corner of 17<sup>th</sup> St. and 14<sup>th</sup> Ave. Line up for the weigh-in: will start at the corner of 14<sup>th</sup> Ave and 17<sup>th</sup> St and extended South down 14<sup>th</sup> Ave along the canal. Areas around the arena are for drop-off and pick-up only. No equipment may be dropped during fair check-in. Equipment will be unloaded after all animals have been checked in.

**Any Vehicle without proper parking pass or in an unauthorized area will be towed at owners' expense**

1. **Vehicles blocking Gate 1 or 9** will be towed at the owner's expense.
2. Exhibitors may use Gate 9 in the morning before 9AM when coming to feed and water animals.

3. **There will be no parking along the west end of the arena at any time!**
4. Essentials may be dropped off and then vehicles will proceed to the livestock parking area. Violators will have their vehicles towed at the owner's expense.  
**Areas around the arena are for drop-off and pick-up only.**
