4-H and FFA gate passes must be purchased online by July 20
Parents of 4-H & FFA Season Pass \$30

Late entries will be charged a fee of \$25.00 per head through July 12. After July 12 late entries will not be accepted.

SHEEP DIVISION RULES:

1. Animals will be shown by breed. No crossbred rams to be shown.
2. Limited to seven animals per exhibitor, not limited to one entry per class. In case of shortage in stall space, FFA & 4-H members with the most entries will be cut first.
3. Animals shown in market classes will not be eligible for show in breeding classes.
4. All sheep must wear an ear tag or tattoo uniquely identifying them.
5. Ownership must be established, or contract written and dated by June 1.
6. Must show in Fitting and Showing to show in Type and earn Department premiums.
7. It is recommended that all lambs born after September 1st of the preceding year have a "liftable" tail dock. This means that the tail should be docked at the distal end of the caudal folds and no shorter.
8. To qualify to compete in FFA Round Robin there must be at least 5 different exhibitors competing in the Division's Fitting and Showing.

*****IMPORTANT NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS REGARDING SCRAPIE ERADICATION*****

All sheep and goats must have official USDA National Scrapie Eradication program-assigned flock identification number. This may include a tag, tattoo, or microchip (with reader provided by exhibitor or written proof of microchip). Unmarked animals will not be allowed to stay at fair. ALL BREEDS OF WOOL SHEEP including Columbia, Leincester, Corriedale, Romney, and crosses of these breeds

FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- ORF
- Infectious Foot Rot
- Ring Worm
- Warts
- High Fever
- Respiratory Disease

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Lice
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Dry, Hoarse Cough
- Mange
- Pale Mucous Membranes

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5/5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese
- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

Castrated Properly

- Do your best to have castration done ahead of time so the site has time to heal properly

Dehorned properly and completely healed
