Late entries will be charged a fee of \$25.00 per head through July 12. After July 12th late entries will not be accepted.

1. Entries in FFA Beef class are open to registered and grade animals cared for and fitted by FFA Chapter members.
2. The same cattle cannot be shown in 4-H and FFA.
3. Registered animals may be cross entered in Open Class Beef.
- 4. All animals must have a double tie at night. No baling twine or wire.**
5. A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four weeks prior to the fair.
6. Bovine Veterinary Checklist should be completed and presented at Vet Check.
7. Beef bulls may be exhibited in the FFA section of the barn at the Superintendent's discretion. Bulls over one year of age may be required to have a restraining pen provided by the exhibitor. All bulls must have a nose lead.

**All FFA exhibitors must participate in showmanship.** Overall showman will compete in the FFA Round Robin Competition.

### FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

#### ID Prior to arrival:

- REQUIRED: Legible Bangs Tattoo on females over 12 months of age.
- RECOMMENDED: USDA Metal ID or Brucellosis Tag & USDA NAIS ID & RFID Tag

**The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:**

- Infectious Foot Rot
- Snotty Nose/Respiratory
- Ring Worm
- Pinkeye
- Coarse, Dry Cough
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Warts
- High Fever

#### No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Mange
- Lice

#### Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese

- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

**Dehorned properly and completely healed**
