#### **General Information**

The Fair Office will be open starting July 5, 2023, see page 6 for office hours. The office will be CLOSED Monday, July 3rd & Tuesday, July 4th.

All in-person and mail-in entries close on July 15th, 2023 at 2:00 p.m. A postmark DOES NOT constitute an entry date (online entries will close at 11:59pm July 16th, 2023). There will be no exceptions for any department except Q, R, and S whose entry deadline can be found under department information. Note: Departments A, F & G do have provisions for late entries.

Each class has an entry fee, this includes group/pair classes. You must enter the group/pair classes to exhibit.

Livestock entries will be posted in the barn area at the time the livestock is to be on the grounds for check in. There will be a two (2) hour period in which the exhibitors are to check the posting for errors. At the end of the two (2) hour period, entries will stand and no changes will be made to the classes. No one will be able to show in a class if they are not entered.

Menard County EMS and area fire departments on the fairgrounds various times during the fair for first aid and medical needs.

Tuesday, JULY 18, 2023 Domestic Exhibits Buildings will be open from the time Judging is complete until 8:00 p.m. in the evening of that day. If you choose not to buy the exhibitor pass, you will have to pay to enter the fair each day. NO ONE WILL BE ADMITTED FREE BY SAYING THEY ARE THERE TO PICK-UP AN EXHIBIT, PLEASE DON'T ASK.

Season tickets can be purchased at the Menard County Fair Office beginning on July 5th until the close of the fair.

#### Entries

- 1. All in-person and mail-in entries close on July 15th, 2023 at 2:00 p.m. A postmark DOES NOT constitute an entry date (online entries will close at 11:59pm July **16th**, **2023**). Entries can be mailed, e-mailed, made online, or made in person at the fair office before this date. Entries can not be called in. ENTRIES NOT RECEIVED BY THIS DATE WILL BE REFUSED! A POSTMARK DOES NOT CONSTITUE AN ENTRY DATE! Entries made prior to this date cannot be changed after deadline. Do not bring exhibits at time of entry. Times are listed for bringing exhibits for each department in the schedule of events.
- All exhibitors must give their social security number and address at the time of entry. Entry form must be signed. No entry will be made without the social security number, address of the exhibitor and signature.
- All entries must be accompanied by check or money order for stall/pen fees, EXHIBITOR'S TICKET fee and entry fees. Persons entering by email must pay their entry

fees by mailing a check. Payment must be received by 7/15/23.

#### NO ENTRY FEES WILL BE RETURNED!

- All entry fees will be collected at the time of entry. No entry fees will be deducted from winnings. We regret any inconvenience this may cause. Each class has an entry fee, this includes group/pair classes. You must enter the group/pair classes to exhibit. Livestock entries will be posted in the barn area at the time the livestock is to be on the grounds for check in. There will be a two (2) hour period in which the exhibitors are to check the posting for errors. At the end of the two (2) hour period, entries will stand and no changes will be made to the classes. No one will be able to show in a class if they are not entered.
- All exhibitors should check the individual departments for time entries are to be in place.
- 7. No articles or exhibits may be removed from the grounds before 5:00 p.m., SUNDAY, JULY 23, 2023, unless otherwise specified or given permission by department superintendent.
- Decision of the department judge shall be final.
- If an exhibitor files protest, it must be filed with the Secretary of the fair board and sworn to before a notary public. The fair board shall act upon the protest and their decision shall be final.
- 10. Premium checks in the livestock departments will be available approximately one (1) hour after the conclusion of the show. When checks are available for pick-up, an announcement will be made. Premium checks for domestic departments may be picked up on SUNDAY, JULY 23, 2023 when exhibits are picked up.

#### General Rules & Regulations

- Menard County Fair, Inc. leaves its Board of Directors the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine questions and differences in regard thereto. They may amend these rules as they deem advisable.
- 2. Great care will be used by the Officers of the corporation to prevent loss by theft or injury to animals or articles on exhibition. In no case will the Association become responsible for loss or injury as they may occur.
- The officers and agents of the corporation waive all responsibility for injury to persons or animals taking part in races on the track or otherwise in the barns or on the grounds.
- Season tickets may be obtained by calling the Fair office before or during the fair. Payment will be required prior to the ticket being mailed. The transfer or loan of season or exhibitor's tickets can be considered a fraud upon the Fair Board and will subject the owner to loss of the ticket.
- ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS MUST PURCHASE AN EXHIBTOR'S PASS - NON-LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS, POULTRY, AND OPEN HORSE EXHIBITORS HAVE THE OPTION TO PURCHASE AN EXHIBITOR'S PASS
- A strong and efficient police force will be on the grounds at all times to maintain order.
- No Alcohol will be allowed to be brought on the grounds.
- All premium checks are void if not cashed before November 1, 2023 NO EXCEPTIONS!

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF THIS PREMIUM BOOK:

The publishing of this premium book, which is placed in your hands each year, entails a great deal of work and costs several thousand dollars. The firms who carry ads in this book are, through this means, supporting the fair and make possible to publish this book each year. Therefore, it would be appreciated if you would give these firms who have designated the proof of the proof nated themselves fair supporters, the benefit of your busi-ness whenever possible, through your purchases. Thank you for your cooperation in patronizing these firms.

#### General Livestock Rules

- Exhibitors must furnish their straw and feed, and for sanitary reasons, their own water pail and feed trough.
- It is requested by the Fair Board that all exhibitors keep their stalls and pens in a clean and sanitary condition.
- 3. No stalls or pens will be rented for feed and equipment purposes unless space is available.
- 4. Entry fees on livestock will be collected in advance.
- 5. Health papers MUST be available to veterinarian upon request. The superintendent of each department may request suspicious animals to be inspected by the official vet and those which are diseased will be refused admission to the grounds or removed from the grounds.
- 6. All breeding animals must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of entry. All breeding animals must be registered, tattooed and have their health and registration papers available. If any discrepancy is found the animal shall be disqualified and the exhibitor shall be barred from the Fair for a period of two years. If anyone enters any animal in any other name than that of the bona fide owner, no premium shall be paid even though one could be awarded by the judge, and such exhibitor shall be barred from exhibiting any animal at this Fair for a two year period.
- An exhibitor may make no more than two entries in any one class.
- Only the exhibitor and the animal being shown are allowed in the ring at the time of judging. <u>Exhibitors</u> must wear entry tag number while in the ring.
- Any entry scratched must be reported prior to the showing of the class.
- 10. The Menard County Fair Board reserves the right to refuse any livestock entries.
- 11. All in-person and mail-in entries close <u>JULY 15, 2023, at 2:00 p.m.</u>, entries can be mailed, e-mailed, or made in person at the fair office before this date.
- 12. EACH CLASS HAS AN ENTRY FEE THIS INCLUDES GROUP / PAIR CLASSES. YOU MUST ENTER THE GROUP / PAIR CLASSES TO EXHIBIT. LIVESTOCK ENTRIES WILL BE POSTED IN THE BARN AREA AT THE TIME THE LIVESTOCK IS TO BE ON THE GROUNDS FOR CHECK IN. THERE WILL BE A TWO (2) HOUR PERIOD IN WHICH THE EXHIBITORS ARE TO CHECK THE POSTING FOR ERRORS. AT THE END OF THE TWO (2) HOUR PERIOD ENTRIES WILL STAND AND NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE TO THE CLASSES. NO ONE WILL BE ABLE TO SHOW IN A CLASS IF THEY ARE NOT ENTERED.
- 13. Exhibits and livestock are required to be in place for exhibition on the fairgrounds for a minimum of three days, except for exhibits and livestock in 4-H club

shows, junior shows, one-day shows and in Departments C, D, E, Q, R, S, T, V and Z. The county fair board may require specified exhibits and livestock to stay beyond the minimum 72-hour exhibition time. The number of days the exhibit or livestock must be on the fairgrounds for exhibition shall be indicated in the Premium Book (Section 260.55). If recommended by the county fair's veterinarian and approved by fair, early dismissal of livestock may be granted for the following reasons: disease outbreak, severe hot weather, or other existing conditions which may result in the death of livestock. The IL Dept. of Ag may also grant early dismissal of livestock and other exhibits in emergency situations upon recommendation of fair management in the case where facilities have been lost due to fire, wind, or heavy rain damage to tents and barns, or loss of electrical power, or if facilities cannot accommodate livestock due to space limitations. All eligible early dismissals shall be followed up in a letter to the IL Dept of Ag. (Note: Early release to go to another fair is not allowed nor is the Superintendent allowed to release early.)



- Personal Characteristics: In order to be eligible, contestants must certify to the Personal Characteristics in this section:
  - a) Must be a minimum of 16 years of age and not have reached her 22<sup>nd</sup> birthday by January 1, 2023.
     Must be a U.S. Citizen. Contestant, Parent or Legal Guardian must currently be a resident of Illinois for a minimum of six months.
  - b) Can never have been convicted of a felony offense.
  - c) Was born female and have always been a female.
  - d) Does not use or consume any illegal controlled substances or abuse the use of alcohol or other dangerous substances.
  - e) Is of good moral character. Has never performed any act or engaged in any activity or employment that is or could be characterized as immoral or indecent. Attests that any and all online depictions associated with the contestant's name or likeness including but not limited to Facebook Twitter, and all other social media sites are consistent with the standards and dignity of the Miss Menard County Fair Queen Pageant.
- Contestants must be single and never have been married, divorced, or had their marriage annulled. Contestants can never have been pregnant, is not the adoptive parent of a child.
- 3. Limitations Contestants must reside within the area encompassed by Menard County School Districts or must be attending Menard County Schools, or has graduated high school from a Menard County School. Any girl whose parents are residing within the area encompassed by Menard County School Districts, who is a student at a university, college, trade school or other school of higher education, shall be eligible.
- 4. Contestants will be judged as follows:
  - 20% Evening Gown & Stage Presence 15% Bathing Suit (Beauty & Physique)
  - 35% Personal Interview
  - 30% Speech
- All contestants will appear on stage in swimsuits and evening gowns, Tuesday evening, JULY 18, 2023. At this time the 2023 Queen will be selected and crowned by Miss Jaelyn Eilers, 2022 Menard County Fair Queen.

### 2023 Menard County Livestock Sale Rules & Regulations

- Only youth enrolled in the Menard 4-H program that exhibit livestock during the Menard County 4-H Show will be eligible to participate in the sale.
- A 4-H member must attend a minimum of **three** local 4-H club meetings/activities to be eligible to sell an animal in the Menard County Livestock Sale. Club meeting attendance will be verified by club minutes taken by the secretary and member sign-in sheets from each club meeting held. College students unable to attend their club meetings due to enrollment at an institution away from home must notify their club leader of their status AND must submit a written request for an exemption to this rule to the Extension Office prior to the 4-H show to be approved by the Livestock Sale Committee.
- A 4-H member must participate in a 4-H promotional activity or community service project during the current 4-H year. Projects must be hands-on/action oriented, such as doing physical labor to improve the community, working a booth to promote 4-H at a community event, etc., and must be approved by 4-H or Farm Bureau staff to count as fulfillment of this requirement. Following completion of the requirement, verification of the member's participation will need to be provided to Farm Bureau by the 4-H Club Leader or 4-H staff.
- A member must be present at the 4-H Show to care for and exhibit his/her livestock to be eligible to participate in the sale. Advanced written permission from the Livestock Sale Committee must be obtained to retain sale rights if the member will be unable to exhibit.
- A member is expected to dress appropriately when in the 4-H Show and Sale rings. The member should strive to represent 4-H in a positive and respectful manner. Closed toed shoes should be worn for safety reasons.
- Ten percent (10%) of the sale premium (sale premium = sale price market value of animal) will be withheld from the check of each member who's animal brings at least ten percent above current market price. Expenses of the livestock sale will be deducted from the 10% of sale premiums withheld, and the remainder will be donated to Menard County 4-H to fund items such as: college scholarships; partial fee assistance to local, state and national 4 -H events; and expansion of 4-H program offerings.
- All sellers should observe proper withdrawal periods on any antibiotics used in treating or feeds of sale animals. Seller will be responsible for any loss incurred.
- 4-H members may consign a maximum of ONE animal from the following list: one barrow, one market gilt, one steer, one sheep wether, one market ewe, one dairy or boer goat wether, one market pen of poultry, or one market pen of rabbits. Animals sold must be those exhibited in 4-H Show classes. The only exception will be if a member has multiple Grand Champions (Grand Champion Steer Overall, Grand Champion Barrow or Gilt Overall, Champion Market Lamb, Champion Dairy or Boer Goat Wether, Champion Pen of Poultry, and/or Champion Rabbit Meat Pen).
- All animals will be reserved/retained by the members. Livestock Sale participants are responsible for taking their own animals home following the sale (shipping of livestock to market will not be provided).
- Buyers will pay the amount of the bid less market price stated sale day. Buyers will be billed and asked to pay within 30 days. \*Each 4-H'er will be paid only after all of the buyer's money has been collected.
- The seller will be responsible for showing their appreciation to their buyers. Livestock buyer plaques and discs will not be provided.
- It is the seller's responsibility to express their intent to sell by filling out the entry form in the fair book, and return it to the **Menard County Farm Bureau** by **Noon on July 3, 2023**. Sale entries can be hand delivered or mailed to the Menard County Farm Bureau office at 101 E. Jefferson Street, Petersburg. If the seller is showing more than one species they are able to change their sale entry only if they have a Supreme/Grand/Reserve Champion in another species. It is the seller's responsibility to let the Menard County Farm Bureau know of their change 24 hours or more prior to the start of the auction by calling 217-632-2217 (answering machine available), or email-

ing menardfb@casscomm.com. Members who fail to make entries during the designated time will not be allowed to sell.

Supreme, Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals in each livestock division will sell before other animals in the same livestock division. The Livestock Sale Committee will determine the remaining sale order.

Barrows, market gilts, steers, market ewes, sheep and goat wethers will be weighed. No wet sheep or beef allowed. Limit one halter when needed.

There will be no minimum/maximum weight requirements. However, 4-H members who exhibit in market classes are expected to have their livestock in market condition when exhibiting.

Animals that enter the sale, which do not bring current market value through the auction, may be considered as eligible for NO SALE.

Poultry will sell first followed by rabbits, goats, sheep, swine and beef.

Barrows and market gilts will sell by the pound, steers will sell by the pound, market lambs will sell by the pound, goat wethers will sell by the head, market pen of poultry will sell by the pen, and market pen of rabbits will sell by the pen.

Out of respect for the buyers, no livestock will be allowed to be loaded or leave until the livestock sale is completed. Exhibitors that leave early will **forfeit their premium from the sale**.

All buyer checks will be made payable to the Menard County Farm Bureau. All receipts and expenses will be handled through the Menard County Farm Bureau Office. Location of the sale clerk will be announced during the sale.

The sale will be under the auspices of the Menard County Farm Bureau and the Menard County Livestock Sale Committee.

#### GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

- 1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show Bureau of Animal Health Personnel the completed CVI.
- 2. CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.
- 3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be
- 4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- 5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- 6. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.

Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. Examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.

9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animals(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited.

Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.

10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

### CATTLE

### Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

### Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

### Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

#### Brucellosis

- 1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:

  A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.

  - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months
  - Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so C. classified)
  - D. Steers and spaved heifers are not required to be tested for brucello-SIS.
- 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

#### Tuberculosis

Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.

Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)

- Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
  The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an
- В additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibi-
- Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

#### SWINE

### Illinois Swine Identification

Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. Ear notch identification is acceptable for all barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine. (Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

### Brucellosis

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

### Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch. Ear notch identification is not acceptable for crossbred animals.

### Brucellosis

- Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
  - Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd
  - Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free B.
- Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

### Pseudorabies

- Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
- Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
  Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same require-
- 4. ments as breeding swine

### SHEEP

### Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

#### **Market Lambs**

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

### Illinois Sheep

- Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon
- the completion of an approved flock plan.

  For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

#### Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

- either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock 2. of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

#### **GOATS**

#### Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompa-

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

### Illinois Goats

- Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

### **Out-of-State Goats**

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

- Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an
- Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tubercu-losis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

### HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

### Illinois Equine

- All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 3. An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
- A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

### Out-of-State Equine

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

- All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 2.
- All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued 3 within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

### POULTRY

All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.

- Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
- 3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
- Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
- All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.

  A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. Entry permit numbers are
- available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

Please note: These poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H and FFA 1day poultry shows where the entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day. However, a permit is required for out-of-state poultry.

#### RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

There are no requirements governing the movement of llamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Entry permit numbers are available online at https://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx







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
