



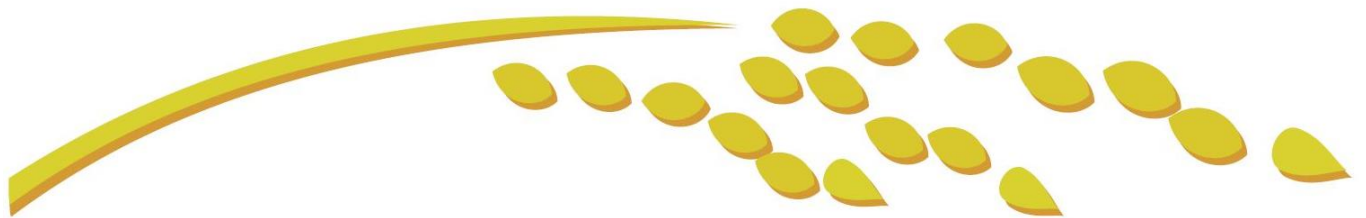

4-H and FFA gate passes must be purchased online by July 20

Late entries will be charged a fee of \$25.00 per head through July 12. After July 12th late entries will not be accepted.

FFA SWINE GENERAL RULES:

1. Fitting, feeding and stall duty/cleaning tasks done by exhibitors only.
2. All swine shown in FFA must be at least 4 months old by the first day of Fair.
3. **Limited to one animal per exhibitor in 4-H Market Hog and FFA Departments.**
4. Animals shown in FFA are not eligible for show in 4-H.
5. FFA members must show in fitting and showing in order to show in type and receive department premiums.
6. **All swine must have USDA identification.**
7. Market hogs will be shown by weight.
8. Each pig must be entered in only one type class. Pigs will be moved to correct class based on weight.
9. All tack, feed, etc. must be stored within allotted areas.
10. No pens may be separated or broke into smaller pens without permission from the Superintendent.

DIVISION A - FITTING AND SHOWING

All FFA exhibitors must participate in showmanship. Overall showman will compete in Round Robin Competition on Saturday.

1. Senior: Last year high school juniors, seniors, and graduates.
2. Junior: Last year eighth graders and high school freshman and sophomores.
3. Novice: First year showing swine

FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- Erysipelas
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Ring Worm
- High Fever
- Snout Health/Respiratory
- Evidence of Coughing

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Lice
- Mange
- Ticks

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese
- Water must be available at the Fair at all times

Castrated Properly

- Castration site must be completely healed

Swine Handling: Very Important at Fair Time

- Prevent Fighting
- House Properly
- Prevent Overheating/Hyperthermia
