The Old Timer Show and PeeWee Show are open to age-appropriate fairgoers to compete in a friendly Fitting and Showing Contest using dairy animals already being exhibited. Showmen not exhibiting a dairy animal themselves will need to make arrangements to borrow an animal. No premiums will be given. Sign up will be in the Dairy Barn during Fair.

Open Class Dairy Rules

- 1. All entries in this department must be registered. All registration papers and tattoos will be checked.
- 2. A photocopy of all registration papers must be received at the Competitive Exhibits Office no later than July 31 to be included in the show book. You may fax papers to the Fair office at 360.354.1315 or mail or drop off to the Fair Office 1775 Front Street, Lynden, WA 98264, or email to <u>entries@nwwafair.com</u>.
- 3. 4-H and FFA members must write their name and club/chapter on the top of the Registration papers of the animal they are showing.
- 4. Dairy cattle are not allowed to leave the dairy barn during Fair for any reason except during designated haul in and haul out times.
- 5. Each exhibitor will be limited to 14 head, all breeds included. No more than two dry cows per exhibitor. In case of a shortage in stall space, exhibitors with the most entries will be cut first.
- 6. Each exhibitor will be limited to two premiums in any one class.
- 7. Exhibitors must provide attendants for their cattle. Herdsmanship to be performed from 10 am to 9 pm.
- 8. Only blue and red ribbon winners in 4-H and FFA are eligible to enter Open Class Cattle.
- 9. All milk must be put into tank and will become the property of the Fair. All medicated animals must be milked last if using parlor. Any violation of antibiotics in the milk will result in forfeit of premiums.
- 10. A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four (4) weeks prior to the Fair.
- 11. Keep the barns neat and clean for the public. Bedding and hay will be furnished by the Fair.
- 12. A National Guernsey Show is held at the Northwest Washington Fair. For rules and information see https://www.usguernsey.com/shows.
- On February 9, 2002, the Washington State Holstein Board and membership passed a resolution which states: Second generation identified Holstein Grade cattle (75% RHA-NA) are eligible to compete in all 4-H, FFA and Open class shows at the Northwest Washington Fair.
- 14. Bovine Veterinarian Checklist should be filled out and available during vet check.
- 15. NO STRAW DIVIDERS WILL BE ALLOWED due to the mid-week haul out.

- 1. Junior heifer calf, born after March 1, of the present year, over 4 months of age
- 2. Intermediate heifer calf, born December 1, of the previous year through February 29, of the present year
- 3. Senior heifer calf, born September 1 through November 30, of the previous year
- 4. Summer yearling heifer, born June 1 through August 31, of the previous year
- 5. Junior yearling heifer, born March 1 through May 31, of the previous year
- 6. Winter yearling heifer, born December 1, through February 28, of the previous year
- 7. Senior yearling heifer, born September 1 through November 30 of 3 years previous

- 8. Junior 2 year old cow, born March 1, through August 31, of 2 years previous

- 11. Senior 3 year old cow, born September 1, through February 28, of 3 years previous

- 13. 5 year old cow, born September 1, through August 31, of 5 years previous
- 14. Aged cow, 5 years and over, born before September 1, of years previous

- 15. Junior best 3 females, group to consist of 3 junior females from senior yearling heifers or younger, none of which have freshened, all bred and owned by exhibitor.
- 16. Produce of Dam -Two animals, any age, from the same dam, dam must be named, bred and owned by exhibitor.
- 17. Dam and Daughter, bred and owned by exhibitor.
- 18. Get of sire, 3 animals from one sire, sire named, all bred and owned by exhibitor.
- 19. Senior best 3 females, group to consist of 3 females over 2 years of age which have freshened, all bred and owned by exhibitor.
- 20. Exhibitor's Herd, group to consist of 4 females, all bred and owned by exhibitor.

All-Around Junior Champion Heifer - 1st place \$250, 2nd place \$100 All-Around Senior Champion Cow

All-Around Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion – 1st place \$600, 2nd place \$300

PREMIER BREEDER AND EXHIBITOR AWARDS

The Northwest Washington Fair will award banners for Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor. To qualify for banners there must be competition of two or more herds in each breed and a minimum of three head per herd.

Premier Breeder - The breeder winning the most money for no more than six animals in the open single classes exhibited by themselves and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder.

Premier Exhibitor - The exhibitor winning the most money for no more than six animals owned and exhibited by themselves shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. An exhibitor's qualifying animals shall be defined as follows: Any animal within the family unit housed on exhibitor's farm may be used for this award.

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

• Infectious Foot Rot

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- Snotty Nose/Respiratory
- Ring Worm
- Pinkeye

- Coarse, Dry Cough Evidence of Diarrhea
- Warts
- High Fever

- No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):
- Mange
 Lice

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated 2: Thin 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight 5: Obese
- Feed and water must be available at the Fair at all times
