## HORSE HANDLING RULES

1. Anyone handling horses must wear boots.
2. All exhibitors must be suitably attired. Boots and helmets are required for all riding. Numbers must be clearly visible.
3. No horses on midway at any time.
4. Open horse exit: out North door; 4-H horse exit: out East door.
5. Exercise times: Open- 8-9 morning and evening 6-7.
6. Horses must be ridden, longed or controlled on lead line.  
NO LOOSE HORSES ON FAIRGROUNDS.
7. All horses are to be exercised daily.
8. NO RUNNING HORSES. No loping horses outside the arenas.
9. No horse allowed outside designated livestock area.
10. RODEO ARENA not considered part of livestock arena.

The Superintendent and their assistants reserve the right to act as a sifting committee and reject any entries on the basis of quality or signs of disease. All birds are to be shown by breed. Breeds listed above are not intended to be all inclusive; an exhibitor may enter more than one breed in E through W. Birds shown in a trio or pen cannot be shown as singles.
