#### **SWINE GENERAL RULES:**

- 1. Fitting and Showing for Open Swine is optional.
- 2. Animals shown in market class will not be eligible to be shown in breeding classes.
- 3. Rosettes for Grand and Reserve awarded if deserving.
- 4. All tack, feed, etc. must be stored within allotted areas.
- 5. No pens may be separated or broke into smaller pens without permission from the Superintendent.
- 6. No weaned boars. Uncastrated piglets in Sow with Litter are accepted.
- 7. Barrows may be eligible to be entered in Market Hog classes.
- 8. **Open Swine can be shown in 4-H or FFA.** However, Open Swine cannot sell in the Lynden Jr. Livestock Sale without also being shown in 4-H or FFA which would mean being at Fair all 10 days.
- 9. Herdsmanship is required from 10 am to 9 pm daily. You may team up with another exhibitor(s).
- 10. All swine must have USDA identification.

Use age on June 1, 2024

Be sure to include breed on entry form. Will be shown by breed. Example Breeds: Kunekune, Hampshire, Chester White, Berkshire, Idaho Pasture Pig, Duroc, Tamworth, American Guinea Hog, Landrace, Gloucestershire Old Spot, Yorkshire, and Crossbreeds.
