



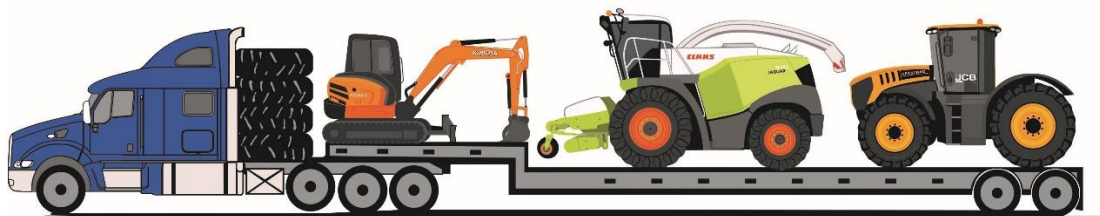

 Entries not picked up will be left unsecured and may be moved.

*All entries must come with a computer printed white 3x5 card with exhibitor's name, club, and 4-H age for entry to be accepted and judged. Please use a large font size for presentation purposes.

DIVISION A – CLOVERBUD ENTRIES

Limit of 6 entries per exhibitor. Cloverbud entries are not judged. 4-H Age 5 to 7 years old.

1. Home Environment Entry
2. Child Care Entry
3. Money Management Entry
4. Genealogy
5. First Aid Kit

DIVISION B - HOME ENVIRONMENT

Items must be made, assembled, or refinished by exhibitor.

PREMIUMS: Blue \$3.00 Red \$2.50 White \$2.00

CLASS NUMBER

1. Framed picture with a mat and hanger. Picture must be for a specific room. Explain the room color scheme or reason for using the picture in this room.
2. An exhibit showing the color scheme of a specific room mounted on cardboard poster. Include fabric swatches, paint chips, wood samples, etc. Describe type of room and why scheme was used - size of room, exposure, etc. Include hanger on poster.
3. Scrapbook with ideas for improving one room in the home. No more than four pictures to show any one improvement as curtains, furniture arrangements, etc. Suitable fabric samples may be included. Explain why decisions were made.
4. Other project not listed in home environment.

PREMIUMS: Blue \$5.00 Red \$4.00 White \$3.00

CLASS NUMBER

5. Drapery panel for a specific room. Information on color scheme. Type of room, exposure, etc.
6. Bedspread, information on color scheme, exposure to room, etc.
7. Floor rug, give color scheme of room and furnishings in room.
8. Lamp with shade for a specific room. Describe spot where it will be used.
9. Refinished or homemade furniture for use in a specific room. Describe where it will be used.
10. Storage improvement - scale drawing with an explanation of why the change was made. Include before and after.

DIVISION C - CHILD CARE

PREMIUMS: Blue \$4.00 Red \$3.50 White \$3.00

CLASS NUMBER

1. Kit or play-safe materials, at least 7 articles, 3 of which are homemade. Describe why you chose these items and for what age child the items are for.
2. Child's book with pages made of cloth, made by exhibitor.
3. Kit of 4 books of interest to children (2 to 6). Include why these books were chosen on a 3x5 card.
4. Other - Explain what you entered and why.

DIVISION D – MONEY MANAGEMENT

Each budget entry must include income and expenditures. Limit of one entry per class.

PREMIUMS: Blue \$3.00 Red \$2.50 White \$2.00

CLASS NUMBER

1. Household budget
2. Special event budget
3. College/education budget
4. Other – Explain what you entered and why.

DIVISION E – GENEALOGY

PREMIUMS: Blue \$4.00 Red \$3.50 White \$3.00

CLASS NUMBER

1. Family Tree, try to go back to when your ancestors arrived in the United States
2. Genetic Traits, record genetic traits for yourself, parents, and grandparents such as eye color, hair color, height, earlobe attachment, tongue rolling ability, blood type, dimples, freckles, and widow's peak. Juniors: at least three traits, Intermediates: at least five traits, Seniors: at least 5 traits and include Punnett Squares for at least one of the traits.

DIVISION F – FIRST AID KIT

Put together a First Aid Kit for a specific event. Intermediates and Seniors must include the cost of items included.
