ENTRY FORMS

The 2025 **Example** Entry Form will be available to view on the Fair Website by October 1st, 2024. This is not your official entry form. The final multi-layered form will be filled in at the Fairgrounds.

You will be asked if your work is original design, a kit or a pattern. This is to insure that it is seen by the correct judge. **IMPORTANT: NO EARLY DROP OFF ACCEPTED.** Be sure to read the **General Rules** section as well as the **Category Rules**.

JUDGING

- Each entry will be judged fairly on its own merit, using the **Danish Judging System**. An explanation of the Danish Judging System can be found in the Arts & Crafts section at ManateeCountyFair.com
- Judging is done by the most qualified judges available.
- The names of the exhibitors are concealed during judging so each entry will be judged fairly on its own merit.
- The entry of only one item in a division does not necessarily guarantee the top award for that entry.
- Only the top ribbon award will be displayed on each exhibit except for the "Marie Abel Awards" and other special awards that will accompany rosettes.
- No one other than the committee members, volunteers and judges will be allowed to remain in the building during judging. Please do not call to request results.

ADULT AWARDS

Best of Show

Six purple Best of Show rosettes and \$25.00 each will be awarded: Crafts (3), Culinary Arts (1), Fine Arts (1), Photography (1). **Marie**

Abel Award

Blue Rosette, plaque and \$25.00 awarded to five (5) top needlework artists.

YOUTH AWARDS

Best of Show

Six purple Best of Show rosettes and \$25.00 each will be awarded: Crafts (3), Culinary Arts (1), Fine Arts (1) Photography (1). Blue Rosette \$10.00 Red Rosette \$8.00 Blue Ribbon \$5.00

AWARD MONEY

May be picked up at the Finance Building after 3:00 P.M. on Tuesday, January 21st 2025. No money will be available until this time. Award money is awarded according to the judges' records and not necessarily to attached ribbons. If award money is not picked up within 90 days of the end of the fair, it is forfeited. All awards must be signed for by the exhibitor or a family member.

Prize money will also be available on Release Day – Monday, Jan 27th.

OTHER AWARDS

Manatee-Sarasota Fish & Game Association Awards

Will present an award and \$25 to an adult and youth in the Photography category to the exhibitor with the picture that best depicts the natural beauty of Manatee County.

Paul Bartley Awards

The department will present an award and \$25 to an adult and youth in the Photography category to the exhibitor with the picture that best depicts people of Manatee County.

Susan Keen Awards

Yellow Rosettes and \$25 will be awarded to five unique and creative entries in any division by the Arts & Crafts Committee.

Gene Page Awards

The Department will present an award and \$25.00 to an adult and youth in the photography category to the exhibitor who best depicts good sports or good sportsmanship photography.

Sponsor Awards

Fair sponsors are invited to recognize an entry in the department that they find exceptional. A ribbon will be awarded.

Please read the General rules AND the Category rules and regulations that govern Arts & Crafts before entering your items.

GENERAL RULES

Arts & Crafts Department is for competition, education, exhibition and demonstration purposes. Sale of entries is not permitted.

Each exhibitor may enter up to ten (10) items total, for judging in Arts & Crafts Department. Check for the maximum that is allowed in each category.

Crafts - five (5) Fine Arts - five (5) Photography - three (3) Culinary Arts (5)

Example: 3 in Crafts, 2 in Fine Arts, and 3 in Photography and 2 in Culinary

Entries must be the work of the exhibitor and must have been completed in the 12 months prior to the 2025 Fair. Entries must not have been entered previously in the Manatee County Fair.

Entries exhibited previously under the same name or another name will be disqualified.

The Manatee County Fair will exercise all reasonable security, but cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage to entries.

The Arts & Crafts Committee will screen all entries and may disqualify entries considered offensive, too fragile, soiled, spoiled, in poor taste or those entries in which the General and Category rules have not been followed.

Items to be judged must be submitted by the submitting exhibitor or a family member.

If any exhibitor is found to have made a fraudulent statement about any entry, all awards to that entry shall be forfeited and the entry disqualified.

To claim entries, the entry form copy from Entry Day must be presented.

No entry in any category shall be removed before January 27th 2025.

HOBBIES, CRAFTS, NEEDLE ARTS CATEGORY

Original designs should be noted on the entry form for proper judging. Some items could be entered under crafts or fine arts. You may have to make a choice based on where your entry will be best judged.

Legos are to be mounted securely on a **sturdy** base. The Lego base is too flexible and when it is moved, any flexibility makes breakage more likely. Attaching the Lego base to a piece of plywood, or other non-flexible material, will solve this problem. Make base to fit exhibit but not to exceed 2'x2'x2'. The exhibit cannot be larger than the base. You may put one or more sides on the base to create a backdrop.

Exhibitors must provide dowels, hangers, extension cords, stands, etc. for items needing these things. Please label these items with your name. All framed items that need to be hung (such as counted cross stitch) need to have hanging wire securely attached with screw eves.

Division 12 horticultural exhibits must be of reasonable weight and size, as very large horticultural entries cannot be handled by department volunteers and space is limited.

If your exhibit is heavy, bring additional help with you on Receiving and Release days. If you have a horticultural entry you may need to visit during the fair to see to it's care.

CULINARY ARTS & FOOD CATEGORY

All foods must be the work of the exhibitor. Recipes entered in previous years may not be used. Including those previously entered under another person's name. The same or very similar entries from the same household will be disqualied.

All entries must be accompanied by one copy of the recipe... typed or clearly printed in black ink on the official recipe sheet. You can get it from the Manatee County Fair website, at the Fair Office or you can fill it out when you bring your entry. No index cards. Please do not add graphics or writing other than the recipe name and recipe. The recipe must list all ingredients used, and amounts, in the order of use, as well as the method of preparation in order. Please state if this is an original recipe. All recipes become the property of the Manatee County Fair and may be published at a later date. Credit will be given to the exhibitor.

Bring all non-canning entries in covered disposable containers. No containers will be returned. Cake decorating should preferably be done on disposable forms. If an actual cake is submitted in the division, it will not be judged for taste, only appearance. Amounts needed for judging and/or display: Cookies, Muffins, etc. -1 dozen. Cakes, Pies, Breads, etc. - whole. Soups, Stews, etc. -1quart if fresh or 2 one pint containers if canned. Pickles, Relishes, Butters, Chutneys, etc. - 2 one pint containers. Jams, Jellies, etc. - 2 half pint jars.

CANNING

Canned foods will be judged for presentation, pack, taste, and individuality. Please bring two jars of canned foods per entry: one jar for judging, one for display. All canning must be processed in the twelve months prior to the 2025 Fair. All canning must be in clear glass standard canning jar with two-piece sealing lids. Jellies may be in decorative clear glass jars with one piece sealing lids. Paraffin is not accepted. Vinegars may be in decorative glass containers. No food coloring is permitted unless specified for fancy packs and should be noted on the recipe. Each canning jar should have a label listing food and date canned. No exhibitor names, please. Foods needing to be warmed for judging must have this clearly stated on exhibitor tag and entry sheet. Please no raw eggs in or on any finished product.

Entries made from mixes should be the base for a recipe with other ingredients. Use Division 57.

FINE ART CATEGORY

All flat fine art entries must be mounted, matted or framed. Overall dimensions of exhibit, including mat and/or frame, shall not exceed 24" × 36" or 864 square inches.

All FRAMES must have a hanging wire properly attached or the entry may be disqualified. Entries mounted on foam core or mats (1/4" maximum thickness) may be hung using clips, velcro or an adhesive hanger. These will be added by department volunteers.

The rules are to ensure the safety of the exhibit for Fair patrons as well as the quality and overall appearance of the show.

The Chaires building is very damp and has no heat or air conditioning. The Arts and Crafts Committee suggests that using foam core is best for matting or mounting your work. If your work comes apart due to environmental reasons, it will have to be removed from the display.

Please present your work well. Presentation may either enhance or detract from your work and influence a judges decision.

No pre-sketched work such as paint by numbers or kits will be accepted in Fine Arts. These items are accepted in Hobbies, Crafts and Needle Arts.

Division 60 • Decorative Arts

China painting, tole painting, etc.

Division 61 • Graphics

Computer drawn art, charcoal, pen & ink, pencil & crayon, illustrated manuscripts, etc.

Sculpture, glass, stained and fused glass, jewelry, porcelain, recycled materials (more than 50% recycled materials)

Division 63 • Painting

All Media, acrylics, oil, water color, etc.

PHOTOGRAPHY CATEGORY

All photography entries must be mounted, matted or framed. Photos must be at least $8" \times 8"$ or 64 square inches.

Overall dimensions of the exhibit, including mat and/or frame shall not exceed $20" \times 24"$.

All FRAMES

Wires on the back of photography exhibits are no longer required. However having a wire on the back is acceptable. If the exhibit is hung on a wall and has no wire, one will be added by department volunteers.

Entries mounted on foam core or mats (1/4" maximum thickness) may be hung using clips, velcro or adhesive hangers that will be supplied. The rules are to ensure the safety of the exhibit for Fair patrons as well as the quality and overall appearance of the show.

The Chaires Building is very damp and has no heat or air conditioning. The Arts and Crafts Committee suggests that using foam core is best for matting or mounting your work. If your work comes apart due to environmental reasons, it will have to be removed from the display.

Please present your work well. Presentation may either enhance or detract from your work and influence a judges' decision.

If you processed your own film, or digitally enhanced or altered the photo, please note the method on your exhibitor tag and entry sheet. Removing "red-eye", adjusting brightness or cropping is not considered altered or enhanced - but changing the sky to green is!

Additional information about the photograph must be included on the entry sheet and also on the exhibit tag. Example: film photography, self developed, major digital enhancement.
